### Annual Report of School Board.

We have had 24 weeks of school in all schools but two, in which we had 23. We were fortunate in securing the services of good teachers who brought the children along splendidly. If all the parents would do as well by their children as the teachers we would have made a far better showing. The town and state appropriate considerable sums of money to support our schools and educate our children, and is it not money wasted if we keep them at home or send them only part of the time?

Teachers have to be paid, school-houses repaired, fuel furnished and all the expenses go on just the same. The child who only goes part of the time is always behind and it makes dissatisfaction all around.

Sec. 14 of Chap. 93 of the Public Statutes as amended in 1901 states that all persons having the custody or control of a child between the ages of 8 and 14 years shall cause such child to attend the public school all of the time such school is held in the District in which they live, unless the child is excused by the school board because his physical or mental condition is such as to prevent his attendance. All persons who violate this law shall pay (\$10.00) ten dollars for the first offence and (\$20.00) twenty dollars for every subsequent offence, to be used by the district.

We have made our money go as far as economy could. We have repaired and painted four school-houses and put modern seats in same. We still need a great many things in our schools in the line of furnishings and some needful repairs to be done. We ought to raise at least \$100 for repairs and furnishings this year. We ask for the hearty co-operation of all parents and guardians in the interest of education the coming year.
