To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$604.50, the State to give \$1208.00 for State Aid Construction; or to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$395.31 the State to give \$1,581.22 for town road maintenance.
- 4. To see what action the town will take for winter breaking in the future.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to pay discount on all property taxes, as in 1934.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collectors' deeds.

9. Any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens:

My duties in your school system were entered upon last July with a diffidence fitting for one who realized that his position there was due to the economies forced by act of the last legislature rather than to any desire for change on your part.

For the forbearance shown during the time necessary for me to become acquainted with you, with your policies and your schools, I wish to express my gratitude to the members of the school board, the teachers, and to such citizens as I have had opportunity to meet.

The district has been fortunate in retaining the services of Miss Greene at the Pine Ground School. Of the two new teachers, Mrs. Williams at the Center is a teacher with experience and Normal School training, and Miss Nelson at Horse Corner was graduated from Keene Normal School last June. Both are conducting their schools well.

In buying books and supplies I have been somewhat conservative until I could become better acquainted with your most pressing needs.

The crowded condition of the Pine Ground School needs to be relieved either by increasing the size of the room, or transporting some of the children to the Center or elsewhere. Any money needed to finance the plan adopted needs to be raised until Article II of the Warrant for the District, in addition to the \$6,107.39 called for in the school board's budget. A jacket placed around the stove has helped to keep children near the stove cooler and those in the back of the room warmer.

The report of health work for the last school year showed five children underweight as contrasted with nine the previous year; four with defective vision, three of these cases having been corrected during the year. The same number as last year had defective teeth, 2; diseased tonsils, 5; enlarged glands, 1. No contagious diseases during the year were reported.
