SUMMARY:

A review of the literature for records of the occurrence of the species in Virginia was completed. One brown pelican was observed during 1979 on Lake Anna.

TECHNIQUES USED:

Sightings of Brown Pelicans were reported.

FINDINGS:

Only one sighting of the species in the state was made during the fiscal year. One Brown Pelican was observed over a period of several days on Lake Anna during the summer.
