WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- 2. To act upon all of the following articles contained in this Warrant.
- 3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Government Expenses for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Police for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate as its contribution to the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association toward the cost of construction of the new area hospital to be constructed at Colebrook, N. H.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution to continue the services of the North Country Community Services, Inc.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for the Care, Removal, and/or replacement of Trees.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Sewer Maintenance for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 14. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$1,049.87 for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in which event the State will contribute \$6,999.13.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
- 19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.

- 21. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free skating rink for the ensuing year, and to raise money necessary for same.
- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of publicizing and promoting. by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and the North County Region.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$521.79 to the White Mountain Region Association, being .07c per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the the vote at the 1951 Town Meeting, for the ensuing year.
- 27. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted. from the Parking Meter fund.
- 28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Tarring Streets.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct and improve Colby Street and to raise money for the same, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for other streets in later years.

- 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for Sewer and Storm Drain Construction, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for this same purpose in later years.
- 31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
- 32. To see if the Town will authorize its Selectmen to investigate the purchase or lease of a suitable new site for a Town Dump, and to see what sum the Town will appropriate for the purpose of taking an option of sale or lease on, or purchasing, any such site which may be deemed suitable by the Selectmen; the unexpended balance of any sum which may be appropriated under this Article to be placed in a special fund to be used for dump purposes in later years.
- 33. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to pay on the principal of the bond issue for the Sewerage Facilities.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$198,000 for the purpose of financing and constructing the extension of the existing municipal sewage disposal and water systems from any present terminal thereof, to the boundaries of the site of the new Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital, with related facilities, inclusive of land acquisition, easements, and rights of way as may be required, such sum to be raised by the issuance of not exceeding \$198,000 in Serial Bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds and to determine the

rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds, as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Colebrook, and passing any vote relating thereto.

- 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain and accept, Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available in the construction of any sewage disposal and/or water system, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 36. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriote for the celebration of the Bicentennial of the Town of Colebrook during the calendar year 1970, the same to be expended under the authority of the Selectmen, and said sum of to be placed in a special fund which may be carried over and expended either during the year 1969 or year 1970, or both, as the Selectmen may see fit.
- 37. To see whether the Town will, pursuant to Revised Statutes Annotated, 245:6, by major vote authorize the Selectmen, beginning and effective as of the town meeting of 1970, to appoint one or more highway agents, instead of electing same by ballot, said vote if passed to continue in effect until changed by major vote at an annual or special town meeting.
- 38. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town, for the ensuing year.

- 39. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town, and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
- 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the ensuing year.
- 41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds. or owned by the Town or any agency thereof, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.
- 42. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify, and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of the said Town for the year ending December 31, 1968.
- 43. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The North Country Community Services, Inc., is a nonprofit corporation chartered in the State of New Hampshire to provide direct psychiatric and psychological treatment to participating communities in Coos County. At the present time full clinical services are provided at Berlin and Colebrook. Funding for these services is provided by appropriations from the towns participating and from the State of New Hampshire. The State of New Hampshire grants two dollars for every dollar appropriated by the towns. Contributions are also received from members and other individuals.

The following listing explains the type and amount of service provided in 1968. Particular attention should be given the last two lines as they represent the services given to your area by the clinic located in Colebrook. It should be noted that the demand for these services doubled last year.

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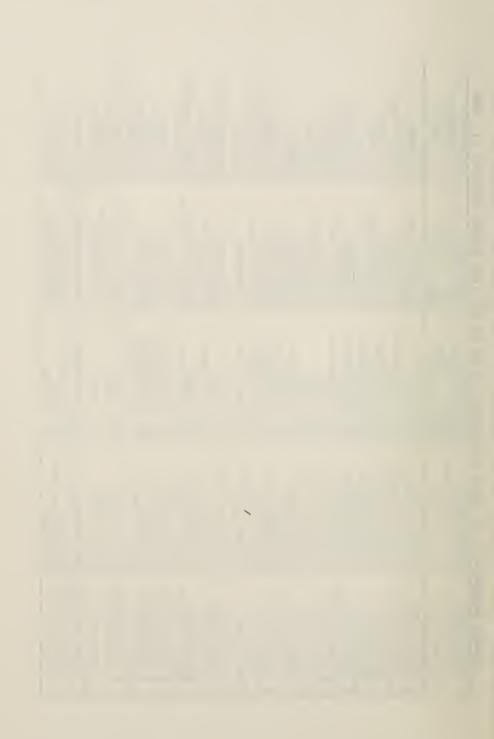
