## **TOWN WARRANT**

### **The State of New Hampshire**

---

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Gilford in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Gilford Grade School in said Gilford on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, 1965, at 8 of the clock in the forenoon (Polls to be open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. at least) to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year, including charges for Town Officers' Salaries, Administrative Expense, Election and Registration, Property Mapping, Repair and Maintenance of Town Buildings, Social Security and Retirement payments, Insurance, Dog Damage, Legal Expense, Health Officer and expense, Town Dump, Street Lighting, Water Works, Interest on Temporary Loans, Land Purchase Costs, Bond and Note Payments and Interest, Tax Appraisal Work for 1964.

Article 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purposes of the Police Department.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for White Pine Blister Rust control.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purposes of Dutch Elm Disease control.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purposes of the Planning Board.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.

Article 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purposes of the Laconia Hospital.

Article 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operation of the Highway Department.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Aid for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways.

Article 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the aid of the Town Poor and for Old Age Assistance.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the decoration of graves of soldiers and sailors.

Article 15. To see what action the Town will take on Old Home Day and to raise and appropriate funds for the same.

Article 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Parks, Playgrounds and Beaches.

Article 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair and maintenance of the Glendale Wharves and Parking Area.

Article 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

Article 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of snow removal equipment.

Article 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a truck for the use of the Highway Department.

Article 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of surplus equipment.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to have the State Tax Commission continue to keep the list of equalized valuations up to date.

Article 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for further use in the construction of sewer lines in the Lake Street section.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell and transfer tax liens upon all real

estate acquired by the Town at any tax sale, and title to all real estate taken by the Town in default of redemption from any tax sale, to such persons and upon such conditions as they shall see fit.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money on the credit of the Town in Anticipation of Taxes.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the prepayment of taxes and authorize the Collector of Taxes to accept payments in prepayment of taxes.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to require a permit from the Selectmen before a driveway leading into a public way may be constructed or paved. Such permit to be granted only upon approval of Road Agent with respect to location, drainage and grade.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to require a permit from the Selectmen before a lawn may be constructed, graded or seeded within the limits of a public way.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the establishment of a Recreation Commission to be appointed by the Board of Selectmen consisting of five citizens of the Town who shall serve without pay. In the first instance two persons to be appointed for three years, two for two years and one for one year, their successors to be appointed for three years. Vacancies as they occur to be filled for the unexpired term only.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the establishment of a Conservation Commission to be appointed by the Board of Selectmen consisting of five citizens of the Town who shall serve without pay. In the first instance two persons to be appointed for three years, two for two years and one for one year, their suc-

cessors to be appointed for three years. Vacancies as they occur to be filled for the unexpired term only.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote that at the 1966 Town Meeting, it will elect a Board of Auditors as follows: One Auditor for a term of office of one year, one Auditor for a term of office of two years and one Auditor for a term of office of three years and thereafter one Auditor to be elected each year for a three year term.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase approximately 21 acres of land located in Gilford Village westerly of the Belknap Mountain Road from Charles Farmer for a sum not to exceed \$17,500.00 to be used as a park and playground and to appropriate the sum of \$17,500.00 for such purpose to be raised as follows: \$1,750.00 by current taxes and the balance by the issuance of nine serial notes payable annually over a period of nine years upon the credit of the Town, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes shall be issued including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest. (Adoption of this article requires a  $\frac{2}{3}$  vote.)

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to enact the following ordinance:

#### **An Ordinance Relative to Restraining of Dogs**

Be it enacted, that no dog or dogs shall be allowed to run loose off the premises or leasehold of its or their owner, owners, keeper or keepers during daylight hours.

For each offense said owner, owners, keeper or keepers shall be fined not more than \$10.00.

This ordinance shall take effect on April 1, 1965.

Article 34. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

In accordance with a resolution adopted at the 1957 Town Meeting a motion will be presented to adjourn to the Gilford Grade School in said Gilford on Wednesday, the 10th day of March, 1965 at 7:30 o'clock in the evening to take up articles 2 through 34.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

---

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men of this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy — both industrial and recreational — is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area — 4,350,000 acres — is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

## GILFORD FIRE DEPARTMENT

1964

---

During the year 1964 your Fire Department responded to a total of 87 alarms, of which 20 were in structures, 34 were grass and woods, 2 chimneys, 2 automobiles, 1 flooded oil burner, 4 Mutual Aid calls and 21 miscellaneous fires. Also the Mutual Aid Association came to our assistance 3 times during the year.

We had 15 less fires in 1964 as compared with 1963. In this respect your Fire Department would like to compliment the residents, summer residents and tourists, as you are the ones that have made this reduction possible. We would also like to call special attention to the fine fire record of our Island residents. In the past 10 years there have only been 2 fires on our 22 Islands and everyone in Gilford should be proud of such a record.

The Fire Department encourages it's permanent and volunteer members to participate in Fire Training courses throughout the year and the response has been most gratifying. Ten Firemen attended the Lily Pond Fire School and 3 Firemen served as Instructors for the school. Ten Firemen attended a 16 hour course on the Air Pack and Mask, which was given at the Gilford Station by a State paid Instructor. Five Firemen attended a Fire School held at Grenier Air Force Base. In addition to time the men have devoted to improving themselves as firemen they have also given 500 hours of their time, during the year, in extinguishing fires on our 87 alarms.

The Ford Tank Truck that was replaced this year has been turned over to our Highway Department and is being used to flush culverts and wet down roads during road construction.



During the widening of the bridge into the Village, we were able to install an additional Dry-Hydrant. We now have a total of 7 such Hydrants and these facilities greatly reduce the time involved in picking up and relaying water to our fires. We plan to continue our program of strategically locating hydrants where it is economically feasible to do so. Due to the installation of agitators at the Gilford Marina and Fay's Boat Yard we now have open water available throughout the winter.

We have installed electric reels on the Booster line on our Glendale Truck and have added miscellaneous items to our new 1000 gallon Tanker.

Mr. Merrill Fay has placed a "Snow-Cat" and toboggan at our disposal for use in case of an Island fire during the winter. We wish to thank Mr. Fay for this most generous offer.

Through the courtesy of Mr. Fred Shurbert, 70 first graders from the Gilford School, were brought to the Fire Station. We instructed them in fire protection and the use of the fire telephone in case of fire. We have also conducted Fire Drills at the Gilford School and had "Smokey The Bear" talk to the school children on Fire Protection.

This is your Fire Department and we encourage your visiting the station at any time.

## REPORT OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

For the Year Ending Dec. 31, 1964

---

I hereby submit my report for the year ending December 31, 1964.

As you well know, the building in Gilford has continued at a very fast pace and this is evidenced by the fact that, according to the "New Hampshire Register", the population was 996 in 1940, 1,251 in 1950, 2,043 in 1960, and approximately 3,000 at the end of 1964. There is every indication that it will continue to grow at an even faster rate with the advent of new industries and the new shopping center which has already commenced. Another factor which will have much bearing on future growth is the improvement of our present highway system, and the addition of the new Laconia By-Pass. We must also consider the rapid development of the Belknap Area recreational facilities and its new neighbor, the private area which is scheduled to be built early in 1965.

Let us consider the population increase in relation to our permanent force. The minimum requirement, according to the F.B.I., is one permanent full time officer per 1,000 population. At the present we have two (2) permanent full time men for 3,000 people. (Laconia has 28 permanent full time officers for 16,000 people) During the summer months our population is increased by 10,000 and during the winter on a good ski weekend it is not unusual to have 7,500 in a single day at the Area.

Robert Hutchinson came to work on a full time basis in the latter part of January after having served one and one half years as a special officer. Robert has taken a very active interest in the department and has certainly done a highly commendable job.

In the middle of the month of September we started moving into our new quarters at the Town Hall. We now have ample room for our records and communications division. The base station was moved from Liberty Hill to the new headquarters in the Town Hall. The radio and telephone calls are taken care of from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m. Monday through Friday and from 9 a. m. to noon on Saturday, by Mrs. Janet Moore, Mrs. Marian Landry and Miss Laurel Lawrence. During the second week in October we were most fortunate in obtaining the invaluable services of Jack and Jean Sims to cover our communications nights, weekends and holidays. We were also most fortunate in obtaining the use of the Department of Safety, Division of Safety Services radio base station, which is located at the Sims residence and which is also on the same frequency as our station. In addition to this, there are police phones and monitor radios located at the Chief's home and Officer Hutchinson's home. This makes our communications setup second to none.

During the course of the year 193 various complaints were answered which were made up of breaking and entering, larceny, vandalism, and animal complaints. Assistance was rendered to individuals 199 times and to other departments 76 times. 157 bank escorts were made and seven over-width trailers escorted. The cruiser man secured 427 doors in places of business on routine patrol and made 17 emergency trips to the Laconia Hospital. Assistance was rendered to the Fire Department 25 times. Percentage wise comparing to last year, the work load of the Police Department has increased about 70% making it necessary to work more hours, giving up days off and taking shorter vacations. Over the last year the Chief averaged 61 hours per week and the second averaged 57 hours per week. This is strictly cruiser duty, and does not include time spent on investigations, office work, and lunch breaks. In July an intensive investigation was started which is still under

investigation. We captured 3 subjects wanted for armed robbery by Vermont State Police. This added another 30 extra off duty hours.

Your permanent men have just completed a 16 week course in Police School at St. Anselm's College in Manchester and have already started another 16 week program to better equip themselves in the highly technical field of police work. These schools are very beneficial to the town as well as the Police Department so that we may better serve you. These classes are attended on our only off duty night.
