# Warrant for Town Meeting

---

To the inhabitants of the Town of Dummer, in the County [L. S.] of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Willis School in said Dummer on Tuesday the 14th day of March next, at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for cutting bushes along town roads.
6. To see if the Town will vote to accept T. R. A.
7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Libraries.
8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of cemeteries.
9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor and Old Age Assistance.
10. To see if the Town will vote to give discount on taxes.
11. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to hire money in anticipation of taxes, and renew notes.
12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any sum of money for the White Mountains Region Association.
13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

# Report of Superintendent

---

To the School Board and Citizens of Dummer:

Herewith is presented the annual report of Superintendent of Schools with statistics for last complete school year ending June 30, 1943.

Two schools with three teachers were maintained for a year of thirty-six weeks. The percentage of attendance for the year was 95.5.

During the year, your Superintendent made thirty-seven visits of inspection and supervision while the schools were in session. The work of various classes was examined and proper standards were maintained.

During the summer months, a basement was excavated at West Dummer School and a modern hot air furnace installed. This building can now be heated in a very satisfactory manner.

The present year opened with a new teacher, Mrs. Barbara Potter, at West Dummer. Mrs. Potter is a graduate of Plymouth Normal School and attended summer school during 1943.

Unfortunately, the teacher engaged for upper grades for the Willis School resigned at a late date in the summer and the school has been carried on with substitute teachers.

The lower grade teacher is the same as last year. Present enrollment at this school will warrant state aid for only one teacher.
