TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hinsdale qualified to vote on Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, on Tuesday the 8th day of March, 1949 at nine o'clock in the forenoon, polls not to close before 7 p. m., to act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To elect all necessary town officers.
- Article 2. To see if the town will vote to accept and adopt the report of the Selectmen, auditors and other town officers.
- Article 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of ordinary town charges, for the maintenance of the fire department, for highways, for schools and for all other necessary expenses arising within the town.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$434.82 to which the State will contribute \$1,739.29 to be expended on Class 5 roads.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to which will be added Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to paint the Community Room and woodwork on the outside of the Town Hall, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to widen and resurface River street from the residence of Glen Higgins to the underpass or act in any manner thereon.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500.00 for the purchase of a rubber tired tractor for the general use of the highway department or act in any manner thereon.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to widen High street near the site of the former hotel barn or act in any manner thereon.

Article 11. To see if the town will pass an ordinance for the elimination of the soot nuisance from the Industrial Plants in town, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 12. To see if the town will pass an ordinance requiring industrial users trucking waste paper from the depot or any siding, same to be trucked in covered vans with the back flap down and securely tied, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Hinsdale is fortunate, in maintaining a low rate of violations of the statutes, and the fact that our Juvenile Court is practically non existant proves that our young people surely deserve high praise.

The annual physical examination of school children was started soon after school reopened in the fall by Dr. Edmond Lachaine, school physician, assisted by the school nurse. It was found that many children are in need of dental work. The new individual audiometer was used to test the hearing of 231 children.

During the fall, a triple toxoid clinic was conducted and 117 children received immunization.

There have been very few cases of communicable diseases and no home deliveries this past year. Otherwise, the nursing service has been fairly busy.

I attended a State Nurse's meeting in Manchester, N. H. on March 10th and a School Nurses Meeting in Concord, N. H. on October 22nd.

I wish to thank the members of the Nursing Committee, physicians, teachers, and townspeople who have cooperated with me in carrying out the work of the nursing service.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the School District in the town of Hinsdale qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the eighth day of March, 1949, at 7:30 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 6. To choose Agents, Auditors, Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 7. To see if the District will vote to make any alterations in the report of the School Board recommending the amount of money required for the support of schools and payment of statutory obligations.
- S. To see if the district will elect to approve of the inclusion of its officers and employees (other than those eligible under the Teachers' Retirement System) in the Employees' Retirement System of the State of New Hampshire, which system is provided for by Chapter 27-A of the Revised Laws, as inserted by Chapter 183 of the Laws of 1945, and as provided by Chapter 201 of the Laws of 1945 and any subsequent amendments thereto.
- 9. If the district votes in the affirmative on the preceding articles, to see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty-seven dollars (\$47.00) for the purpose of providing funds for the district's contribution to said retirement system for the coming year.

- 10. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$175,000 for the purpose of erecting on that part of the playground lot conveyed to the district by the town for that purpose, an elementary school building and to equip and furnish the same; and in order to provide such funds to authorize the school board to issue and sell notes or bonds in the name of and on the credit of the district under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bond statute and any amendments relating thereto; and to delegate to the school board authority to fix the time and place of payment of the principal and interest of said notes and bonds, the interest thereon, and the principal amount of each note or bond, and to sell the notes or bonds, and to take such other action with respect thereto as may be necessary or advisable.
- 11. If the preceding article is adopted, to see if the district will continue the present committee as a building committee for the new elementary school and to authorize the school board, acting upon the advice of the building committee, to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary, proper and advisable in connection with the erection of the elementary school building to be erected on that part of the playground lot conveyed to the district by the town for that purpose and for the purchase of equipment and furnishings for the same, or to take any action thereon.
- 12. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate funds to the limit allowed by state law to be held in reserve for the construction of a new school building.
- 13. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the Federal Works Agency, or other U. S. Government or State Agencies.
- 14. To see if the school district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-five hundred dollars (\$3,500) for the purpose of furnishing and housing a kindergarten, buying supplies and hiring a teacher.

15. To see if the school district will vote to adopt the non-partisan ballot system for the election of school district officers as provided for under Chapter 22, Laws of 1943 and amendments thereto.

REPORT OF THE HEADMASTER OF THE HIGH SCHOOL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my second annual report as headmaster of the High School.

The student council was introduced in our school this year for the first time. The purpose of this organization is to enable the student body to cooperate with school authorities in all school activities, to develop qualities of good citizenship among the students, and to promote in all ways the best interest of the school. Mrs. Stearns is the faculty advisor on the council.

The Pep Club is also a new organization. Its function is to provide student services and assistance to various school activities. One project being undertaken at this time is a collection of games and puzzles for use during the noon recess by bus people.

The usual junior and senior dances were held in the fall. The music organizations presented the Spring and Christmas concerts. The band attended the State and New England Music Festivals. Members of our band and glee clubs motored to Berlin, New Hampshire, to participate in the all-state band and chorus.

The Band Sponsors Club was newly formed last fall. A very energetic group, consisting mainly of parents of band students, is in the process of earning approximately three hundred and seventy-five dollars to purchase matching trousers for the present uniforms. Over two hundred and twenty-five dollars has been already realized.

Our sports calender was augmented by the addition of basketball for boys and girls in our high school this year. Donations from interested members of our community purchased basketballs and warm-up jackets for the teams. Approximately thirty-three members of the high school are participating in the sport. This gives our school a year-round sports calender. A new basketball league called the King Phillip Hoop League was started in our school which includes both boys and girls teams. Wherever the League games are played

on Friday nights, a dancing social follows the game. Refreshments are available at the social and each school entertains the visiting team. The basketball schedule included games with Walpole, Charlestown, Leland and Gray, Bernardston, Northfield, and New Salem.

Our teams fared well in the Border League. Sports in which boys and girls participated were baseball, softball, volleyball, and touch football. This was the first season to have hired referees and umpires officiating at our football games, and the results were very satisfactory.

The class of 1948 made a most enjoyable trip to New York City and Washington, D. C. The trip lasted six days.

The physical examinations of our pupils were made by Dr. Edmond Lachaine and Miss Bertha Currier, R. N.

Our school buildings are effectively maintained by the school custodian, Mr. William Kilhart.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Hinsdale:

I have the honor to submit my second annual report.

Teachers: There were three changes in our high school faculty at the opening of school in September. Miss Jane Durkan was elected to the Mathematic and Science position vacated by the resignation of Mr. Anthony A. Abruzzese. Miss Durkan is a graduate of the College of Our Lady of the Elms. Miss Mary Louise Smith, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, was elected to the Home Economics position replacing Miss J. Jeannette Steele who resigned to be married. Mr. Arthur Scott, a graduate of Keene Teachers' College, is the new Industrial Arts teacher taking the place of Mr. Angelo V. Montrone who is now teaching in Keene.

Buildings and Grounds: The high school building has been completely insulated. This makes the building much more comfortable and less drafty than formerly was the case.

The boiler rooms in both schools have been fireproofed according to recommendations made by the State Board of Health. We have already been commended for this by Mr. John S. C. Peck, Jr., State Health Inspector.

The chimney at the Bridge Street School was found to be so defective that it was necessary to insert a temporary metal stack to insure proper draft. This measure is merely an expedient to obviate the necessity of entirely rebuilding the brick chimney, since there is a possibility that a new grade school building will be built in the near future.

The usual summer repairs and painting in both schools were done during the summer vacation by Mr. William Kilhart.

Instructional Activities: The teachers of Hinsdale attended a Workshop in Education held in Keene during the week of January 3-7. The elementary school teachers met at Keene Teachers College. Their work was done in the Social Studies field under the guidance of Dr. Gertrude M. Lewis of the State Department of Education. The high school teachers

met at Keene High School and worked on problems concerning Life Adjustment Education for American Youth. A great deal of value was derived from the workshops which should make itself apparent in the months ahead.

Four teachers of the Bridge Street School staff took a course during the summer at Greenfield in Principles and Techniques in Elementary Education. That these teachers were willing to take the time to do the work in connection with this course is highly commendable.

The fundamentals are being stressed again this year as they were last year. Standard tests in Arithmetic Reasoning, Arithmetic Computation and in Spelling have been given to all elementary school pupils in Union No. 25, comprising the towns of Hinsdale, Winchester, Swanzey and Richmond. It is our humble opinion that reading, writing and arithmetic are still important tools of learning and should be treated accordingly.

Enrollment Trends: Enrollments in the elementary grades are increasing by leaps and bounds all over the country. This is being reflected in our own state and in particular in our town. In accordance with modern educational standards, the Bridge Street School is badly overcrowded. What was originally built as a four-room building is now housing approximately 200 pupils. In the next few years, the enrollment will be in excess of 200 in the grades housed in the Bridge Street School. Three rooms in this building are entirely inadequate to handle the large classes which are facing us.

Thoughtful citizens of Hinsdale will not wish this condition to continue. They will be given an opportunity to remedy the situation at the annual school district meeting when the question of building a new elementary school will be considered. It is to be hoped that the welfare of our boys and girls will be given paramount attention.

Miscellaneous: A new Bioscope was purchased for Hinsdale High School. This enables slides to be projected on the wall of a room thereby making it possible for a whole class to see the enlargement at once. With the ordinary microscope, only one pupil at a time can see the magnified image. It is

much easier for the instructor to point out in the image just what he wishes the class to look for.

As recommended in last year's report, the combined school boards of Union No. 25 voted to purchase an audiometer for the four towns. A pure-tone Maica Audiometer was bought and has been used to great advantage. With this machine, our pupils can now be tested scientifically for hearing deficiencies. The slow learning rates of some pupils have been traced to hearing losses. When the defects are corrected and seating adjustments for such pupils are made in the classroom, an improvement in the rate of learning is usually the result.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils and parents, to the School Board and to the patrons of our schools for their cooperation.







REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damage and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With the continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90% of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these man-caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help, as follows:

- (1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground it not covered with snow.
- (2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In automobiles, always use the ash trays.
- (3) Report fires and smokes to the warden without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.
