



Access / Intimidation





Disenfranchisement is the cancelation of an individual's right to vote whether legally or through discriminatory practices. Specific groups such as minority populations and convicted felons face greater intimidation and disenfranchisement.

Voter access interference An example of this is placing polling sites at unreasonable distances, sometimes as far as 150 miles away.
