La Grande Maine July 7th 1862
To the Adjt. Genl. of the State of Maine

Sir: I have the honor to address you to learn if I can procure papers to certify that I have served a term of one year and six months in the 2nd Me. Vols. I was enlisted in Co. A. 2nd Me Vols. at Bangor April 25th 1861 by Herman Bartlett and on the 26th of Oct. 1862 was discharged to enlist in the regulars for a term of 1 year and 6 months. From the 2nd Me. I recd no other discharge than a descriptive list on a paper together with the descriptive list of A. P. Jones discharged at the same time, for the same purpose. Said descriptive list Jones has in his possession and is now in the State of Minnesota and as I myself wish to leave the state, it is essential that I should have something to certify that I have served a term of three years.

My dis. from the U.S. Engineers merely states that I was enlisted as Sandy Hook Md. for the term of 1 year and 6 months. saying nothing of any previous enlistments

year and 3 months saying nothing of any previous
distinctions
