Inspired by the russian constructivism, primarily in costumes and music.

Redirecting and disturbing urban flows through dance performance Agit pop agenda: tranformation of social life through art.

...But also by the biomediation or recomposition of materiality (the performing body, the participants acts and moves and urban flows and habits. "Fitness work outs"

The biomediated body (Massumi, Clough, 2010). Bodily sensations and the emergence of meaning *prior* to the cognitive.

Takes place in sites of consumption, tourism, gentrification... Performance redirects urban life through the mechanic dance performance and fitness 'work outs'



THE HIGH LINE GENTRIFICATION BY MEANS OF AESHTETIZATION

"New York are in search of sites of slaughter within which to trade in fine art, music, food, and fashion. They are seeking a more visceral and haunted environment to inhabit, and in doing so they are chasing the ghosts away"...

... "This question of museumification extends to the city itself and confronts notions of gentrification" (Hannah 2002: 296)

THE HIGH LINE MATE IAL AND AFFECTIVE PRO DUCTION OF URBAN SPACE

*Takes place in sites of consumption, tourism, gentrification... *Thus the performance redirect urban life and its production flows. ... at the same time participating and producing new material flows and meanings An overall upheaval of art into (urban) life.

The performance recomposes socio-cultural meanings and matters, for instance site consumption at the High Line.

The performance recomposes urban life, our socio-cultural behaviour and practices.



We must develop a methodical intervention based on the complex factors of two components in perpetual interaction, the material environment of life and the comportments which it gives rise to and which radically transform it. Guy Debord "Construction of Situations" 1957

Urban performance, a way to construction and reestablish situations in the functional and neoliberal city?

SITUTATIONISM

Theaster Gates is an artist and cultural planner. In his performances, installations, and urban interventions, Gates transforms spaces, institutions, traditions, and perceptions.

As a part of dOKUMENTA (13), Theaster Gates has restored the historic Huguenot House into a communal and culturally uplifted space for consideration, exploration, talks and performance

#2 HUGENOTTENHAUS PERFORMANCE AS URBAN REGENERATION

Spatial mixed media. The reconstructed Hugenotten included a kitchen, living rooms and bedrooms in which the performers could sleep and carry out daily routines, prepare for the scheduled performances

Materialism, collage and found objects.

Mixed media... space, screen, wallpaper, sound Different materials form a spatio-temporal montage, linking past medias with present technologies.

MATERIAL MEANINGS IN RECENT URBAN PERFORMANCE/DESIGN

- * Performs in places of consumption (The High Line, Kassel Exhibition platforms)
- * Performs against and with urban planning and economical growth
- * Performs within cultural mainsstream Dennis Design, Fitness work outs).
- * Performs through the biomediation of bodies and people: children from the neighbourhood (DDC, visitors at the High Line)

MATERIAL MEANINGS1. PERFORMING COUNTER MOVEMENTS

* The work of art reassembles found materials, objects and fabrics (Hugenotten Haus)

* Recomposes socio-cultural relations in the city by inviting people to participate in the work of art (Hugentotten Haus, Dennis Design Center).

* *Participation* is the preferred tactics for changing exitisting urban materiality (reassembling socio-material relations in the city)

MATERIAL MEANINGS **2 RECOMPOSITION OF URBAN MATERIALITY**

*Changing social habits through the art work (Half Myhical, Half Legendary..., Dennis Design Center)

* Not against mass culture but uses mass culture as the out set for transformation (Half Mythical..., Dennis Design Center)

*Changing planning practices proposing performance art and DIY urbanism

MATERIAL MEANINGS 3 SOCIAL REFORMATION

* Integrated drama

- * Performance is everywhere: in everyday acts, in the design and in the use (Hugnottenhaus). * No borders between the performer on stage and participant (DDC, Hugenottenhaus) * Art integrates all art forms in one house /Hugenottenhaus.
- * The performance directly intervenes in every day life and socio-spatial meanings.

MATERIAL MEANINGS **4 GESAMTKUNSTWERK**

*no distinction between performer, participant and viewer.
* upheaval of art ,design and every day acts
*all performances take place in real time urban life.
*show real time performance, live performance and the creation of situations in urban life.
