TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the
County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified
to vote in Town Affairs:**

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry Department or take any action relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80.00 for the Monadnock Region Association or take any action relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will vote to provide supervision at the bathing beach during the summer months, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any other action relating thereto.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum of money for Workmen's Compensation and Public Liability Insurance or take any action relating thereto.
7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Week or take any action relating thereto.
8. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 1% on property taxes paid on or before August 1 or take any action relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$607.54 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute \$2,430.15, or take any action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts or legacies left in trust for the use of the Town or take any action relating thereto.

12. To hear reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen or take any action relating thereto.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMITTEE

The total revenue for the year was \$5,803.14.

The only new service added during the year was at Miss Margaret Perry's farm.

The cost of maintaining the system was very small until the severe ice storm which came early in the winter. There is still a considerable amount of work to be done to put the lines in good condition, especially around Lake Nubanusit. It will also be necessary to do some trimming next summer because of the effects of the storm.

The pole replacement program for which an appropriation was made at the last town meeting has made little progress. The New England Tel. & Tel. Co. did not receive authority from the War Production Board to proceed with their part of the work until late in the fall and only a small number of poles was replaced before it became necessary for the line crews to leave and repair damage caused by the ice storm. We hope to complete this project next spring.

I submit my ninth annual report, the statistical summary of the Hancock schools for 1941-1942, and the report of the school nurse, Miss Margaret E. Harris.

The enrollment for the fall term of the present school year was 115. For the same period last year it was 118.

Since the opening of school several pupils have left as their families have moved from town.

Mr. Horace S. Schnare, who was starting his second year as principal of the Center School was called into the service of the United States and resigned his position the last of October. We were fortunate in securing as his successor Mrs. Jessie B. Black of Antrim who has had long experience in the schools in this section.

Mrs. Gladys Phillips, teacher of grades three and four, resigned her position at the time of the Christmas vacation and Mrs. Anna G. Homan, a graduate of Salem, Massachusetts, Teachers' College, who had long experience in both public and private school work, cheerfully accepted the call to take over the work in grades three and four.

Miss Nellie Welsh, teacher of the primary grades has continued her very efficient work in grades one and two.

In the Junior and Senior High School, Miss Manchester has practically the same number of students as last year and work in this school has gone on very successfully. The cadet teachers from Keene Teachers' College have done very efficient work during the periods for which they have served in the Hancock schools.

Mrs. Mildred Whitcomb of Keene, who was chosen for Music Supervisor last year, has continued her excellent work in our schools.

Several years ago the large number of pupils in the lower grades made it necessary for us to have an extra teacher in the Center School so that for during this period each teacher

has had two grades. The small enrollment in the present first grade with the probable small enrollment of those to enter next September together with the large sixth grade going over to the Junior High will probably make it advisable to reduce the number of teachers for the next school year so that each of two teachers will have three grades.

I desire to express my appreciation for the support given me by the School Board and citizens of Hancock during the past year.
