## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hinsdale qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall on Tuesday the 12th of March, 1968 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To cast your ballots for all necessary Town officers.

Article 2. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the revised laws relative to playing games of beano shall be adopted in this town.

Polls open on the above articles at 10 A.M. and shall not be closed earlier than 7:15 P.M.

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Action to be taken on the following articles beginning at 7:30 P.M.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept and adopt the report of the Selectmen, Auditors and other Town Officers.

Article 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of ordinary town charges for the maintenance of the fire department, highways, and for all other necessary expenses arising with the Town. (See Budget)

Article 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not to exceed in the aggregate \$100,000.00 in anticipation of collection of taxes for the current municipal year and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes



to be repaid during the current municipal year from taxes collected within the current municipal year.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$623.91 to which the State will contribute \$4,159.43 to be expended on Class IV and Class V road construction.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to install and maintain one (1) street light between Brattleboro Road and the Worden residence at Hinsdale Heights; also, a sign reading "Hinsdale Heights" at the intersection of Brattleboro Road at Hinsdale Heights, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by petition)

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to file in behalf of the inhabitants of the Town, an application in form and manner required by the United States Government, and in conformity with P.L. 560, 83rd Congress as amended and do whatever else may be required to obtain an advance, in the amount of \$23,000, to be made by the United States to the Town of Hinsdale to aid in defraying the cost of preliminary plans for the construction of sewage and waste collection and treatment facilities, and, further, to see if the Town will make the necessary arrangements to provide such additional funds as may be required to defray the cost of preliminary plans, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Water Pollution Board)

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 3% discount for the first 30 days after tax bill is mailed and a subsequent 2% discount for the next 30 days on payment of taxes, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to confirm and authorize the authority of the Selectmen to sell any property which the Town has acquired through tax sale and by tax collector's deed to the Town, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 11. To see if the Town is interested in using the land in Jackwood Park which starts about 25 feet beyond the flagpole and runs to the retaining wall at the Fire Station parking lot, for a municipal parking lot, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 12. In the event Article 11 passes, to see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for preparing and blacktopping it, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 13. To see if the Town is interested in the purchasing of the Loring Williams property off Main Street, this to be used as a Municipal parking lot, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 14. In the event Article 13 passes, to see if the Town will raise and appropriate a total of \$9,000.00 for this, (\$4,000.00 to be used to purchase the property and \$5,000.00 for blacktopping) or act in any manner thereon.

Article 15. To see if the Town is interested in the purchasing of the former Gould House east of the Field's Block now owned by Allen, to be used as a Municipal parking lot, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 16. In the event Article 15 passes, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$20,000.00 (\$15,000 to purchase the property and \$5,000.00 for demolition and blacktopping) and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow Twenty-Thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) on the credit of the Town and to issue and sell notes or bonds in the name of and on the credit of the Town under and in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act of the State of New Hampshire and any amendments relating thereto, and to authorize the Selectmen to fix the time and place of payment of said Principal of said notes and bonds and interest thereon, and the principal amount of each note or bond and to sell said notes or bonds and to take action with respect thereto as may be necessary or advisable.

Article 17. To see if the Town is interested in the purchasing of the Clarence O'Neal property which abutts Jackwood Park for \$10,500.00, to be used as a Municipal parking lot, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 18. In the event Article 17 passes, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$20,500.00 (\$10,500.00 to purchase the property and \$10,000.00 for demolition and blacktopping costs) and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow Twenty Thousand Five-Hundred dollars

(\$20,500.00) on the credit of the Town and to issue and sell notes or bonds in the name of and on the credit of the Town under and in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act of the State of New Hampshire and any amendments relating thereto, and to authorize the Selectmen to fix the time and place of payment of said Principal of said notes and bonds and interest thereon, and the principal amount of each note or bond and to sell said notes or bonds and to take action with respect thereto as may be necessary or advisable, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,600.00 with which to purchase an automobile for the Hinsdale Nursing Association, to be used by the Public Health nurse, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 20. To see if the Town is interested, and will vote to have a board of three listers, same to be voted from the floor; these to be appointed for a three-year, two-year and a one-year term in office, respectively, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 21. In the event that Article 20 passes, to vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1,000.00 for use of these listers in the way of compensation and incidental expenses, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to have the State Board of Assessors reappraise the properties in the Town at a cost not to exceed \$12,000 and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow Twelve-Thousand (\$12,000.00) on the credit of the Town and to issue and sell notes or bonds in the name of and on the credit of the Town under and in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act of the State of New Hampshire and any amendments relating thereto, and to authorize the Selectmen to fix the time and place of payment of said Principal of said notes and bonds and interest thereon, and the principal amount of each note or bond and to sell said notes or bonds and to take action with respect thereto as may be necessary or advisable.

Article 23. To see if the Town will consider a TRA accelerated program and vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$12,000.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the follow-

ing Class V roads within the Town; north end of Prospect Street from the residence of Paul Aust to the intersection of Route 119, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Hinsdale, New Hampshire, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Town Ordinance; that no trailer shall be placed and kept in the Town of Hinsdale without a permit from the Selectmen and such trailer shall be placed on a lot of a minimum size of fifty feet by one-hundred feet; this ordinance to take effect immediately upon passage, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Gentlemen :

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Hinsdale for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

**SCOPE OF AUDIT**

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water and Sewer Departments, Library, Trustees of Trust Funds, Municipal Court, Cemetery Lot Fund and Hinsdale Playground Committee.

**FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

**Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1966 and December 31, 1967:**

(Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1966 and December 31, 1967, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt increased by \$9,379.64 in 1967.

As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$2,376.02, plus a revenue surplus of \$9,163.43, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$11,539.45.

**Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures:**

(Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1967, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

**Water Department:**

(Exhibits E-1, E-2 & E-3)

Statements showing the financial condition of the Water Department as of December 31, 1967, and the results of its operations for the fiscal year then ended, are presented in Exhibits E-1, E-2 and E-3. As indicated in Exhibit E-3, the Water Department operations resulted in a net loss of \$3,121.24 for the year.

**Statement of Long Term Indebtedness:**

(Exhibit L)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1967, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit L.

**AUDIT PROCEDURE**

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of records. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified.

Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements submitted by depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

### GENERAL COMMENTS

#### Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$1,120.36, from \$33,551.69 to \$34,672.05 in 1967 as shown herewith:

#### Municipal Court:

Attention is again called to the provisions of Chapter 331, Section 502-A :9 of the Laws of 1963, relative to the disposition of fines paid into the Municipal Court, which provides as follows:

“502-A :9 Payments. Payments to cities and towns shall be made monthly, on or before the fifth day of each month, and shall cover the net receipts as aforesaid of said court for the month preceding, with a detailed statement of the amount, date, and from whom all money has been received.”

It is again noted that the requirements of this law are not being complied with.

Furthermore, the records of receipts and expenditures maintained by the Court are not adequate. We were, therefore, unable to satisfactorily reconcile the financial transactions of the court for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967.

It is recommended that all receipts except small claims be recorded in the Docket Book as well as all expenditures in the columns provided.



**Water Department:**

As indicated in Exhibit E-1, the Water Department records reflect an accumulated deficit of \$119,720.44. as of December 31, 1967. The stated deficit, resulting from losses on operations incurred over a number of years, does not include interest expense requirements on the long term debt of the Water Works. Under present procedures, these charges are appropriated and expended through the Town general funds.

Total operating losses of \$35,469.21, exclusive of interest charges, have been incurred for the fiscal years ended December 31, 1960 through December 31, 1967 as detailed below:

The above statistics indicate, quite clearly, that the revenues of the department are insufficient to meet operating expenses.

It is noted that the cash journal previously maintained to record incoming cash was not kept during 1967. Also, the use of individual accounts receivable cards was likewise discontinued.

Our examination further revealed that capital expenditures paid through the Town general funds over a period of several years, amounting to \$62,989.34, had not been entered on the records of the water department.

As a result of the above findings, and in order that the functions of the water department be self-sustaining, we recommend that a complete review of the department's operations be initiated by the water commissioners. Furthermore, in order that the results of operations may be more readily evaluated, it is suggested that the debt service requirements of the Water Works be paid by departmental funds. In lieu of debt and interest payments now expended directly by the Town, some

equitable charge could then be assessed against the Town for hydrant rentals and other municipal water usage. A study of cash receipts and water rent billing procedures should be made in order that the most reliable and economical methods are used.

**Conclusion:**

The provisions of Chapter 184, of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Hinsdale for their assistance during the course of the audit.

## PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING ASSOCIATION

---

The following is a report of the activities of the service from January 1, 1967 to December 31, 1967.

Home care visits — 470

School Pupils attended — 679

During the year physical examinations were done by Dr. John Houppis, school physician, on 367 pupils.

In December the School District purchased a new, up-to-date vision testing machine. Testing has been done on 440 pupils, with home referrals as needed. Winchester schools will be sharing this machine.

The hearing testing machine previously used in the school had been proven inaccurate and too old to repair. The Winchester School District has recently purchased a new hearing testing machine which will be shared with Hinsdale. This enables both towns to have new equipment for proper testing of vision and hearing.

In February the nurse attended a meeting at Monadnock Special Service Center in Keene, to become acquainted with the service offered there.

In May, skin testing for tuberculosis was offered to pupils in the first, second and third grades. This is done through the Communicable Disease Control Program in Concord. Out of the 185 pupils in the group, tests were done on 158 pupils, and also nine adults. The positive skin reactors were x-rayed in West Swanzey and these proved negative.

In the spring, immunization clinics were held at the school for pre-school and school children. These were for diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, polio, and small pox, with these totals: March, 229; April, 159; May, 173. Vaccines were supplied by the State Public Health Department, Dr. Houppis was in attendance,

assisted by a State Public Health Nurse, the local nurse, and small group of Peace Corps Trainees.

In October the nurse attended a School Nurses meeting in Manchester and a Medical meeting in Concord.

In December, a Dental Hygienist from the Dental Health Program in Concord spent two days with the children at the Elementary school, showing films and speaking on mouth care.

The Nursing Association has held several meetings, some in conjunction with Medicare.

I wish to thank those who have helped in carrying out the work of the service.

#### REPORT OF PARKING COMMITTEE

Board of Selectmen  
Town of Hinsdale, N.H.  
Attn. Mark Chamberlain  
Sirs:

The undersigned committee having been appointed to investigate the feasibility of obtaining a parking area for cars in order to eliminate the congestion and danger of accidents that now exists at the intersection of Routes 119, 63 and Depot St., do hereby submit the following:

A — It was estimated that a parking lot of a size to adequately park at least 24 vehicles should be the minimum.

B — Since the congestion is greatest at the above mentioned intersection, a parking area too far west of Valley Food Store would not be practical.

C — The closest area available is the Gould house owned by Allen east of Field's Block which can be purchased for \$15,000.00. The cost of demolition and black topping would cost about \$5,000.00, making a total cost of approximately \$20,000.00.

D — Next was Loring Williams property. It is off the Main Street and not quite as accessible as the other properties. This can be obtained for \$4,000.00. The cost of demolition and black topping will be about \$5,000.00, making a total cost of \$9,000.00 for this area.

E — Another property, owned by Mr. Clarence O'Neal which abutts Jackwood Park can be obtained for \$10,500.00. The demolition and black topping costs would be about \$10,000.00, making a total cost of \$20,500.00.

F — The fourth area we checked is that which starts about 25 ft. beyond the flagpole in what is now known as Jackwood Park and runs to the retaining wall at the Fire Station parking lot. Since the town now owns this property, the cost of preparing it and black topping it will total about \$3,000.00.

G — We feel that the best and most inexpensive parking area would be the property behind Jackwood Park. We realize that there will be considerable opposition to using this site. On the other hand, it is a matter of economics. The costs of obtaining and preparing the other areas mentioned above are almost prohibitive, for what the town will get back.

H — The next best area in our opinion would be the O'Neal property. The area is large enough to accommodate more than 75 vehicles. The cost is great, but in comparison to the others, it is not too much for the property involved.

I — In order for the town to make the parking lot self sustaining, the committee suggests that the town could put in parking meters. Over a period of time, the revenues from these meters would repay for the initial cost and the future upkeep of the parking lot.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district.
9. To see if the district will vote to discontinue the annual publication of the salaries of teachers in the district.
10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.

11. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

## REPORT OF THE HINSDALE-WINCHESTER CO-OPERATIVE SCHOOL PLANNING BOARD

---

*Formation.* At the 1967 annual School District Meetings in Hinsdale and Winchester, the voters in each district elected three members to form a local Co-operative School Planning Committee. After preliminary considerations of local school problems in the individual towns, the two committees met jointly and formed a Co-operative School Planning Board. This Board has met semi-monthly and has selected sub-committees on curriculum, buildings and enrollment, vocational education, and publicity. In addition to members from the schools' administrative staffs, other citizens of the two towns have been included on these sub-committees.

*Procedure.* The Co-operative Planning Board is proceeding approximately along the following outline of main problems:

1. What courses of study should the schools offer for students in these towns?
2. What buildings do we need to offer this program for the present enrollment? for the projected enrollment?
3. How should the required building space be arranged and equipped? What portion of our requirements can be met in existing buildings? by alterations? by re-arrangement? by additions? or by new structures?
4. What is the most economical solution to the space requirements?
5. What are the estimated costs for the above capital improvements and for operating the proposed program?
6. What is the most equitable formula for sharing these costs between the two towns?

*Limit of authority.* The answers which the present Co-operative School Planning Board may develop for these problems above will not necessarily be the final direction for action, but are intended only to guide the voters in considering the final solution, to the urgent needs of the schools in both towns, as outlined below. If the voters should decide to form a co-operative school district, then this new district and its newly elected School Board would make the final decisions on the answers to the problems facing our schools.

*Needs of pupils.* Meanwhile your Co-operative Planning Board is trying to develop answers which would most quickly and reasonably meet the immediate urgent requirements in both towns. These requirements include, but are not limited to:

1. More elementary classroom space, immediately!
2. Elementary program of instruction meeting the guidelines of the N. H. State Department of Education.
3. A complete secondary education program in all areas of instruction; especially in expanded vocational course offerings, but also in additional academic program improvements.

*Our goal.* This Board seeks implementation of these aims by the method best adapted to a full utilization of available state and federal aid, and in the manner calculated to offer the best program to be had in return for the local tax money expended, both on capital improvements and operating costs.

*Voting.* The Co-operative Planning Board is attempting to keep all citizens informed of proceedings, by means of letters to parents, press releases, and public hearings and panel discussion groups. When we are ready to make a recommendation for voter consideration, hearings will be held on this proposal and then special school district meetings will be sought, to start the legal procedures on whatever plan we shall then propose.

*Challenge.* To reach the wisest solution, in all its ramifications, will require a renewed willingness on the part of all the school administration and the local citizens to jointly promote increased community awareness of the ever-accelerating changes

in our society; and to prepare for and welcome the inevitable changes ahead regardless of some necessary breaks with our past traditions and local pride. The future belongs not at all to US, but rather to our students. We owe them the best preparation for their years ahead.

## REPORT OF THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

---

The following is the annual report of the Hinsdale Elementary School.

### Enrollment

The school population at the elementary school continues to grow. Our opening day enrollment in September of 1966 was 426 and as we began this year it has increased to 445. It is significant to note that by November we had expanded to 474 and at present our enrollment is 462. Our actual growth can be established somewhere between 36 and 48 pupils which represents more than one full class.

It can be noted from the above figures that we have experienced very large class loads in Grade 4 and Kindergarten. Also class loads in Grade 5 and Grade 6 are higher than recommended.

### Personnel

Mr. David Carr, a Keene State College graduate, joined our staff early in 1967 and is assigned to Grade 6.

Mr. Wayne Harvey, a graduate of Windham College in Putney, Vermont, joined us in September and is teaching one of our sixth grade sections.

Mrs. Molly Chambers, a graduate of Antioch College, was added to our staff at the opening of school so that we might have a third section of Grade 3.

Mrs. Jean Walsh, a Keene State College graduate, was employed to fill a vacancy in Grade 3.

We have been fortunate to have the services of a teacher's aid-in-training made possible this year through the financial support of the Federal Government's New Careers program. Mrs. Evelyn Gibson is assisting in the kindergarten and also helping with necessary clerical duties.

### **School Organization**

With the opening of school in September the return to self-contained classrooms for Grades 4 through 6 was completed. This move seemed essential in order to provide the flexibility needed to accommodate the schedules for music and art instruction in these grades.

### **Curriculum**

No major changes have been made in curriculum this year. This year has been spent in evaluating and reassessing present curriculum with the view to strengthening existing programs.

A short time each afternoon has been designated as supervised play or physical education period. At this time each teacher directs the physical endeavors of his class on the playground or in the classroom as weather permits. Activities included have been group games, races, touch football, softball, square dancing and like activities.

I take this opportunity to commend the entire staff for their cooperative spirit, their hard work and their collective achievements during this school year. Their combined efforts have made my tasks less difficult and my endeavors more effective. I particularly want to commend our school secretary, Mrs. Roberts, for her hours of patient understanding and constructive help in assisting me in "getting acquainted" in my new position.

I wish also to make mention of the fine attitude and cooperation of both parents and townspeople in Hinsdale that my position has brought me in contact with during the past few months. It is a pleasure for me to serve the Hinsdale School District.

## REPORT OF THE HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

---

To The Superintendent :

I am pleased to present to you this Annual Report of Hinsdale High School for the past calendar year.

### GRADUATES

In June 1967, 30 Seniors were graduated from the High School. Specifically, the following people received their Diplomas.

Forty per cent of the 1967 graduating class are now attending post secondary educational institutions. Of this percentage, ten per cent went on to four year colleges, ten per cent went to Nursing schools, twenty per cent went to Junior college and Technical schools.

Additionally, two of our young men entered the Armed Services. Fifteen members of the Class found employment in

and around the Hinsdale-Brattleboro area. One of our graduates is now married.

### ENROLLMENT

At the start of School in September, we had an enrollment of three hundred one students. At present our room utilization per period approached ninety-five per cent. Next September's estimated enrollment is three hundred twenty one. This enrollment figure continues to add to the High School space problem.

### CURRICULUM

To strengthen the non-academic part of our High School Curriculum, we have added two new courses this year, namely Physical Science and Consumer Math.

These courses now allow our non-academic people to elect a Math and Science course in their Junior and Senior Year.

For the second year, we at the Junior High level, are participating in a Science Pilot program developed at Florida State University under the sponsorship of the U.S. Office of Education.

Emphasis of the Course is placed on scientific investigation through experimentation rather than the traditional textbook method. The course is designed as a self-pacing activity whereby a student progresses at his own rate of speed. The equipment available to our students through this program is quite extensive, and therefore enhances practical application of Scientific principles.

To this point the program has proven to be extremely successful. Teachers and students involved feel the program is both interesting and worthwhile.

This year we have been fortunate to have Mrs. Heidi Watts, of the Monadnock Children's Center in Keene, start an experimental reading program with a select group of high school students. Both the administration and the students have indicated a favorable response to it. Although this program represents an important start to a very real problem, there is still a great deal which has to be done on the high school level. This work will be continued by the present member of the English department.

## STAFF

It is a pleasure to report that teacher turnover at the High School has been minimal. Our staff additions for the school year 1967-68 were two.

Mrs. Carolyn Nichols, a graduate of Keene State College, who replaces Mr. James McGinnes in our English Department, and Mr. Russell Goodwin, a graduate of The University of New Hampshire, who is an addition to our Science Department.

Both these people came to us with prior teaching experience. Mrs. Nichols was a member of the English Department at Clearlake High School in Clearlake, Florida, and Mr. Goodwin was a member of the faculty at Pioneer Valley Regional High School in Northfield, Massachusetts last year.

## CUSTODIAL SERVICES

In August we added to our custodial staff of two, Mr. Francis Smart. Mr. Smart is employed at both the Elementary and High School buildings at different times of the day.

The team approach to building maintenance is now being used with Mr. Michael Bolden as Chief Custodian. This method has proven to be both extremely efficient and applicable to Hinsdale's School building situation.

## LIBRARY SERVICES

The number of volumes now in the library total about 2,500 with all categories represented according to the guidelines set up by the American Library Association. Each year for the past five years, approximately 250 volumes, selected by the various departments, have been purchased. In addition, the school subscribes to 45 periodicals. In the audio-visual area we possess relatively little — the most recent film strips and records were made possible through federal funds.

The number of books taken out by the students has been encouraging and averages about 600 per month.

The library could not be operated as efficiently if it were not for the student librarians who volunteer to charge books, obtain

back issues of magazines (which we keep for five years), help students locate needed material, and return books to their proper position.

### GUIDANCE SERVICES

The guidance services provided here at Hinsdale High School are many. One of the more important is our testing program. A brief description of our present testing program follows:

All of the incoming seventh grade are tested using the Henmon-Nelson Intelligence Test. The Intelligence Test scores are evaluated and compared with the marking grades of each student. This comparison is made to check the individual student and to make sure that each one is working up to his or her potential ability.

The eighth grade class all take the state sponsored test under the State Testing Programs. The test that they take is SCAT, School and College Ability Test. Also included in this test is a section of the Stanford Achievement Test which tests various skills in English, Math, Science and Social Studies. The results of this testing program, plus other information are of great significance in placing the student in the correct program in High School.

The tenth grade students are tested with the statewide testing program. Again the SCAT, School and College Ability tests are used with the cooperative English Tests and the Stanford Mathematics. This test also aids in placement and is a good indication of future scholastic potentiality.

In the eleventh grade students who are planning to take the College Board Examination take the PSAT exam. This is known as the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test. This exam reveals their scholastic potential to do college grade work.

In the twelfth grade the Seniors who plan to go on to school take the College Boards or the SAT exams, Scholastic Aptitude Test. All seniors are tested by the State Department of Employment Security. These results are on file in the Keene Office and each student is counselled as to his or her employment aptitude. These scores are transferable to any employment office in the

United States and can save much time and energy if one is looking for employment.

In conclusion, may I express my thanks to all those who have made my new position here in Hinsdale a thoroughly rewarding experience.

Hinsdale High School stands tall educationally among the Secondary schools of this state. This position could not have been achieved without a dedicated school board, an exceptional faculty, and knowledgable direction from your Superintendents.

## SUPERINTENDENTS' REPORT

---

Much effort has gone into the consideration of improvement of public school programs and facilities in our corner of the state. In Hinsdale we are being pressed to find solutions to space problems. Increasing enrollments and expanding school programs dictated by State Elementary Guidelines and High School Minimum Standards make it imperative that the school district take action to provide for expanded elementary and secondary school facilities. Every available bit of space is now being used in both buildings and the enrollments continue to increase. Add to this the necessity for broadening our educational offerings to satisfy Elementary Guidelines and Minimum High School Standards and the problem is indeed critical.

Last March two communities, Hinsdale and Winchester, voted to have a cooperative school district planning committee make a comprehensive study of their school needs. The two committees joined together to form a Planning Board for the purpose of studying jointly the problems faced in both districts. A detailed report of the work of this Board is included elsewhere in the Annual Report. In undertaking the study, the Planning Board considered the following factors:

1. The wisdom of forming a cooperative school district for Hinsdale and Winchester.
2. The present school buildings with regard to safety, sanitation, obsolescence, and adaptability to present and future educational programs.
3. Child population trends based upon an analysis of residential growth and school enrollments over a period of years.
4. The future school building program including estimates of the cost of construction of essential facilities, the cost



of operating buildings, and estimates of tax rates both for operating as separate districts or as a cooperative district.

5. The implications that New Hampshire Elementary School Guidelines and New Hampshire Minimum Standards for High Schools have on the present and future curriculum in the schools.

As a result of this intensive analysis of these and other problems, it is hoped that the report of the Planning Board will serve as a foundation for building the future educational programs in our area under the most adequate and efficient organization possible.

The State Board of Education, in response to a legislative order, has adopted the policy of reducing the number of supervisory unions, the means by which several local school districts share the services of the office of the superintendent of schools. As a result of this policy, Supervisory Union #25 was eliminated and the school districts of Hinsdale and Winchester have been combined with the Monadnock School District to make up Supervisory Union #38. Although the wisdom of this policy may not yet be apparent, the districts (we have been in operation only since July 1, 1967), the staff members in the Superintendents' office are combining their efforts to provide improved efficiency and service for each district. Machine bookkeeping, volume purchasing, better supervision of instruction, coordination of teacher recruitment practices, and more comprehensive planning should benefit every district.

School budgets continue to rise. Although the cost of living influences school budgets, the major cause for the increase is teachers' salaries. Sixty-two per cent of the present budget goes for instructional salaries. Add to this such fixed items as social security, retirement, insurance, and debt service and very little is left for such things as operation, maintenance, transportation, and capital expenditures. However, we have very little choice in the matter of teacher salaries. In this time of teacher shortage, our salaries must remain somewhat competitive with the salaries being paid in the area. Few would suggest that we gamble with

the future of young people by hiring inadequate or unqualified teachers, or by seeing classrooms without teachers.

State support for education continues to be wholly inadequate thereby placing an additional strain on districts with a limited tax base. New Hampshire, which stands at the bottom among the fifty states in the matter of state aid for schools, does not even begin to fund the laws which are in effect. It is a recognized fact that the State simply does not have the revenue to carry out the laws that we have. No one likes to talk about more taxes but consider the alternative. As long as we favor the present state policy in our tax structure, we are at the same time casting our ballot in favor of fewer and poorer services and high property taxes. It is impossible to have the one without the other.

Where do we go from here? First of all, our citizens must recognize the problems we face and the solution to them before we have cause to recognize our shortsightedness. However, it is not too late in Hinsdale. True, the number of alternatives available to us have diminished, but we can still solve our problems if we are motivated by a sincere desire to provide the essential educational services in the most efficient manner possible. Let us face up to our problems and solve them and not leave them to be solved by the next generation.
