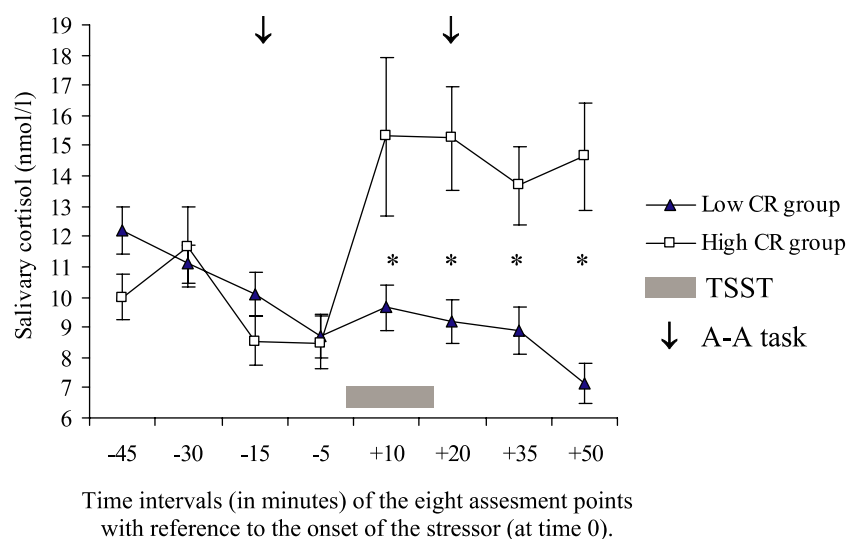


Fig. 1 Free salivary cortisol in nmol/l (Mean \pm sem) for high and low CR (cortisol response) groups in TSST.
