To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dummer in the (L. S.) County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

Your are hereby notified to meet at the Willis School House in said Dummer on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine-thirty of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for general expense of Highway Department.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for cutting bushes along town roads.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to accept T. R. A. and make appropriations for the same.
- 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Poor.
- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Old Age Assistance.
- 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of cemeteries.
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of town libraries.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to give discount on taxes.
- 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any sum of money for the White Mountains Region Association.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to hire money in anticipation of taxes, and to renew notes.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Civil Defense.
- To see what action the Town will take regarding new equipment for Highway Department and make appropriation for same.
- 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell parts of the Magill Farm.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.
- 19. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the Board of Selectmen as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting and make appropriations relating thereto. Given under our hands and seal, this fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fifty-six.

To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the District will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the District the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes

Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44.00 to defray District's share of the cost thereof.

- 10. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the District will authorize the School Board to execute on behalf of the District the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the District will designate the School Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

*The starred items are required by law to be raised as determined by proper authorities. The district determines the salaries of the district officers. The supervisory union board decides the local share of the superintendent's salary and other union expenses. The district's share of the superintendent's salary for 1954-55 was \$218.75. Other towns in the union contributed as follows: Gorham, \$2,625.00; Milan, \$525.00; Randolph, \$223.00; Jefferson, \$568.25; Shelburne, \$262.50. These amounts are more than were raised for this purpose by the 1954-55 budget because of duplication of salary for Mr. Knightly for the month of May, 1955. By state regulations, he was entitled to 30 days leave which had accumulated and the union had to contribute to this cost. The state treasure reports the amount of per capita tax. The Teachers' Retirement Board assesses the amount for teachers' retirement and the State Employees Retirement Association assesses the amount for the superintendent's retirement.

Estimated income:

State Treasurer, Noon Lunch Program, \$400.00. (This is an offset item under Special Activities and Special Funds, where the estimated expenditure is \$400.00. It has no effect whatever on the amount to be raised by taxation). Any state aid allotted or any balance remaining on June 30, 1956 will be deducted from assessment.

Report of Superintendent

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Dummer School District:

FOREWORD

The aims of our schools cannot be separated from those of society, since education is one of the bases on which our society rests. It has been a fundamental principle of American democracy that we should have free public education in this country. Without an enlightened citizenry, our nation would not have grown to its present heights. In New Hamphsire we generally agree that schools should provide the best education possible for each child, whatever his ability might be. Since the ability of every child varies, we should provide the best possible education to fit his individual needs. Our schools must make provisions to handle the bright, the dull, the lazy, the industrious, the shy, the bold, the practical and the artistic.

In the short time that I have served as your Superintendent, I would conclude that the schools of Union No. 20 do a good job in teaching the fundamental skills (the three R's). Tests that have been given prove this to be true. We should certainly maintain this good record and, if possible, show some improvement.

There is nothing that will take the place of a firm knowledge of the skills. However, there are some areas in which we should be doing more than we are at the present time. Students need more aid in the area of guidance—academic, vocational and social. More time could be spent profitably in the fields of music, art and speech. Effort should be made to provide a wholesome physical educational program other than merely competitive athletics. These are not educational "frills" as some people would like us to believe, but are ways in which we can hope to accomplish the aims of education. What are these aims? Very briefly, I would list them as follows:

- 1. Mastery of the basic skills and tools of knowledge-the three R's.
- 2. Becoming a good citizen.

- 3. Being able to enjoy physical and mental health and understanding the laws of hygiene.
- 4. Appreciating art, music and literature.
- 5. Being able to provide for needs by employment in the professions, industries, the arts and the sciences.
- 6. Being able to use increased leisure time wisely.
- 7. Being able to understand the physical aspects of our world—a knowledge of science.
- 8. Being tolerant of others, regardless of race, creed or color.

These aims mean that we must provide both an academic and realistic atmosphere in our schools. While we cannot neglect the traditional type of education, we must provide practical learning that will fulfill the needs of those students not going on to schools of higher learning.

With an ever-increasing enrollment in our schools and the holding power of the school growing, we have serious problems facing us. They can be solved only through a sincere interested citizenry who are willing to face the problems and attempt to do something about them.

TEACHERS

Mrs. Ruth Croteau, West Dummer School and Mrs. Florence Hamlin, Willis School were the teachers again in our schools last year. The town is fortunate in having two such outstanding and competent teachers.

ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

There were 28 students in the Dummer Schools on December 20, 1955. This is an increase of two over last year.

Again the percentage of attendance was exceptionally high in both Dummer schools. The Willis School had 98.84 per cent attendance and the Dummer Hill School had 97.62, or an average of 98.23. There were no cases of tardiness in either school for the the second consecutive year. Both of these records are ones that the citizens of Dummer can be very proud.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Both of the schools are in good repair, both having been reconditioned inside within the past few years. New record players were purchased for the schools this last year and these items add greatly to the life of the schools. Other equipment and reference material seem adequate, except for the usual replacements.

TUITION

We have at present time ten pupils attending high school in Berlin and from our enrollment this year we can estimate that there will be nine next year. Berlin tuition rate for 1955-56 is \$300.00 and it is expected to remain that figure for the coming year. There will be some tuition charges because of state wards that came from Dummer under a new law passed by the General Court.

TRANSPORTATION

The West Dummer School pupils are again being transported by Donald Hodgdon, as well as those pupils going to high school. Fred Bradford's contract for the route covering the Willis School expires this spring, but the School Board is of the opinion that it should be renewed for another period of time. Even though only two pupils live beyond the two mile limit, there are many others that live sufficient distance that the school attendance would suffer if there were no transportation facilities.

NOTES ON BUDGET

The School Board's total budget for 1956-57 is \$16,977.79 compared to \$16,303.00 for this year. The added increase results largely from increases given to the teachers and the janitors, as well as putting into the budget money for a handwriting system that Dummer, in conjunction with other towns in the Union, wishes to adopt.

I would also like to express my appreciation to the members of the School Board, the parents, the teachers, students and friends for their cooperation and help. With the feeling continuing, I am sure that we can maintain our good schools and also hope to improve them.
