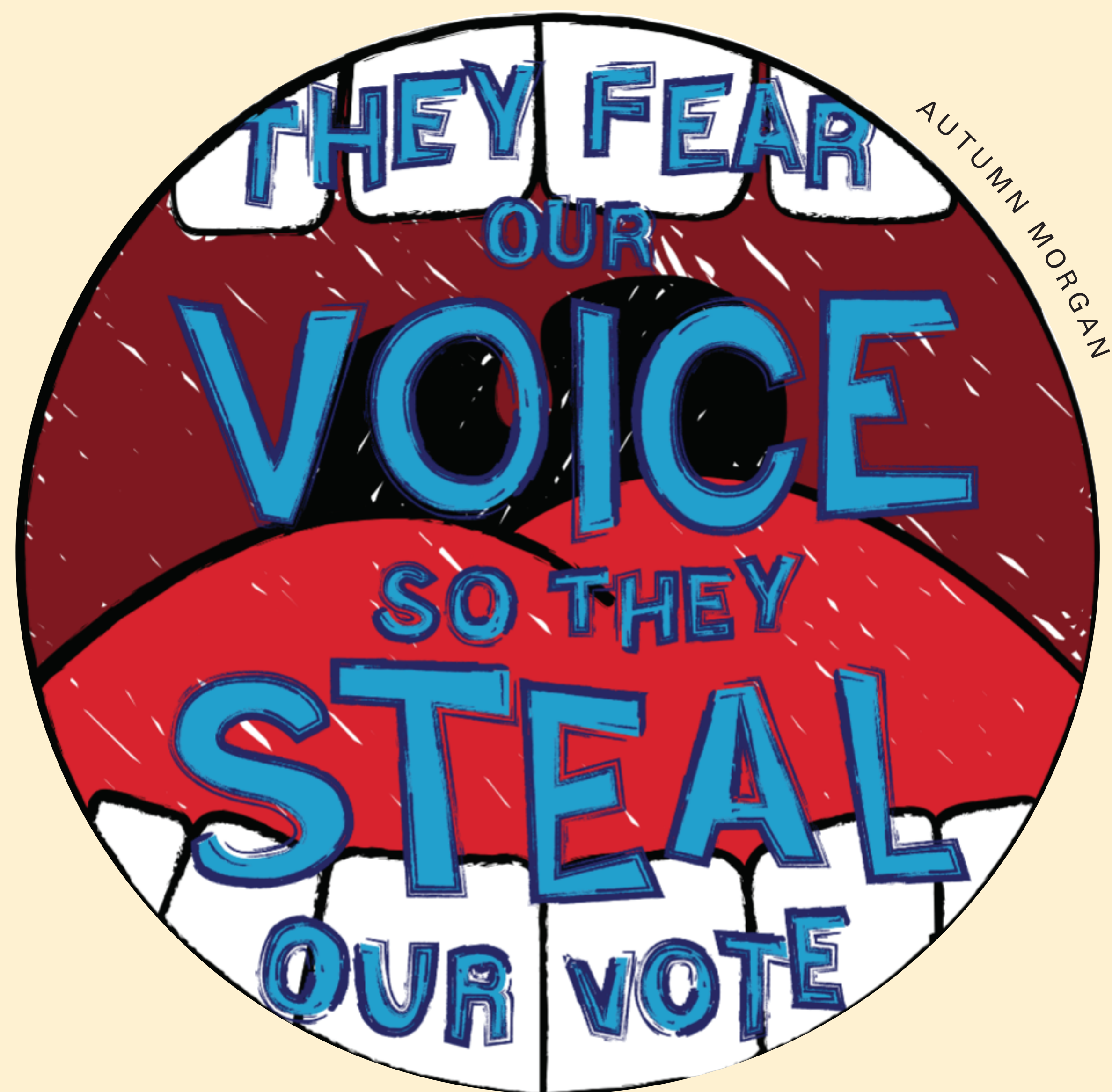

# Access / Intimidation



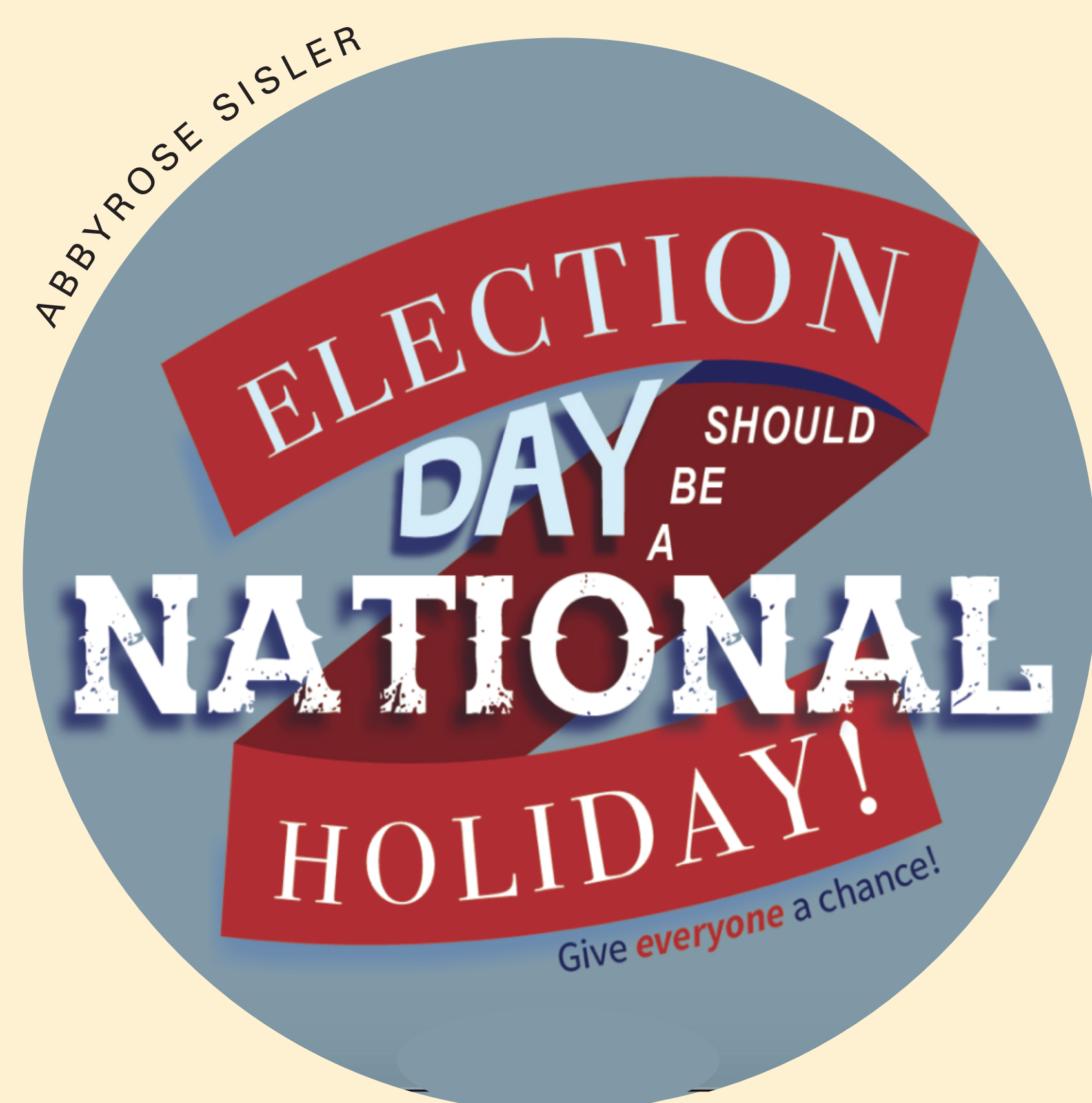
**Disenfranchisement** is the cancelation of an individual's right to vote whether legally or through discriminatory practices. Specific groups such as minority populations and convicted felons face greater intimidation and disenfranchisement.

**Voter access interference** An example of this is placing polling sites at unreasonable distances, sometimes as far as 150 miles away.
