TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dorchester in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: (L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Dorchester on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to withhold a certain amount from the town maintenance for winter road expenses.

5. To see if the town will vote to work on Town Roads the same hours and for the same pay as on State Roads.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to buy a snow plow for use on a truck.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to build a new bridge near Mrs. Delsart's and receive State Aid.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for State Aid Construction or Town Road Aid.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town poor.

10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

11. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, or Committees, heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

School Board and Citizens of the Dorchester School District:

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I hereby submit my seventh annual report as Superintendent of Schools. The statistical report for the year 1935-1936 follows this report.

There are at present 15 scholars attending the Cheever School. This is a very good number for a rural school. The number of Dorchester children placed in Canaan and Lyme schools varies from time to time, but the situation is carefully handled by the Board. The Board is keeping within the average cost of transportation, so that the expense of these Camp children is practically carried by the state and the burden on the district is negligible. It is anticipated that in a short time this problem will take care of itself for economic reasons as lumber operations decline.

During the summer a splendid hardwood floor was laid at Cheever and the school room was papered. The work is checked carefully both daily and long range as measured by standard achievement and intelligence tests. Parents can assist materially in the building up of the general knowledge of children if they would encourage them to listen to the news commentators over the radio. It is surprising how well informed even rather small children may be who follow daily the events of the nation and world.
