Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dummer in the (L. S.) County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Willis School House in said Dummer on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at nine-thirty of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for general expense of the Highway Department.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for cutting bushes along town roads.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to accept T.R.A. and make appropriation for the same.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Poor.
- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Old Age Assistance.
- 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of cemeteries.
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of town libraries.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to give discount on taxes.
- 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any sum of money for the White Mountains Region Association.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to hire money in anticipation of taxes, and to renew notes.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Civil Defense.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will rase for Social Security.

- 17. To see what action the Town will take in regard to discontinuing the Dummer Hill Road (so-called) from the West Dummer School House to the end of the road on Dummer Hill.
- 18. To see what action the town will take in regard to discontinuing the highway leading from the Paul Holt residence to the Llewellyn Forbush farm, now owned by Dr. McVetty.
- 19. To see if the Town wll give the Selectmen the right to establish a town dump on the Charles Hawkins farm.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for construction of the dump referred to in Article 19.
- 21. To see what action the Town will take in regard to disposing of the Charles Hawkins farm.
- 22. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to apply on the long term notes.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Civil Defense.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting and make appropriations relating thereto.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of the Dummer School District:

Foreword

One of the things that has been troubling me for the past few years has been the rising costs of education to the District at the elementary level. There is little we can do about the costs of the high school students if we expect them to go to high school, which I am sure all of you desire. The state average cost per elementary pupil for 1957-58 was \$240, while in Dummer over \$450 was spent for each pupil. This seems to me to be a little unreasonable, but we can't do too much about it under the type organizational plan that we now operate.

In studying the census reports for the past two or three years, all the elementary pupils in the District live either on Route 16 or on the east side of the river, except three. After this year there will be only two pupils living on the west side of town. My proposal is to combine the two schools after the schooll year 1959-1960, transporting the pupils on Route 16 to the Willis School and tuitioning the two pupils living on the west side of town to one of the nearby schools on an adequate basis. The reason why the fall of 1960 ap. pears to be the best time to start this plan is that we will have ten pupils graduating that previous June. The following is a projected enrollment of the District, and unless there is a change, they could adequately be taken care of in the Willis School without too much of an increased burden on the teacher. The only reason for tuitioning the two pupils on the west side of town is the distance they would have to travel if they came to the Willis School.

What does this move mean as far as economy to the District is concerned? I have studied the problem at considerable length and feel that \$3000 could be saved. This is arrived at in the following manner:

It is estimated that our future budgets for 1960-61 will increase by nearly \$3000 for tuition alone, not counting other increases. The above net estimated savings would apply against any future budget increases, and thus keep the total budget figure at a level approximately the same as the current budget.

From an educational standpoint the students would not suffer appreciably. The number of students in the Willis School would not exceed 27-28, according to our present projected enrollment. The number in each class would be somewhat larger than at present, making competition greater, which is an incentive to the pupil.

It is my opinion that a move of this kind is the only way that we can hope to keep the budget from rising too much in the future unless we consolidate within Milan. The reason I have presented it in this manner is to get public reaction, as I would not recommend its going into operation for at least a year unless for an unanticipated emergency. It is hoped that you will contact your School Board and myself with an expression of your opinion.

Teachers

Mrs. Ruth Croteau of Stark, N. H., who after teaching in West Dummer for several years, resigned to accept a position in Groveton. Her place has been taken by Mrs. Elvira Sias, who resigned from the School Board to do so. Mrs. Sias has had several years' experience as a teacher,

some of which was in the Willis School several years ago. I feel that Mrs. Sias took the position for two reasons, for which she should be commended. First, she desired to get back into the profession and secondly, she knew of the difficulty we had in finding someone to fill the vacancy. I interviewed or contacted fifteen prospective teachers for the position, all of whom turned the offer down for one reason or another. The problem of finding teachers for rural schools, especially one-room schools, is getting more serious each year.

Under the section on the budget, you will note that we have recommended a \$300 raise for each teacher. This is to bring them closer to the state average salary which is \$3981 for this present school year, and also to show them that we appreciate the good work that each is doing.

Enrollment and Attendance

The enrollment in the two schools has dropped slightly from the previous year. As of Dec. 19, 1958 we had 32 pupils in the two schools, compared to 35 last year. Our percentage of attendance showed a decline due to the number of contagious illnesses contacted by the children. One bright spot, however, was the improvement in the number of tardiness cases. Last year we had a total of 34 tardy marks; this past year the number dropped to only eight. The teachers and children should be commended for this improvement.

Buildings and Equipment

The buildings are still in good repair and the School Board has constantly been vigil in their desire to keep them that way. This past summer a new and larger septic tank was installed in the Willis School. The other work done in the Willis School amounted to the annual summer maintenance program. This was true in the West Dummer School for the reasons listed in the foreword of this report.

Our equipment is being improved each year by the addition of new articles. This past summer a new duplicator was purchased for the use of the two teachers and during the winter a good second-hand typewriter was put in the Willis School. Ten new desks were purchased to replace some of the older desks that have worn out. Our reference materials in the two schools are very good.

Tuition

At the present time we have just five tuition pupils in high school. Next year we can plan to have at least seven in high school. The two pupils for whom the District paid tuition in Milan have gone back to live with their parents, thus relieving the District of that burden. Berlin's tuition rate next year will be \$388, or the state average cost per high school pupil.

The following year the two schools will graduate a class of ten, causing a considerable rise in tuition costs.

Budget

The School Board's proposed budget for 1959-60 is \$19,-622.34, as compared with \$19,851.74 for the current year. This is a decrease from the previous year, the main cause being the decline in the number of tuition pupils. This item, though, will go back up again the next year as explained in the previous section. Most of the other items have gone up very slightly, except that of teachers' salaries, which was explained under that section.

Warrant

The only special article to consider this year will be one to give the School Board the right to use the unexpended balance of the current budget for the purpose of installing a more modern type of heating system in the Willis School. At the present time it is estimated that there will be a balance of approximately \$1800-\$2000 in the general fund.

The School Board and myself have discussed several times what means could be found to better heat the basement of the Willis School. With the gravity type of warm air system that is now being used, very little heat stays in the basement. The cold basement and toilets have been very discomforting to the students, teachers and public. Since this school is used so much for public affairs, it seems wise to install a forced hot water system, cil fired, that can be divided into two zones. One zone would take care of the classroom and other rooms upstairs, and the second would heat the downstairs areas including the toilets. In this way maximum efficiency and economy would be accomplished. At the same time, the attic of the building should be insulated to prevent loss of heat.

It appears that this move is a good one, considering the fact that the Willis School is the more modern and larger of the two buildings. Also this is the school that will probably be kept open the longer if one of the two schools is closed as suggested in the foreword. Another reason why this seems to be a good thing is the fact that the Willis School serves as a public meeting place and town hall. It is hoped that favorable action will be taken at the meeting, particularly where such a major improvement can be made within funds already raised.
