

## **Warrant for Town Meeting**

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Dummer in the County of Coos in said State, gualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Pontook Schoolhouse in said Dummer on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at Ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges.

4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for snow remov.l.

5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for cutting bushes along town roads.

6. To see if town will vote to accept TRA.

7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Libraries.

8 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of cemeteries.

9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Poor.

10. To see if the town will vote to give discount on Taxes.

11. To give the Selectmen the right to hire money in anticipation of Taxes and renew Notes.

12. To see if the town will vote to move the town shed and raise money for the same.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42.00 to the White Mountains Region Association, being one ½00th of

one per cent of the town valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and otherwise calling attention to the resources and advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the White Mountains Region.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.

To the Dummer School Board and Citizens:

Herewith is submitted, for your consideration, the annual report of the condition and progress of your schools, with school statistics for the year 1939-40.

Two schools, (West Dummer and Willis), were in session for the year of thirty-six weeks.

At the close of the school year in June, three pupils were graduated from the Eighth Grade at the Willis School. and one pupil at West Dummer.

Four of our former pupils are now attending Berlin High School and one is registered at Gorham High.

During the year, your Superintendent has visited and inspected classes as in the past. Corrections and changes have been made where needed.

This present school year opened with a new teacher at the Willis School—Miss Lillian Fernald, a graduate of Gorham, Maine Teacher's College. The West Dummer School is again under the direction of Mrs. Lena Rich.

The Health Inspection work is this year being conducted by Mrs. Mary Spaulding, of Whitefield, a school nurse of considerable experience.
