SELECTMEN'S REPORT

To the Citizens and Taxpayers of Gilford:

We present herewith the annual reports of the Selectmen and the Treasurer, the Town Clerk, Collector of Taxes, Trustees of Trust Funds, also the reports of other Town Officers and Committees, and the annual report of the School Board for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1931.

Our recommendations for the ensuing year are the result of careful consideration of both present and future needs of our Town.

During the year just closed, it seemed necessary to purchase new Snow Removal Equipment, as authorized at the last Town Meeting. After careful investigation we purchased Equipment that, in our estimation was the most efficient and economical of any brought to our attention.

The new bridge on the Weirs Road has been completed, and it seems to us that it is advisable to continue construction on that Road as fast as possible, and to take advantage of new legislation giving us a larger proportion of help from the State.

I herewith submit my annual report as superintendent of schools. This is the twelfth such report which I have had the pleasure of submitting to you.

Attendance :

In general the daily attendance of pupils during last year continued to be good although there was a drop of one point in the per cent. of attendance over that of the previous year. However, the only pupil who maintained a perfect record for the entire year was Bertha Burbank of the Lily Pond school. She deserves special commendation.

In the matter of tardinesses the record is poor. There seems to be no justification for this considerable increase. One school seems to be largely responsible. Closing Exercises:

The well established custom of all the schools uniting in closing exercises at the end of the school year is one which brings pleasure and profit to the children, as well as to parents and friends. A program well arranged and prepared was presented by the schools on the evening of June 20 last. Certificates of attainment were awarded by the school board to the three pupils completing the work of the eighth grade. The members of the class of 1930 were as follows:

There is satisfaction in being able to report that all three of these pupils entered Laconia High School in September.

Teachers:

Two of our teachers resigned in June, Miss Mary Coffey, who had been with us two years, and Miss Helene Martin, who had been with us three years. Miss Coffey left us to take up other work which she had long in mind, and Miss Martin to establish a home. We wish them both success and happiness. The vacancy at the Village school was filled by the appointment of Miss Anna Furey, whose home is in Lowell, and who is a graduate of the Lowell Normal school. Miss Esma Ford of Laconia, a graduate of the Keene Normal school, was appointed to fill the vacancy at the Lily Pond school. Three of our present corps of teachers have each had three years of Normal school training. This is somewhat unusual.

Gilford Children in Laconia Schools:

As shown above our total enrollment at the present time in the local schools is but 53. Gilford children enrolled in the elementary grades in Laconia number 61, 45 in grades one to six and 16 in grades seven and eight. While the cost for the tuition of these children has reached a considerable amount—as indicated in the expenditures—there seems to be no question but that the present arrangement is the most satisfactory that can be made.

In addition to the children enrolled in the grades at Laconia there are 27 Gilford boys and girls enrolled in the Laconia High school.

Lily Pond:

The crowded conditions at the Lily Pond school caused considerable concern a year ago. To relieve this situation the school board assigned the children living west of the railroad crossing to the Lakeport schools, the school board, of course, assuming the tuition obligation. Transportation was necessary in only one case, and this involved only a small expenditure. The enrollment at this school now is not unreasonably large. It might be possible to accommodate a few additional pupils if the heating arrangements were improved.

Sale of Buildings:

The school meeting last year instructed the school board to dispose of such of the unused school buildings as seemed advisable as opportunity presented. The school board has already sold the Watson and Wilkinson buildings, for \$150 and \$200 respectively. Neither of these buildings have been used by the school district for several years and there seemed little likelihood of their ever again being needed. This money may very well be used for the improvement of school buildings now in use.

Improvements Needed :

Toilets at the Lily Pond school ought to be replaced. The condition of those now in use is not satisfactory. A jacketed stove should replace the one now in use in this school room. The approach from the road to the school yard could be much improved with little expense.

The Village school room would be much improved if refitted with window shades such as we now have at Lily Pond and the Intervale.

Additional black-board space could be used to advantage at the Intervale school.

The No. Nine school is poorly lighted. A cloudy day is a trial to both teacher and pupil. Light could be easily installed and would prove very serviceable on many days, especially during the late fall and winter months.

East Gilford:

We now have five children of school age in the East Gilford community. These children are transported to the Intervale school. It is probable the number will be increased another year, this may raise the question of the reopening of the East Gilford school.

School Nurse:

In my last report I called attention to the good work accomplished in many school districts by the school nurse and recommended that some arrangement might well be made so that we could have the part-time services of such a nurse in the Gilford schools. It has been our custom in recent years to have the annual medical examination of the school children made by a physician. A nurse might very well make this inspection as is done in Laconia, and she would be available to do the follow-up work which is of great importance. I wish to renew the recommendation.

Finances:

The following table makes possible a comparison of the budget of this current fiscal year with that proposed for next year.

It is to be noted that an increase of \$300 appears in the budget for next year for elementary school tuition. The reason for this is obvious. In other respects the budget proposed for next year is practically the same as this year's budget. The total amount recommended to be appropriated is only \$37.00 in excess of last year's appropriation. There is sufficient school money available to complete the school year which ends in June, and it is probable that there will be a substantial working balance left in the treasury at that time.

Again I wish to thank all who have helped to make this school year a profitable one.
