Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: [L.S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, in said Exeter, on Tuesday, the sixth day of March, next at eight of the clock in the forenoon, to choose all necessary Town Officers, for the year ensuing, by ballot, the polls to open at eight of the clock in the forenoon and to close not earlier than eight of the clock in the evening, and to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Selectman for the term of three (3) years.
- 2. To choose by ballot and plurality vote three (3) members of the Library Committee for the term of three (3) years.
- 3. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Robinson Fund for the term of seven (7) years.
- 4. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Trust Funds held by the Town of Exeter for the term of three (3) years.
- 5. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Swasey Parkway for the term of three (3) years.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen and pursuant to RSA 33:7 to incur debt for temporary loans in anticipation of 1973 taxes and to issue therefor notes of the Town payable within one year after their date, and to pay or renew the same by the issue of new notes, payable within one year after the date of the original obligation.
- 7. On petition of Paul S. LaPerle and one hundred others, to see if the town will vote to repeal the Zon-

ing Ordinance of the Town as adopted at the Special Town Meeting of May 24, 1966 and as subsequently amended.

- 8. On petition of Paul S. LaPerle and one hundred others, to see if the Town will vote to revoke the creation of the Planning Board as heretofore created at the annual Town Meeting of March, 1965.
- 9. To see whether the Town will vote to have two sessions for the Annual Town Meeting in this Town, the first session for choice of Town officers elected by an official ballot and other action required to be inserted on said official ballot and the second session, on a date set by the Selectmen, for transaction of other business.
- 10. To see whether the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map by repealing the Zoning Ordinance as amended through March, 1972 and the Zoning Map appurtenant thereto; and substituting therefor the Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map appurtenant thereto as proposed by the Planning Board.
- 11. To see whether the Town will vote to amend the Building Code by deleting Article 1.3, Section 1, and substituting therefor the following:

1.3 Buildings and Structures Affected. The provisions of this Code shall apply to buildings or structures, modular and mobilehomes, on, under or over land or water, including constructions such as signs, swimming pools, vaults, areas or street encroachments, however placed, whether separate from or appurtenant to such buildings or structures. Such provisions shall apply with equal force to municipal, county or state buildings as they do to private buildings, except as may be specifically provided for by statute or ordinance. The provisions of this Code, based on occupancy, also apply to conversions of existing buildings and structures or portions thereof from one occupancy classification to another.

12. To see if the Town will vote to establish an Historical District that will include properties fronting on the following streets and back to their rear property line or two hundred (200) feet whichever is less: both sides of Park Street from and including #77 to the centerline of Water Street; Epping Road from the corner of Winter Street to and including #22 Epping Road; Cass Street from Park Street to the centerline of Main Street; Green Street from Cass Street to the centerline of Water Street. The above described area excludes the Park Street Common.

- 13. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, and other officers and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote pertaining thereto.
- 14. To choose all other necessary Town officers, auditors or committees for the ensuing year.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to be paid into the Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) for the purpose of increasing the salary of the Selectmen from one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) each.
- 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the purpose of increasing the salary of the Treasurer from fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) to two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).
- 18. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of forty-nine thousand dollars (\$49,000.00) committed by the Selectmen from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for construction engineering costs related to the Water Treatment Plant.
- 19. To see if the town will vote and appropriate the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the construc-

tion of a new Highway Department garage on land owned by the Town.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of correcting certain inequities in the Town Personnel Plan.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to modify the traffic light system located at Green Hill Road and Portsmouth Avenue.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to purchase a pick-up truck for the Fire Department.
- 23. On the petition of Richard F. Burnham and nineteen others to see whether the Town will vote to purchase the Elks property, so-called, on the Southerly side of Hampton Road, consisting of approximately ten acres of land with the buildings thereon, from the Exeter Banking Company, to use as a Town recreation area, and to appropriate for such purpose a sum not to exceed sixty-nine thousand nine hundred eighty-three dollars (\$69,983.00) out of funds made available to the town under the Federal Revenue Sharing Act, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 24. On petition of Karen C. Cushman and twenty-two others to see whether the Town will vote to designate Pickpocket Road, so-called, in Exeter, as a scenic road in accordance with the provisions of RSA, ch. 253, sections 17 and 18.
- 25. On petition of Sandra B. Smith and fourteen others, to see if the Town will vote to prohibit the use of salt and similar chemicals on highways within the Town except for dangerous intersections and extreme

road conditions as designated by the Selectmen or Superintendent of Highways.

- 26. On petition of Walter R. Lang and ninety-five others to see if the Town will vote to revoke the adoption of all ordinances establishing all boundaries of any historic district in the Town of Exeter; and to revoke the adoption and appointment of the Historic District Commission and conclude its function within the Town.
- 27. On petition of J. Harold E. Carbonneau and eighteen others, to see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law; and if adopted to see if the Town will elect twelve (12) members at large and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 28. On petition of Marianne Gage and eleven others, to see of the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the Newmarket Day Care Center, which serves Exeter residents.
- 29. On petition of Dorothea B. Simmering and ten others to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to extend the sewer main from its present terminus near Eno's Brickyard on Route #111 to a point opposite the premises of George Wool on said Route #111.
- 30. To see whether the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept and record a deed from LaPerle Realty, Inc., to the Town of the present private way roads known as Michael Avenue and Allard Street, after said roads have been properly prepared for acceptance to the satisfaction of the Board of Selectmen.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) to re-

imburse, in part, the Seacoast Regional Office of Child and Family Services of New Hampshire, a private charitable organization, for services rendered to thirty (30) families of the Town of Exeter during calendar year of 1972 who were unable to pay for said services.

32. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 23 of the United States Housing Act of 1969, as amended, the Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing agencies in providing low-rent housing by leasing dwelling units in privately-owned structures; and

WHEREAS, said Section 23 provides that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any locality unless the governing body of the locality has by resolution approved the application of such provisions to such locality.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the qualified voters of the Town of Exeter as follows:

The application of the provisions of Section 23 of the United States Housing Act of 1969, as amended, to the Town of Exeter be approved in order that the Housing Authority of the Town of Exeter, New Hampshire, may at no cost to the Town, obtain federal assistance for the leasing of dwellings by eligible persons and families as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1969, as amended.

33. To see if the Town will vote to approve the application by the Housing Authority of the Town to the federal government for preliminary loans and to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a Co-operation Agreement with the Housing Authority, by adopting the following resolution:

Be it resolved by the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, New Hampshire, that there exists in the Town a need for housing at rents which persons and families can afford as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended which need is not being adequately met by private enterprise; that the Housing Authority of the Town is hereby authorized to apply to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Housing Assistance Administration for a preliminary loan at no cost to the Town for surveys and planning in connection with construction of housing under said Act; and the Selectmen are authorized to execute, on behalf of the Town, an agreement with the Housing Authority providing for the local co-operation required by the Housing Assistance Administration pursuant to the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, and to act in any manner relating thereto.

- 34. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building sidewalks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling streets, for payment of the Town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying expenses of decorating the graves of soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the Town, for the payment of firemen for the ensuing year, and for other charges arising within the Town.
- 35. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Exhibit A-1 is the Balance Sheet—comparative 1971 and 1972. The net debt at the close of 1971 was \$35,812.55. At the close of 1972 it was a surplus of \$58,581.77, an increase of \$94,394.32.

Many things were contributing factors, accumulating such a large surplus. Items carried forward from the previous year were carried to appropriations amounting to \$16,563.00. Revenues were underestimated by \$44,940.10 and unexpended balances of appropriations were \$124,960.58.

A mistake was discovered in last year's Balance Sheet. \$100,000.00 was carried as a C. D. investment and also in the balance of the Treasurer, making a change from a surplus to a net debt for 1971.

This year a cash surplus of \$75,581.77 is available to reduce the tax rate.

During the 1972 year Article 15 on the warrant to raise \$26,400.00 for Sewer Project voted yes was omitted from the appropriations presented to the Tax Commission. These funds are needed to get Federal grants which will be forthcoming if town monies are available. We have reduced surplus by this \$26,400.00 and set it up as a carried forward liability. See Exhibit A-1.

General Comments

Improved accounting must be adopted by the town. A complete record of appropriations approved and revenues estimated should be maintained and balanced each month. The Treasurer's records should be reconciled with depository banks each month.

My personal thanks to all town officials and office personnel for aiding me during the course of audit.

I respectfully submit the annual report for the Town of Exeter's Highway Department.

During the year, 1972, there was a total of 24 storms with a total accumulation of approximately $115\frac{1}{2}$ inches of snow.

Summer maintenance consisted of spring cleanup, coldpatching potholes, manhole and catch basin repairs, street sweeping, and trimming and grooming of roadsides.

Along with the usual summer maintenance a portion of Water Street and Route 88 were overlayed with hot top. The whole of Pine Street was done, and another portion of Front Street was done by Bell and Flynn Company.

Through the efforts of Mr. Joseph R. Curran, Director of Civil Defense, this Department received a sixwheel drive truck from the excess property of the Government at no cost to the Town. This truck has been converted to use for salt-spreading.

EXETER SEWER DEPARTMENT

I respectfully submit the annual report for the Town of Exeter's Sewer Department.

A high velocity water pressure cleaner augmented by a Civilian Defense Army Truck with 2,000 gallon tank, cleaned many miles of sewer pipe. This saved thousands compared to contract cleaning.

There were 750 storm water basins cleaned by a hydraulic method which was less expensive than previous vacuum cleaning.

Addition of acid for P.H. control made odor abatement at the Holding Pond more successful, prior to aunouncement by Milliken officials to construct their own industrial waste treatment plant.

Necessary pump rebuilding was carried on to keep five pumping stations in 24 hour service.

Our main pumping station showed an increase of 12.8% over last year, pumping 503,903,000 gallons of domestic waste to the four pond lagoon site where distribution and chemical treatment aided natural oxidation. Daily pumping average was 1,380,000 gallons.

Additional laboratory equipment was purchased to comply with New Hampshire Water Pollution Control standards of quality control.

The Veterans Council supervised the two parades held in Exeter in 1972.

The Memorial Day speaker was Peter Powell, son of former governor of N.H. Wesley Powell of Hampton Falls, N.H. Parade Marshal was Albert Phillips, U.S. Air Force (ret.) Lt. Col. Thomas Cronshaw was Officer of the Day and the Chaplain of the Day was Rev. Vinton Bowering of the Exeter Unitarian Church. A short memorial service was held at the Parkway in honor of the men and women who gave their lives at sea. The wreath was placed upon the water by Elizabeth and Linda Vance, members of the Unit 32 Junior Auxiliary, American Legion. A new unit was added to the marching units this year and this was the Civil Air Patrol and they placed a wreath at the World War Monument in honor of the pilots who gave their lives while on submarine patrol along our coast in unarmed planes. Also for the first time in many years the Exeter Police Department turned out for the parade.

Veteran's Day services were held on November 11, 1972 by a vote of the Council. The speaker was Past Department Commander of the American Legion John H. Cook of Dover, N.H. The parade marshal was Major Austin Quinney, U.S. Army (ret.). The Officer of the Day was Lt. Col. Thomas Cronshaw and the Chaplain of the Day was Rev. Mr. Fonville of Christ Church of Exeter. Music was provided by the Exeter-Epping Gladiators and the Swordsmen of Somersworth, N.H.

A monument was dedicated to the Vietnam Veterans at the Exeter Cemetery and the names of the young men from Exeter who gave their lives in Vietnam were engraved in the monument. The cost of this was paid for by the following:

Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association

The Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association provides skilled nursing and physical therapy services under the direction of the patient's physician. This may include home visits to administer injections, change surgical dressings, supervise medications and diet, record vital signs, draw blood, irrigate catheters, administer enemas, assist or teach the patient's family in regard to personal care, skin care, and cast care. Many visits are made to newborns and mothers for health and diet teaching and care of mother and infant. Patients physically able to leave the home may receive injections at the VNA office. The physical therapist is available to patients in establishing a home exercise program. teaching family exercise pattern and daily routine and evaluating need for any equipment necessary to rehabilitate a patient to his fullest potential as a contributing member of society.

Through our Well Child Clinic many children are receiving immunizations and physical examinations, vision and hearing screening, dental hygiene instruction, and diet teaching, who previously may not have because of financial problems or lack of follow-up in updating health care necessities.

Visits are also made to crippled children, tuberculosis patients, mental health and Veterans Administration referrals. Assistance is also given to patients in understanding Medicare, Medicaid, Blue Cross-Blue Shield, and eligibility for these benefits.

Through the VNA hospital based Home Health Coordinator, patients are now receiving continuity of care after hosipital discharge to the home.

The above services are provided to everyone in the community — the young, old, aged, pregnant mothers, and all economic groups for the purpose of promoting, maintaining or restoring health, or minimizing the effects of illness and disability. Better health care knowledge prevents accidents, illness, and disease, and saves many health dollars.

There are many ways to get home health care: (1) The patient's physician may contact the VNA office, (2) The patient can contact the VNA office directly, (3) A spouse, relative, friend may contact the VNA office, or (4) Another agency or referral source may refer a patient for home health care.

As of October 31, 1972, a total of 2,804 visits have been made to 343 individuals. Of these 2,168 were charge, and 636 were no-charge. They included nursing and physical therapy visits, visits to new mothers and babies with enrollment in the Well Child Clinic for those interested.

Public Library Report

Library statistics, by and large, are pretty gloomy reading. The national figures on percent of the population who hold library cards is something like 11%. When I was in library school, a favorite topic of debate was the death of the public library as a viable institution. The New York State Library recently proposed to shut all children's rooms and serve children from school libraries only.

They didn't do this. They didn't, because there was enough of a public outcry to discourage it. So somebody is using libraries. In Exeter a lot of people do. Registrations are up nearly three hundred over last year, making a total of over six thousand card holding citizens — even allowing for "ghosts," who come in once and disappear forever, and out-of-towners, that's an awful lot of cards for a town with a population of 8,892. Circulation has soared: up 11,469 from last year to a total of nearly eighty thousand circulations. But, as America is finally beginning to discover, sheer growth is not an unmixed blessing. We need more and more books, records, everything. Even with two and three copies apiece the best sellers have long waiting lists. We probably ought to be open every evening, but that would mean having to hire another person. And the space problem is getting worse and worse: some books are crammed in so tightly it's hard to pull them off the shelf, and there is no room to shift them anywhere. The state library has suggested using Exeter as a trial library having talking books and other media material right out on loan — but there's simply no place to put them. The children's film programs are great but it means shutting down the childrens' room while they're going on.

This is not to say the outlook is bleak. We are the first and only library in the state with a game collection.

We are one of the five libraries in the Seacoast Art Lending Collection. We have records, though not nearly enough; we have tripled our paperback collection. We have an enormously successful children's story hour. Most heartening of all — much more so than the circulation figures — is the various kinds of public support shown during the year. It came in many ways: the new curtains, the people who come in to file and type, the crowds at the booksales, the cartons and bags of books, the outright money grants, even and especially the kind words. There were even gifts of brownies and cake for the librarians. We must be doing something right.

Department of Recreation

The year 1972 was one of program expansion and growth made possible through the help of volunteers and the excellent cooperation of the Exeter School District and Phillips Exeter Academy. Without these two organizations, we would be unable to operate many of our programs. The schools are utilized four out of five days a week for youth and adult programs.

Our Senior Citizens Club has increased to about fifty members. Consequently, the additional space needed for meetings is becoming a problem.

The Youth Hockey program came under our department last year, with a twelve member Board of Directors still in charge of the program. This year, 330 boys, ages 5-14, are participating.

The Swim Team has grown to 90 members who use the Academy pool each week for practice and meets.

The 1972 Summer Playground program had more than 300 students participating daily in the eight week program.

Our department tries to provide programs for all age groups — from Ski Lessons to Volleyball, Arts and Crafts to dance.

It might be of interest to note that our department takes care of 17 commons, 2 parks and 2 closed cemeteries in Exeter, in addition to our Recreation programs.

In October I had a chance to attend the National Recreation and Parks Conference in California, thanks to some Recreation minded citizens who helped defray the expenses. It was the most rewarding experience of my Recreational career. It is, and has been, my feeling that if we can keep the young people busy, they won't be out in the streets causing trouble. I will say that in my short time here in Exeter, I am pleased to see that many of the students want Recreation, and it is my goal to give them the best that money and time will allow. I have had a chance to talk to many groups in the Junior and Senior High schools, and I feel that with young people like these, our country is in good hands for the future.

Many community clubs have helped the Recreation Department in one way or another during the last twelve months, but since the list would be too long to print here, I will just say thanks to all of you for your assistance.

With your support, we can grow to a point where Exeter can be as progressive as any community in the New England area. However, I feel our greatest need is land acquisition. As the population increases, and as the amount of leisure time increases, so does the need for recreation. Recreation used to be a luxury, but now is a much needed service.

Report of Conservation Commission

The major function of the Conservation Commission is to try to insure the rights of Exeter's citizens to live within a balanced environment.

In 1972 the Commission planted a total of 210 trees along Exeter streets: 100 sycamores; 75 red maples; and 35 sugar maples. Mr. John Tucker supervised highway employees in planting and staking the trees. The Commission welcomes requests and information on areas and specific site locations within the town where new trees should be planted in 1973. Please contact Mr. Roger Sloan, Commission member, in charge of the tree planting project.

The Commission, in order to cut down the number of trees to be replaced, insure the quality of our surface water, and other reasons, has sponsored an ordinance limiting the use of salt on roadways within the town limits.

The Commission tree nursery is now starting to earn its way as 35 sugar maples, planted on Exeter's streets, were from this nursery. The number and variety of trees cared for at the nursery has increased.

This past year, two students and one teacher were sent by the Commission to Conservation Camp. The Commission also assisted both financially and personally in bringing about the first Jr. High School Ecology Conference ever to be held on a state level.

Its membership has increased with the addition of seven new associate members. It is hoped that the work load can now be spread out and more projects attempted.

This Spring, Henderson-Swasey Park (Fort Rock) should be ready with a completed discovery trail for all interested persons. This tract of land is being managed as a multi-use wildlife sanctuary, educational laboratory for school children and the general public, and for limited recreational use. A survey of the park has been partially completed.

The Commission plans to present the town with a detailed wet-lands map, now partially completed, to assist the town in adequate planning of an orderly expansion program.

Both a talk on recycling and a river clean-up day were sponsored last year with hopes of more developments along these lines in the coming year.

The Commission welcomes gifts of land that can be kept open for scenic or green belt purposes in their natural state. It would also consider, with selectmen approval, the purchase of land in order to enlarge the green belt area within the town.

Anyone having suggestions or wishing to assist the Commission should contact any Commission member.

Exeter Planning Board

The Exeter Planning Board's first meeting on January 3, 1972 was a public hearing on proposals to be submitted to the voters at town meeting 1972. The following members were present: Wesley Thomas, Phyllis Hoddeson, Charles Knibbs, Thaddeus Klemarczyk, Michael Dalton, Norton Simes, and Edith Holland. Under the able direction of our chairman, Wesley Thomas, and clerk, Phyllis Hoddeson, the Board was successful in the preparation of, and adoption by, the voters of the following warrant articles:

- 1. Building Code
- 2. Authority for Planning Board review of site plans in non-residential development.
- 3. Criteria for multi-family development in commercial districts by special exception.
- 4. Zoning map changes.

The Planning Board formulated and adopted rules for the conduct of business after two readings of said rules. As long as the presiding officer followed those rules, the meetings were more orderly which permitted accomplishment of our duties as prescribed by the New Hampshire statutes.

During the year 1972, clerk Hoddeson, with the assistance of secretary Alice Sherbak, succeeded in organization of the case files of each development brought before the Board, the minutes of the meetings, agenda notices, and other record and clerical work into an efficient system.

Charles Knibbs was elected chairman in April, and served to the expiration of his term of office in October. Michael Dalton tendered his resignation, to be effective after the town meeting, and the selectmen appointed Joseph Kenick to fill the vacancy. The concern over the increase of the number of trailers on Linden Street resulted in the following report on May 4, 1972. The report of Thaddeus Klemarczyk of the total number of trailers showed an increase of 71 trailers between June, 1971, and April, 1972.

The Board is still very concerned with the fact that the injunction case has not been brought to trial, and continued growth extends in the trailer parks beyond what the voters approved in June, 1971.

The first public forum was held June 15, 1972, on "Exeter's Future Growth and How." Clerk Phyllis Hoddeson had made the suggestion and did a great deal of necessary preparation for the forum. The Board welcomed the recommendations made by the townspeople at this meeting and the Board has considered these recommendations in subsequent actions. At the June 29th meeting all town committees and commissions were represented and written suggestions they made have been incorporated in subsequent decisions of the Board.

During the year, 30 development cases were heard, studied, researched, and acted upon. With the assistance of the Southeastern Regional Planning Commission, the Board concentrated on the review of the Candeub Fleissig zoning report prepared for the town at considerable cost. The Planning Board met with the Board of Selectmen in October, at which time the selectmen requested that the Planning Board prepare a new zoning ordinance and map which would be enforceable by the Board of Selectmen. The selectmen requested that the new ordinance be available for the voters in March, 1973. Under direction of the new acting chairman, Edith Holland, meetings were held several nights a week until the wee hours to accomplish the directive of the Board of Selectmen. The Planning Board hopes the voters will carefully review the proposed zoning ordinance and realize the immediate need of enacting it to protect the town against uncontrolled growth which will result in higher taxes.

Report of Historic District Commission

As we are well aware, this area of New Hampshire is rapidly growing and changing. Exeter, with its "small town appearance" is appealing to many people. Fortunately the town is developing a plan for the needed growth. Historic districts are part of the planning picture.

One of the aims of the Historic District Commission is to "preserve and reflect elements of the community's cultural, social, economic and political history." Therefore, after a group of citizens requested the Commission to consider the Park St. — Cass St. area as a possible second historic district, further study was made.

Mr. Richard Kearns, Assistant for Planning Services and Mr. Roger Holt, Legal Advisor, from the National Trust for Historic Preservation; Mr. William Hoffman, Principal Planner, Office of State Planning, Concord, N.H., and Mr. Charles Tucker, Director, Southeastern Regional Planning Office, were consulted concerning the proposed area. As a result of this study, the following article was posted for the first of two public hearings:

"To see if the Town will vote to establish an Historic District that would include properties fronting on the following streets and back to their rear property line or two hundred (200) feeet whichever is less: both sides of Park Street from and including #77 to the centerline of Water Street; Epping Road from Winter Street to and including #22 Epping Road; Cass Street from Park Street to the centerline of Main Street; Green Street from Cass Street to the centerline of Water Street. The above described area is to include the Park Street Common."

It was brought out at the first public hearing Dec. 18, 1972 that the Selectmen were opposed to the inclusion of the Common area, stating that it had always been their responsibility. Therefore, this area was deleted from the notice for the second public hearing in January. This will now appear as a warrant article at the March town meeting.

Historic District guidelines, prepared by the Southeastern Regional Planning Office were received and gone over in early November, but further action on them was delayed until a full membership had been appointed to the Commission.

The three new members appointed shortly thereafter by the Selectmen were: Theodore Barry, Richard Bergeron, and J. Harris Melia. One member fills the vacany left when Paul Holloway's term expired and the other two bring the commission up to the full complement of seven allowed by law.

This past year the Commission has received two requests for in-wall air conditioners, one fence, a garage, and three signs. All of these requests were granted.

At the Planning Board's request we submitted a statement about the Exeter Historic District Commission to be appended to the Zoning Ordinance.

Historic districts are an important feature in the overall plan for the town's growth. They can afford protection against commercial invasion and "bad" renovations, encourage new designs which are compatible with the present buildings. It has been found in other areas that as an added benefit, people take more pride in their homes and this encourages maintenance and improved community appearance and spirit.

Report of the Housing Authority

The Housing Authority of the Town of Exeter (since 1969) is continuing to provide Low Rent Housing for our Senior Citizens and presently has under lease our allotted 100 units of privately owned apartments in Exeter.

We find as always there is a growing need for additional units and we have submitted a program reservation to the HUD Area Office requesting these additional units. We are hopeful that this request will be granted. If it is, HUD will probably require that we include units for low and middle income families as well as elderly. With this possibility in mind, we are including in this year's Town Warrant a request for permission to subsidize low and middle income families as well as elderly and hope that with the approval of the voters we can either lease new construction or construct our own. Such a vote is required before additional units for elderly can be approved by HUD. The property for which the local Housing Authority subsidizes rents pays the Town approximately \$41,000.00 in taxes annually.

We urge all persons now eligible or those who will be in the future to request and complete an application which is available and can be obtained at the Housing Authority Office, 11 Pleasant Street, or telephone 778-8110. We also suggest that any landlords interested in leasing apartments to this authority please contact our office.

We are happy to assist the Town in any way we can.
