LIBRARIAN'S REPORT.

The number of volumes in the library is 558, of which 401 are fiction; 52, history and travel; 32, poetry; 17, natural science; 17, biography; and 39, miscellaneous: 66 of these have been added during the year,—52 by purchase; and 14 in gifts from the following:

Miss A. A. Brigham, Miss M. J. Carpenter, Miss H. M. Pierce of Dorchester, Mass., Mrs. N. M. Foster, of Waltham, Mass., Mr. R. G. Langmaid of Bayonne, N. J., and Harper & Bros., N. Y.

Two years' numbers of the "Century Magazine" have been given by Mrs. Jas. Richmond.

There has been received for catalogues, 30 cts., and in fines, \$2.17, making a total of \$2.47 received.

One hundred fifty-nine different persons have taken out books during the year, an increase over last year of 23.

The average number of books taken out during the warmer months was 26, and during the colder, 24; 46 were given out on Feb. 13, 1904, the largest number on any one day during the year. Three times as many have been taken during the last month, since the new purchase, as during the preceding month.

The new books are read through in four or five months, and through the rest of the year interest in the library lessens.

Back numbers of standard magazines, or subscriptions to some good paper or magazine, for a reading table, would be appreciated.

SCHOOL REPORT.

The fifteenth of February closes another year of work in our public schools and in accordance with custom, your School Board, submit the following report :

The year just completed has been marked by no particular change in conducting our schools or in results obtained.

We have endeavored to secure the best teachers possible and have been very fortunate, considering the salaries paid.

Having secured good teachers, we have retained them when we could.

We are pleased to observe an improvement in attendance the past year, yet the average attendance in some of the schools is not what it should be.

The good results we might expect from our schools, are seriously impaired, by the position taken, by some of the parents who, if they do not encourage, allow their children to be absent from school for trivial reasons.

Why should we expect a teacher to be interested in the intellectual growth of a child if his parents are not?

We have purchased the school house at New Dover and repaired the same and now have a school room which is neat, attractive and will compare favorably with any in town.

We have also sheathed the walls and ceiling and made other repairs at Pine Ground, thinking it wise to do a thorough job, even at quite an expense.

We recommend the raising of about the same amount of money as in former years, that we may paint the outside of the school houses and make other much needed repairs.
