Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Exeter, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a town clerk.

2nd. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one selectman for three years.

3rd. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the Robinson Female Seminary for the term of seven years.

4th. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the trust funds held by the Town of Exeter, to hold office for three years.

5th. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the Swasey Parkway for three years.

6th. To choose all other necessary town officers, auditors, or committees for the ensuing year.

7th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing highways, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building sidewalks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling streets, for payments of the town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying expenses of decorating the graves of soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the town, and for the payment of firemen for the ensuing year, and for other charges arising within the town.

8th. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the use of Robinson Female Seminary during the coming year.

9th. To hear reports of the committees heretofore chosen and pass any votes arising therefrom.

10th. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the selectmen, to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

11th. To see if it is the sense of the qualified voters whether or not it is expedient to revise the constitution.

12th. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to conduct a census for the purpose of listing all persons whose names should appear on the Poll Tax Warrant.

13th. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars for the purpose of printing fifteen hundred Valuation Books.

14th. On petition of Fred A. Moore and thirteen others, to see if the Town will vote to appoint a committee to supervise the celebration of the 300th anniversary of the Town of Exeter in the year 1938, and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars for the use of said committee.

15th. On petition of Joseph Curran and ten others, to see if the Town will appropriate \$600 for ten concerts to be played in the Swasey Pavilion.

16th. On petition of Willie S. Day and twenty-five others, to see if the Town will vote to replace the present ineffective sewer on Columbus Avenue, said sewer extending from the residence of Charles J. Haley to the junction of Winter Street and Railroad Avenue, and appropriate the sum of twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200.00) for the same.

17th. On petition of John Templeton and ten others, to see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to make a contract for street lighting with the Exeter & Hampton Electric Company for such term of years as may be determined, at prices not to exceed those specified in the present contract expiring April 1st, 1937, and appropriate money as required to carry out such contract for the term of one year.

18th. On petition of Frank G. Peavey and eleven others, to see if the Town will vote to raise the elevation of the present fence between the highway and the river, and northerly of the Swasey Parkway, and to improve the sidewalk from the Swasey Parkway to the residence of Mrs. W. J. Henderson upon Newmarket Road, appropriating the sum of \$700 (seven hundred) dollars for same.

19th. On petition of Frank A. Batchelder and ten others,

to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Seacoast Regional Development Association, the sum of \$552.87.

20th. On petition of C. F. Fifield and twelve others, to see if the Town will vote to install two oil burners in the Town Hall boilers and appropriate \$585.00 to pay for same.

21st. On petition of Ralph E. Meras and twenty others, to see if the Town will vote to stop buying fire insurance on property owned by the Town.

22nd. On petition of Frank G. Peavey and eighteen others, to see if the Town will vote to employ the services of a Certified Public Accountant in the annual audit of accounts of all Town officials, and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to defray the expense of same.

23rd. On petition of Ralph E. Meras and nineteen others, to see if the Town will vote to install a loud-speaker amplifier system and appropriate the sum of \$700 for the same.

24th. On petition of George J. Maher and twelve others, to see if the Town will vote to install a street light on Cottage Street and appropriate money for same.

25th. On petition of Arthur J. White and ten others, to see if the Town will vote to install an electric light on Morrow Street, near the residence of Arthur J. White, and appropriate money for the same.

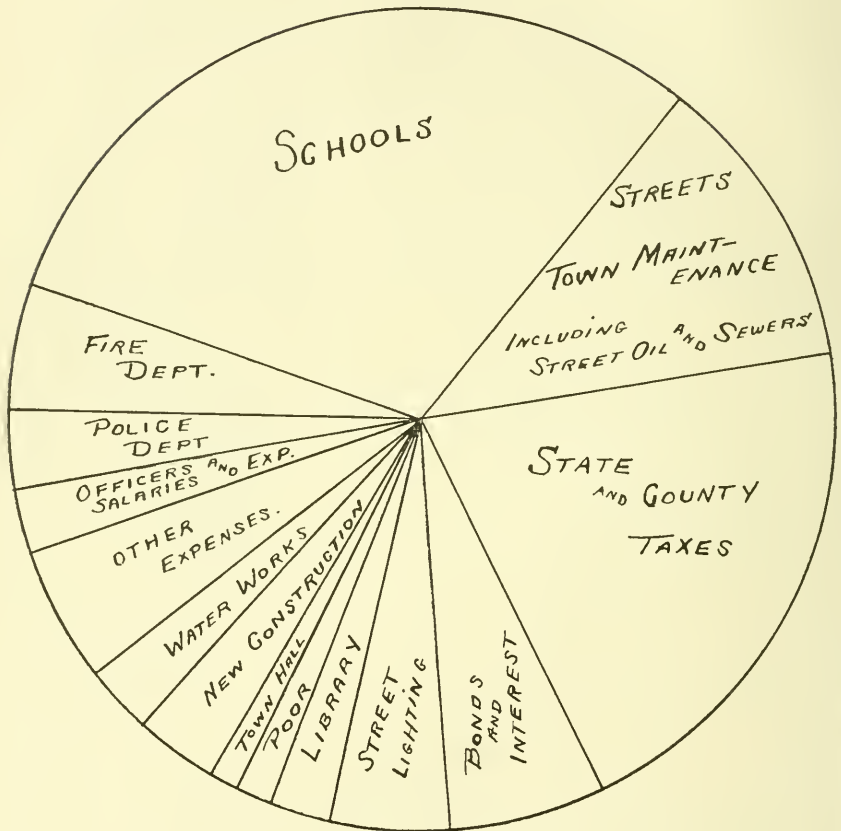

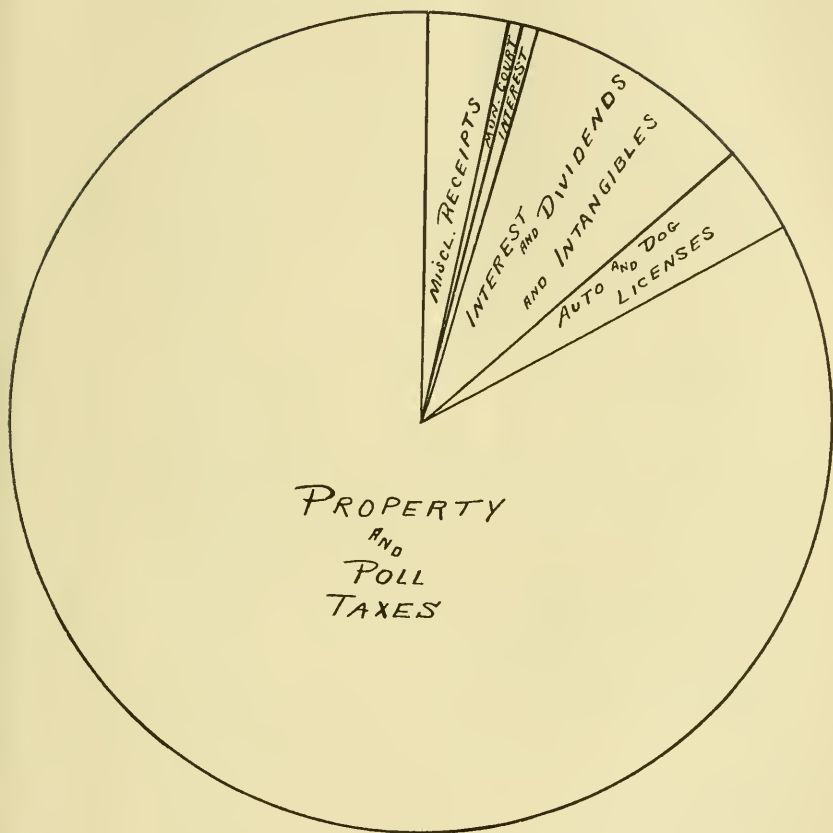

The past year has seen changes in the staff of the Exeter Public Library. Mrs. Alger S. Bourn resigned in September to move to Penacook. Her resignation left vacant the position of first assistant and children's librarian. Marietta H. Carlisle who has been general assistant for some years was appointed to the vacancy. She is specially qualified for the position because, in addition to her years of service, she attended the two weeks of summer school for librarians held by the New Hampshire Public Library Commission. The position left vacant by Mrs. Carlisle's promotion has been most ably filled by Doris L. Armstrong. Miss Armstrong is a Robinson graduate and had worked in the library as a substitute before being made a regular member of the staff.

There have been changes in the library which are apparent to all. The first of these is the repainting of the walls and ceiling in the lobby, the reading room and children's room. At the same time the woodwork in these rooms and the very beautiful oak front doors which were badly weathered, were refinished. It is hoped that the rest of the interior will be repainted this coming year. The second change might be called an innovation. It is the installation of a telephone. Patrons have found it very convenient for the renewal of books and to arrange for reference material which would be called for later.

The staff has found it helpful in reminding patrons when books are overdue.

The children's room has had a number of additions in the course of the past year. The first of these was a new book case. The book collection had grown until the shelves were very crowded, especially during the summer when fewer books circulate. An oak book case was made to match those already in the room and placed in the only empty wall space, which was that under the window in the wall between the lobby and the children's room. This did much to relieve the condition. This fall six kindergarten chairs were bought for the room and the legs of the small painted table were shortened, making a group much more suitable for the younger children than the heavy furniture which had been in use. A standing bulletin board for the display of book jackets and other material has also been added. This was made at the high school to fit the space in front of the Bell case. It is made from celotex and is finished with a varnished wood trim.

There are, however, things of which the average person knows nothing. Chief among these is the weeding out from the fiction shelves of all badly worn or outdated material. This weeding process is going on more or less continuously, but this year has been done on a larger scale than usual. The shelves, as must be apparent to the most casual observer, have become badly overcrowded. Partly to relieve this condition and partly to prepare for the making of a new shelf list the fiction has been gone over with a fine tooth comb. Books with missing pages and books that were badly soiled or worn were removed at once. After careful checking with lists published by the American Library Association and others suggested by the New Hampshire Public Library Commission, those books which had outlived their usefulness and are now worthless were also removed. Those which were removed because of poor physical condition, but which are still necessary are being replaced by new copies as quickly as possible.

The task of making a new shelf list is well under way, and

it is expected it will be finished this coming summer. For the benefit of those who are curious, an explanation of the term shelf list is in order. For every book in the library cards are made giving author, title, publisher, date and number of pages. These are filed alphabetically, as in a dictionary, by author, title and subject, making what is known as the card catalog. This catalog is for the use of the public. Another set of cards is made and filed by number in the case of non-fiction and by author in the case of fiction. These are, therefore, in the filing cases in the same order in which the books are on the shelves and are known as the shelf list.

The picture collection has been developed until it is now beginning to be useful. There is still much work to be done sorting and mounting pictures already on hand before the collection has more than a potential value. However, the circulation of 259 pictures in the past year shows a need for such material.

It is always interesting at the end of the year to examine trends in reading as indicated by the circulation. Needless to say the year's most popular book of fiction has been "Gone with the wind." The most popular book of non-fiction is a little harder to determine, but if number of reserve orders is any gauge, "Live alone and like it" is the book. The most popular class of non-fiction was history and travel (grouped together) which showed considerable increase over last year. Biography, still second in popularity, showed a slight decrease. Third was literature which increased slightly. Fine arts and applied science were next in line. Philosophy, religion and philology were all groups which showed an increase, while social sciences decreased slightly. The circulation of magazines for the past year has shown a marked and inexplicable increase. Although the children's room circulation figures show a slight decrease for the year as a whole, a check-up by the month shows a substantial gain for November, December and January over the same months for the previous year.

Changes in Personnel

Last February, shortly after the submission of the last annual report, Miss Henrietta R. Roe was selected as instructor in Senior High sciences. With degrees of B.S. and Master of Education, she came well prepared for the position.

Miss Ruth Ellis, a graduate of Katharine Gibbs School, assumed the duties of secretary to the principal in September.

Relations with Post -Secondary Institutions

Although continuation of one's formal education is not the only measure of success in the secondary school, it is of interest to record the decisions of Seminary students relative to post-secondary education. Seven registered at the University of New Hampshire, one at Plymouth Normal and two selected business training. Three returned for post-graduate work in subjects not available to them while undergraduates.

Robinson Seminary has been named again as one of the preparatory schools entitled to nominate a Trustee Scholar to Mills College, California, for 1937-38. The scholar receives aid to the extent of \$500 for the freshman year. Outstanding students may apply for the continuation of the scholarship.

Relations with Parents

Last April a special attempt was made to enable parents to visit actual classes during an evening session. Two periods of classes were held, each teacher having at least one class in her major field. An opportunity was given for parents to confer with teachers if they so desired.

As evidence of the success of this venture, the writer offers the fact that one hundred and sixty-two attended. Numerous parents expressed appreciation for the opportunity of observing classes and examining the equipment provided at the Seminary. The results of the first evening session warrant making it an annual affair.

Relations with Pupils

It is very evident to those dealing with young people that much education of great value is obtained outside of textbooks. Such a realization has prompted the Seminary faculty to take increased interest in the guidance of pupils entrusted to their care.

Guidance may be conceived as having three important aspects, educational, vocational and social-civic. Three committees are at work now preparing a unified program of guidance in each of these fields which will reach directly the

greatest number of girls. These combined efforts will influence more girls than the sincerest efforts of individual teachers who are not aware of the extent to which other teachers are attempting guidance in any of its phases.

The monthly bulletin first issued in January will take a part in the scheme of guidance. Each subsequent issue will present information for parents and students alike.

As the purposes and problems of the Seminary become better known, more can be accomplished for the benefit of all.

New Course

The writer feels that progress in a school necessitates at times a change in the curricula offered.

For many years Physiology was offered as a separate subject in the sophomore year in the Home Economics curriculum. Last September, with the enthusiastic approval of the state department, the important features of Physiology were combined with Biology, and Economic Geography was substituted. Miss Roe has very capably assumed the responsibility of this new course.

Physical Education

To systematize the matter of excuses from the classes in physical education on account of physical disability, all excuses must be approved by the school physician. Information from family physicians is always treated with professional courtesy and highly valued.

The interscholastic schedule of sports remains a moderate one of fourteen games, six of hockey and eight of basketball. No attempts are made to strive for tournament play for girls which does not have the approval of the writer. Tournaments seem to take the game out of the realm of sport and make it a spectacle.

Pupil Activities

The great diversity of pupil interests presents a problem to any administrator. While wishing to make possible the development of these interests, one must always remember the

primary purpose of a school, namely the opportunity for an education.

Too many think that the school can assume the responsibility for entertainment as well. As long as pupils regard diversions, athletic or dramatic as additions rather than substitutes for regular work, the Seminary will continue to provide reasonable opportunity for the same.

"Snap Judgment," the senior play, was presented very successfully on December fourth, under the direction of Miss Wareham.

The Dramatic Club has accepted an invitation to participate for the fifth time in the New Hampshire Drama Day, March twentieth, at Manchester.

Responses by pupils as they purchased Christmas seals and contributed to the regular drive of the Red Cross demonstrated their interest in others.

Under the direction of Mrs. Johnson, the music groups are looking forward to sending representatives to take part in the Music Festival at Claremont in the spring.

Inspection

Mr. Russell H. Leavitt made his annual visit to the Seminary on December 8, 1936.

Conclusion

The above report can give only a glimpse of the work of the Seminary. Parents are welcome to visit at any time and discuss any problems with the principal and teachers.
