TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire Carroll SS
To the inhabitants of the Town of Conway, County of
Carroll, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House at Center Conway, New Hampshire, March 9, 1937, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers and to vote on the question, "Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?"

- Art. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:
- Section A. Town officers' salaries.
 - B. Town officers' expenses.
 - C. Election and registration.
 - D. Municipal Court.
 - E. Town Hall and office expense.
 - F. Damage and legal expense.
 - G. Police Department.
 - H. Fire Department.
 - I. White Pine Blister Rust..
 - J. Health Department.
 - K. Vital Statistics.
 - L. Memorial Hospital
 - M. Town Maintenance of Highways. (summer)
 - N. Town Maintenance of Highways. (winter)
 - O. Libraries.
 - P. Town Poor.
 - Q. Old Age Assistance.
 - R. Memorial Day.
 - S. Soldiers' Aid.
 - T. Parks and Playgrounds.
 - U. Interest.
 - V. State Tax.
 - W. County Tax.

- Art. 3. To see what action the Town will take in regard to discounting taxes.
- Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes or bonds of the Town to an amount not exceeding \$33,000 for the purpose of refunding outstanding indebtedness of a like amount.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town, the sum of \$60,000, if needed.
- Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds during the present fiscal year.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town, a sufficient sum of money to obtain Federal Aid on any project for which application may be made.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be used for construction of the Eaton Road, providing the State shall appropriate the sum of \$6,000 for the same purpose.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of the Class II road known as the Eaton Road, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,693.50; or will accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$850.50 for said purpose.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to properly grade, surface, and tarvia Pine Street from Main Street to Mechanic Street, agreeable to a petition signed by Harry D. Bunker and others.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to drain that portion

of Seavey Street, in North Conway village, which lies between the Maine Central Railroad track and the easterly line of the schoolhouse lot, agreeable to a petition signed by Harry S. Patten and others.

- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to re-surface and tar the road from the junction of Davis Hill Road at Center Conway, to the junction of the Gibson and Scribner Cottage Road near Page Brook, a distance of about two-fifths of one mile, agreeable to a petition signed by Perley W. Mudgett and others.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to tarvia the road leading from the West Side road past the Side Track to the West Side Road, also the road leading from above mentioned road to the Still Road past the dwelling of Evan Smith and others, and make provision for the same, agreeable to a petition signed by Mr. and Mrs. Chester R. Ballou and others.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to tarvia the North Road, so called, from West Main Street to junction of the government road, a distance of four-tenths of a mile, and raise and appropriate money for same, agreeable to a petition signed by F. A. Rawson and others.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to repair and tarvia the Bald Hill Road, so called, in Conway village, from Trunk Line highway to tarvia at bottom of hill near Simeon Jodrie's, agreeable to a petition signed by Edward J. Bolduc and others.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to grade and tarvia the so called Allard Hill Road, beginning at the Frank Dolloff place to the Town line near the John Banfill place, and raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to carry the article into effect, agreeable to a petition signed by Ernest L. Richardson and others.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to put in shape and

tarvia Artist Falls Road, agreeable to a petition signed by Edward J. Ashnault and others.

- Art. 19 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for weekly band concerts during the months of July and August, 1937, by the Conway Band under the supervision of the Selectmen, agreeable to a petition signed by Raymond N. Philbrick and others.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be used and expended under the direction of the Selectmen for the purpose of promoting and publicizing Winter business in the Eastern Slope Section, agreeable to a petition signed by Noel T. Wellman and others.
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Tax Collector's salary to three-quarters of one per cent of the amount collected each year, agreeable to a petition signed by John N. Leighton and others.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to add twenty cents (.20) to every poll tax notice after August 1, 1937, agreeable to a petition signed by A. N. French and others.
- Art. 23. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

LIBRARY REPORT

To the Citizens of Conway:

At the Conway Public Library, Miss Pollard reports that the total circulation of books and magazines was 21,265 volumes. Approximately one-tenth of this circulation was non-fiction. The outstanding need of the library as regards books, is a larger selection of current editions of modern science, and more books for the juvenile readers.

This year the library received valuable gifts from Clarence E. Eastman, E. E. Hastings, Rev. Edward P. St. John, Mrs. A. L. Reid, Sidney S. Robins, Harold Cloutman, Herbert Blackwell, Gertrude H. Shurtleff, Mrs. R. E. Chamberlain and the Conway Woman's Club.

Of particular value and constantly increased interest to the patrons of the library is the excellent collection of periodicals in the Reading Room.

This year the exhibits at the library were as follows: February—Reproductions of Modern Paintings loaned from the State Library at Concord. April—A Craftsman's Exhibit from the two CCC groups at Camp Hemenway, in Tamworth, the Swift River Camp in Albany. November—The Federal WPA Art Project exhibited work of New Hampshire artists. This included portraits, landscapes, wood cuts and an excellent group of watercolors.

At the Center Conway Free Public Library, Mrs. Snow reports the total circulation 3851. Mr. S. W. Norwood gave thirty-eight boooks to this library. This year, for the first time, the duplicate pay system is being used. It makes available more books of modern fiction for the patrons of this library.

The creditable service that the town libraries give to Conway is due largely to the efficient work of the Librarians.

More money invested in books would help immeasurably to make this service better. "Books are the fundamental tools in education and the only complete storehouses of knowledge."

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of Conway:

During the summer the grammar school buildings at Conway, Center Conway and North Conway were painted on the outside. This was the principal item of repairs and the cost was within the limit of the \$1,000 appropriation for special repairs made at the last March meeting. There

were other minor repairs including a necessary job on the front of the primary school at Conway, some work on the floor and underpinning at East Conway, and the use of the sander on seats and desks in different schools. So far as we know there are no emergency needs for repairs. The Redstone building should be painted soon, grading should be done at Center Conway and the West Side so that pupils may get to the building during the spring thaws, and the high school should have more seats. In fact, most of the seats in all schools except the high school are old, non-adjustable and of all types of antiquated models. A program for gradual replacement year by year would be good business.

The budget presented by the school board has been studied in detail and calls for an appropriation of \$47,450. This is \$1,434 less than last year's budget.

A new item of income appears this year from the state equalization fund. For the first time since 1926 Conway qualifies for state-aid and next December will receive \$3,405.00 which is being used to reduce the budget assessment. The purpose of this grant is to enable the district to maintain its elementary schools on the level of state-wide minimum standards. In complying with the requirements of the state we shall be able to adjust some inequalities of administrative detail.

The district will need to raise \$1,000.00 for tuition in Fryeburg Academy and \$775.00 for insurance. This insurance is being rearranged so that the amount to be raised each year will be more nearly the same each year.

Since the new train schedule of the Boston and Maine railroad went into effect, there have been suggestions that the high school transportation could be handled better by the use of busses. Certainly the loss of the late afternoon north-bound train has been keenly felt.

However, the school board several years ago made a detailed and careful study of the question of bus transportation and found at that time that bus transportation would be much more costly and not feasible. There are, however, some new factors in the present situation and it is correct to say that a plan could be worked out whereby a two-session high school could be served by two busses. Educationally a two-session school is desirable. There is, of course no data on the expense of such an arrangement over a three- or five-year period. Such a change would involve the interests of the several parts of the township and would be so radically different that it could not be recommended without a thorough study of its cost and its general desirability. If there were any serious thought on the part of citizens that the matter should be studied further, the appointment of a committee to work with the school board would be in order. From my knowledge of the various angles of the problem, I should counsel against haste in making any change.

Every year the responsibility of the school to society and to the state is more and more evident. It goes without saying that the school must teach reading, writing, arithmetic and history, but this is only a part of the job. Unless the next generation is qualified for self-government, democracy in America will disappear. It is imperative that teachers be not only technicians in the art of teaching but that they sense the higher objectives of clear thinking, obedience to law, and moral integrity. There are so many influences today which tend to lawlessness and disrespect for authority, government and the Constitution, that teachers need all help and cooperation in their effort to provide a worthy citizenry for the future.
