## REPORT Of The SELECTMEN

The past year 1965 proved to be a busy for the Town Officials, and the Board of Selectmen is listing below a brief resume of the activities.

**TAX REAPPRAISAL.** The tax reappraisal program as voted for at the 1964 Town Meeting was completed during the past year. As a result of the property being assessed on a 100% valuation the tax rate was reduced from \$5.40 per \$100.00 of valuation to \$2.10 per \$100.00 of valuation. However, this did not result in the decrease of taxes on property. It is felt that in most cases property was assessed on a fair and equitable basis. In some instances adjustments were made.

**SEWER CONSTRUCTION.** The Ejector Stations on River Street and Old Peterborough Road were constructed and should be completed in the very near future, thus adding to the present sewerage system and increasing the area now sewered.

**COMMONS.** This project had to be delayed until 1966 due to several reasons, one being due to the critical shortage of water that existed during 1965, and it would not have been feasible to consume the water needed for this project. Also, the reconstruction work that had been voted for Route #137 was delayed until 1966. It is hoped that this project will be completed during 1966.

**ROUTE #124.** More construction was done on Route #124 during 1965 to bring the reconstruction work up to Sawtelle Road. This work was done under the State Aid Reconstruction Program.

**ROUTE #137.** It has been planned to do some reconstruction work on Route #137 under the same State Aid Reconstruction Program as on Route #124, but it was necessary that the State delay this program until 1966.

**TOWN OFFICE BUILDING.** The outside of the Town Office Building was treated with a preservative sealer to prevent deterioration of the brick work.

**TAX MAP.** The Tax Map is now nearing completion. It was not necessary to request additional funds for this project for 1966 as there is still enough money remaining to complete this work. This map should be ready for use before the Summer.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT.** Due to the untimely death of Chief of Police Lucien E. Vigneault on Sept. 1, 1965, the Board of Selectmen appointed Sgt. Arthur H. Rivard as Acting Chief of Police until a successor was found for the late Chief. Several applications were received and considered by the Board. A decision was made, and on December 1, 1965, Sgt. Rivard was appointed to be Chief of Police. Chief Rivard had previously demonstrated the ability to fill this vacancy. Chief Rivard had served under the late Chief Vigneault for several years, first as a Patrolman and as a Sergeant, having attended several schools and classes conducted for the police officers in this State.

There are no major projects anticipated for the coming year and it is hoped that the year 1966 will be a good year for the Town of Jaffrey.

The Board wishes to express its appreciation to the people of Jaffrey for the cooperation and help given them in the discharge of their duties during the past year.

# TOWN MEETING WARRANT

**TO: The Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, County of Cheshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:**

You are hereby notified to meet at Conant High School Auditorium in Jaffrey Village in said Town of Jaffrey, on Tuesday, the Eighth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon (polls to remain open until six o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, Selectman for three years, Selectman for two years, Tax Collector, and all other necessary Town and School District Officers.
2. To hear all reports except that of the Budget Committee.
3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be required for the support of the poor, building and repairing of highways and bridges, fire and police departments, Memorial Day, street and building lighting and all other Town Charges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$210.00 for the installation and defraying the service charge for one year for five (5) 3500 lumen Mercury street lights on poles 8/2, 4/6, 8 and 10 on Hillcrest Road.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the purpose of State Aid Reconstruction on Route #124, for the continuation of construction on Route #124 from Sawtelle Road to Jaffrey Center, a distance of approximately 0.3 miles more or less, on condition that the State will allocate the sum of \$10,000.00; total cost of this project to be \$15,000.00. (By Petition)
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,800.00 for the purpose of extending the present sewer on Gilmore Pond Road and extending a distance of approximately 850 feet, or act in any way relating thereto. (By Petition).
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.88 for the installation and defraying the service charges for one year for two (2) 1000 lumen Mercury street lights on poles 2/24A and 2/24C on Forcier Way.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$2,000.00 for the purpose of making alterations to the Jaffrey Fire Station located on River Street in Jaffrey which will allow for the accomodation of additional equipment owned by the Department, or act in any way relating thereto.
10. To see if the Town will vote to amend the motion as made under Article 20 of the annual Town Meeting of March 1964 as reads:  
"That the Town establish the salaries of the new Jaffrey District Court effective as of July 1, 1964, to be as follows: Justice - \$1,200.00 annually, Special Justice - \$250.00 annually, and the Clerk of Court - \$500.00 annually" to read as follows:  
"That the Town establish the salaries of the Jaffrey District Court to read as follows: Justice - \$15,000.00, Special Justice - \$300.00 annually and the Clerk of Court - \$700.00 annually."
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$4,000.00 for the purpose of installing a spur sewer on Burrington Street, or act in any way relating thereto. (By petition).

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$136.92 for the changeover in lighting and to defray the service charges for one year on the lights now located on Charlonne Street, changing same from the present seven (7) 600 lumen to seven (7) 3500 lumen Mercury lights.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the purpose of State Aid Reconstruction on Route #137, or North Street so-called, for the continuation of construction on Route #137 from the corner of Old Peterborough Road up to the Cutter Farm, a distance of approximately 0.3 mile more or less, on condition that the State will allocate the sum of \$14,000.00; total cost of the project to be \$21,000.00. (By Petition)

14. To see if the Town will vote to amend the motion passed at the annual Town Meeting of March 13, 1962, establishing a Budget Committee, by adding after the words: "and five citizens of the Town," the words: "none of whom shall be a member of the School Board or a Selectman", so that it will read: "and five citizens of the Town, none of whom shall be a member of the School Board or a Selectman, to be appointed by the Moderator", or act in any way relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.88 for the installation and defraying the service charges for one year for two (2) 1000 lumen Mercury street lights to be installed on Letourneau Drive and Erin Lane. (By Petition)

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a sidewalk on Main Street, beginning near the residence of Joseph C. Lambert and continuing a distance of about 1700 feet to the intersection of Main and Prospect Streets. (By Petition)

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.44 for the installation and defraying the service charge for one year for one (1) lumen Mercury street light to be installed on Parent Street. (By Petition)

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.44 for the installation and defraying the service charge for one year for one (1) 1000 lumen Mercury street light to be installed on Harling Street. (By Petition)

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.44 for the installation and defraying the service charge for one year for one (1) 1000 lumen Mercury street light on Hamilton Court. (By Petition)

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.88 for the installation and defraying the service charges for one year for two (2) 1000 lumen Mercury street lights to be installed as follows: One at the corner of Pine and Birch Streets and one at the corner of Birch and Brook Streets. (By Petition)

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend from the Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund, a sum of money not to exceed \$3,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing equipment for the fire department, or act in any way relating thereto.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee of five, to be headed by Alice E.E. Lehtinen, Town Historian, as Chairman, to make a survey on the correct and legal names of the various roads and streets of this community, and that the said committee is to make a report of its findings at either an adjourned meeting of this town meeting or at the next annual town meeting and make recommendations so that a correct and accurate record of these street and road names will be on file.

23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Moderator to appoint a committee to look into the feasibility of securing a location for a municipal parking area for the Town of Jaffrey, and that the said committee will make a report on its findings and its recommendations at an adjourned meeting of this town meeting or at the next annual town meeting.

24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee of five to make a study of the needs for new sidewalks in this town, and that said committee will make a report on its findings and recommendations at an adjourned meeting of this town meeting, or at the next annual town meeting.

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the purpose of improving the Fitzgerald Ski Hill Area; said money to be spent for clearing a larger ski area, moving the motor hut back approximately twenty-five to thirty feet, replacing the old hut and contributing partial payment towards wages paid to a qualified rope tow operators. (By Petition)

26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Planning Board of the Town of Jaffrey to draw a list of specifications to serve as a guide for subdivision developers in the laying out of new roads which will be subject to acceptance as town roads at a later date; said specifications will show the necessary width of road, right-of-way and all other pertinent information which would be of assistance to the Board of Selectmen in laying out such roads, or act in any way relating thereto.

27. To see if the Town will vote to turn over to the Jaffrey Historical Society ownership of the two hearses now owned by the Town; said hearses to be retained by the Jaffrey Historical Society and to be displayed in conjunction with other articles of historical interest now in their possession, or act in any way relating thereto.

28. To take up any other business that may be properly brought before the meeting.

29. Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, relating to games of Beano be accepted in this Town?

# POLICE DEPARTMENT'S REPORT

To the Honorable Board of Selectmen:

The Chief of Police, herewith submits his annual report for the year 1965.

The department has had a busy year, with increases in almost every phase of police activities.

Juvenile delinquency, which is on the increase here, as well as on the national level, is a problem, that greatly concerns this department. One of the major problems is the increasing number of juveniles and minors, that indulge in alcoholic beverages. Many motor vehicle accidents are caused by juveniles and minors, that operate automobiles after drinking beer or liquor. Also drinking leads many of them into far more serious trouble, which may plague them for the rest of their lives. The real culprit here, is the person who procures alcoholic beverages for these juveniles and minors.

Training is also an important phase of police activities. There is no substitute for a well trained police officer. A police training school was started in October, and will continue till Spring. Classes, which are held in the court room of the town office building on Wednesday, nights are also attended by officers from Dublin, Troy, Rindge and Fitzwilliam, as guest of our department. Myself, Sgt. Kevin Rivard, and Special Officer Randy Courmoyer, attended a night course at St. Anselm College, in Manchester, during the Winter months. The course which lasted fifteen weeks was on "Criminal Investigation and Case Preparation". Classes were held in Perini Hall, on Tuesday nights.

Special Officer Nelson Gill, resigned during the year because of ill health. New officers appointed are Francis Chamberlain, Ronald Christian and Albert Christian.

Chief of Police Hubert F. O'Neil died four weeks later on September 27, 1965, at the

age of 88. He was elected to head the town's law enforcement agency first in March, 1924, and he held the position for more than 30 years, until the appointment of Chief Vigneault as his successor.

The Town of Jaffrey is grateful, indeed, for the dedication to duty and for the service rendered by these two men over that long period of years.

They are pictured on the cover of this year's Town Reports in testimony to that gratitude.

TO: The CITIZENS OF Jaffrey.

I am submitting herewith my fourth annual report as your elected Highway Agent with a brief summary of projects and work accomplished during 1965.

**Cheshire and Hadley Bridges.** As a result of an affirmative vote at the Town Meeting of 1965, these two bridges were replaced with structures that made both these bridges safer and less hazardous for traffic.

**Sewers.** A new sewer connecting Hillcrest Road to the town sewerage system was completed during the past year.

**Sidewalks.** The sidewalk on East Main Street at the intersection with Peterborough Street for a distance of about 700 feet was renovated.

**T. R. A. Projects.** The lower end of the Old Jaffrey to Peterborough Road for a distance of .8 mile was constructed under the TOWN Road Aid Construction Program, and the 1964 project on Henschman Road was also completed.

**Tarring.** The newly accepted roads known as Letourneau Drive and Erin Lane was paved during the past year.

**Town Construction.** The following roads were repaired to make them passable during the spring and winter seasons: Cutter Farm Road; Gap Mt. Road; Bacon Road; Highland Avenue (Upper end).

There was the usual maintenance work done, such as replacing numerous culverts, a new drainage system was put in at the corner of Route #202 and Gilmore Pond Road. Approximately six miles of road were surface treated and approximately fifteen miles of road were coated with seal-coat. Some dirt roads were graded and culverts and ditches were cleaned. Approximately twelve miles of roadside brush was cleaned with application of a weed killer.

**New Pickup Truck.** A new 3/4 ton Ford pickup truck was delivered to the Highway Department. It has proven very useful to the department, as it was and is being used extensively for plowing all dead end streets during the winter and it was used during the summer for general clean-up work.

I wish at this time to express my thanks to all who in any way assisted in making the task of the Highway Agent a pleasant one.

**Art. 4. BUDGET COMMITTEE'S REPORT.** It was moved seconded and passed: "That the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$224,623.96 as approved by the Budget Committee of the Town of Jaffrey for current expenditures for the year 1965."

**Art. 5. TEMPORARY LOANS IN ANTICIPATION OF TAXES.** It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes."

**Art. 6. TAX MAP.** It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to continue the work now in progress on the Tax Map."

**Art. 7. BRIDGE AT CHESHIRE VILLAGE.** It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 for the purpose of reconstructing the Bridge No. 170/090 leading from Peterborough Road to Cheshire Village."

WITHDRAWAL OF MONEY FROM CAPITAL RESERVE FUND (HIGHWAY EQUIPMENT) FOR PURCHASE OF NEW PICKUP FOR HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.** It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend from the Highway Department Capital Reserve Fund the sum of \$3,175.00 for the purpose of purchasing a new pickup truck for the Highway Department."

**Art. 10. CHANGEOVER IN LIGHTING ON EAST MAIN STREET.** It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$340.20 for the payment for one year for the changeover in lighting to 11000 lumen lighting on East Main Street and continuing to Grove Street."

**Art. 11. NEW POLICE CRUISER.** It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$1,035.00 for the purpose of trading the present 1964 Plymouth Police Cruiser for the Police Department."

**Art. 12. STREET LIGHT- JAQUITH ROAD.** It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,035.00 for the purpose of trading the present 1964 Plymouth Police Cruiser for the Police Department."

appropriate the sum of \$22.40 for the purpose of defraying the charge for one year for the installation of one street light on Jaquith Road near the residence of Adelia F. Whitcomb."

Art. 13. RAFT AT LAKE CONTOOCOOK. It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of replacing the raft at Lake Contoocook Beach."

Art. 14. RETENTION OF TOWN-OWNED LAND- MAIN STREET. It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to retain the land belonging to the Town of Jaffrey located on Main Street, between the Public Service Company right-of-way and the Homer J. Sawtelle Property for use of the Jaffrey Water Works, but that the Selectmen be authorized to dispose of the building located thereon by sale to the highest bidder."

Art. 15. RETENTION OF AIRPARK AGREEMENT PASSED AT 1960 TOWN MEETING.

Art. 19. AUTHORIZATION FOR SELECTMEN TO APPLY TO STATE AND FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES FOR FUNDS ON A MATCHING BASIS. It moved, second and passed: "That Articles 15, 19 and 20 being closely related be considered as one article."

It was then moved and seconded: "That Article 15, 19 and 20 be passed over." After considerable discussion the Moderator called for a standing vote and the results of the vote was as follows:

Art. 16. STREET LIGHTS- WHEELER STREET. It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44.88 for the purpose of defraying the cost of installation and charges for one year for two street lights to be located on Wheeler Street."

Art. 17. STATE AID CONSTRUCTION- ROUTE #137. It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the purpose of State Aid Reconstruction on Route #137, or North Street, so-called, beginning at the intersection of Main Street and extending along Route #137 towards and beyond its intersection with Old Peterborough Road, a distance of 0.4 miles more or less, on condition that the State will allocate the sum of \$14,000.00"

Art. 18. PAINTING TOWN CLOCK TOWER. It was moved, seconded and carried: "That the Town vote to raise and ap-

propriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of painting the Town Clock Tower at the Jaffrey Womens Club Building."

Art. 21. RIGHT-OF-WAY - BURRINGTON COURT - AETNA STREET. It was moved, seconded, and passed: "That the Town vote to accept the right-of-way located between Burrington Court and Aetna Street and deed to the Town of Jaffrey by Harold C. Knight and Marjorie K. Shattuck."

Art. 22. IMPROVEMENT -- WAR MEMORIAL COMMONS. It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to be paid pose of improving the two commons on Main Street where the War Memorials are located."

Art. 23. CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR'S EXPENSES. It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to be paid the Civil Defense Director of this Town, provided the Federal Government will provide matching funds."

Art. 24. CIVIL DEFENSE EXPENSES. It was moved, seconded and passed: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Civil Defense purposes."

Art. 25. SALE OF POOLE LAND - THORNDIKE POND. It was moved, seconded and carried: "That the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the so-called Poole land at Thorndike Pond by sale to the highest bidder."

Art. 26. OTHER BUSINESS. It was moved, seconded and passed that the following resolution be adopted:

"Resolved: The voters of the Town of Jaffrey, being also, voters of the Jaffrey School District, and having consistently supported their School Board in recommendations for teachers salary increases to meet changing needs, are convinced that the traditional privilege to weigh and decide such local matters should be kept at home. Your Civil Defense Director met several times with the Board of Selectmen during the year to brief them on development at both state and local levels. Much time was spent on a communications system to be based at the Town Office Building. An updated Basic Emergency Operation Plan (Civil Defense Plan) was drawn up and is now in effect. We expect to have a copy of this plan and copies of most of the Emergency Service Plans at the Library soon.

Civil Defense secured a large capacity pump for the Water Department in their attempt to alleviate Jaffrey's serious water problem this past summer.

The Jaffrey Fire Department now has two (2) new Scott Air Packs purchased at half price through The Civil Defense Department.

Your Director met with each Emergency Service Head several times to update their CD plans and to fill our Jaffrey's semi-annual Federal Program papers which are necessary for Jaffrey to qualify for Federal Assistance.

Five members of Jaffrey's Civil Defense were trained as Shelter Managers by the University of N.H. Extension Service

in a joint effort with the Peterborough Civil Defense.

A preliminary survey has been made of the new Jaffrey-Gilmore Foundation Building by your Director and the U. S. Corps of Engineers in our continuing effort to find Fallout Shelter space, for everyone in Jaffrey. If the license for this building can be secured, we should be able to increase our shelter capacity greatly and possibly have one of the best Emergency Operating Centers in the State of N.H.

All of our existing Shelters have been stocked with food, water, medical supplies and RADEF equipment this year.

Your C. D. Director wishes to thank the Selectmen, the Emergency Service heads and all of those interested in Civil Defense for their continued support of his efforts and especially for their support on Town Meeting Day when we talk about money to support the program.

# MONADNOCK REGION ASSOCIATION

To the Town of Jaffrey

The Monadnock Region Association maintains a building of its own at the Junction of Routes #202 and #101 at the Peterborough By-Pass. This combination showroom and information center is staffed by a full-time receptionist-office secretary and an executive secretary who divides his time between the office and the field.

Aside from fixed charges and overhead, the bulk of the money received is used for promotional work, and includes such items as 30,000 Regionaires, 30,000 summer folders, 25,000 fall foliage folders, and tour maps, 25,000 winter ski and sports brochures and maple syrup bulletins. Four season vacations are emphasized, Apple blossom, Laurel and Fall Foliage tours are publicized and posted in season.

The Association sponsored 4-H activities, high school bands, the N. H. Philharmonic Orchestra, agriculture, industry, and the hotel-tourist trade. In addition, as occasion arises the Association lends its weight for better roads, better and more picnic areas, better hunting and fishing with protection to land owners, better forestry practices, and, in short, for all things that tend to make the Region more livable and attractive.

Our exhibition facilities are open and available to anyone in the Region. The local public, as well as the tourist public, are welcome at headquarters anytime.

4. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District.

5. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants forthcoming under Titles III, V, or VIII, or any combination thereof, of the National Defense Education Act, Public Law 85-864 or any or all grants of other funds which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire under the provisions of the National defense Education Act.

6. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to include a contingency fund item in the regular school district budget and raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for the same.

7. To see if the district will vote to place the funds previously voted under Article 4 in the Capital Reserve Fund for replacement of a school bus.

8. To see if the district will vote to accept the provisions of Title I, Public Law 89-10 (Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965), and to appropriate such funds as may be made available to the district under said Federal Act for such particular projects as may be determined by the school board. Further, to see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate. Also, to see what sum the district will raise and appropriate to supplement such Federal funds.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to institute a program for remedial reading and counseling and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,410.00 to implement the same.

10. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 toward a gym divider, or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see if the district will vote to place the funds previously voted under Article 10 in the Capital Reserve Fund for a gym divider.

# SCHOOL PROGRAM

## JAFFREY GRADE SCHOOL

This past year could not be considered one of the dramatic changes in curriculum development or other aspects of the school program. However, it has not been a year of standing still but rather one of extension and expansion of projects that have been introduced within the past few years.

Thus, the new 1960's edition of the Scott, Foresman Reading System that was introduced into the first grade when it first appeared on the market has now been extended into Grade 4.

The New Math Workshop, one of the modern math programs in use throughout the country, has been extended into Grade 5. Both the reading and the math programs were started in Grade 1 and have been continued each year as the grade moved along.

An additional art supervisor was hired by Supervisory Union #47 on a part time basis for work in the high school area, allowing more time for the art program in the elementary school.

Rearrangement of the music supervisors' schedules has permitted the addition of violin lessons to the others already being given by the supervisors.

The Junior Band, which is composed of members from the Grade School and Conant Junior High, had another active year under the direction of Barbara Carter. A concert was given in the spring and the group marched in the Memorial Day Parade and the music festival that was held in Jaffrey. This year the band is under the direction of Mr. Barrata with rehearsals starting in January.

The speech therapy program under the direction of Mrs. Noyes is being continued for the third consecutive year.

A suggested reading list of books available from the Jaffrey Public Library was given to each child at the close of school with the hope that he would continue reading during the summer. The cooperation of the library staff in this project is greatly appreciated.

Mr. Craig has continued to teach reading, as time has allowed, to those children who could gain from individual assistance. He has also met with a group of sixth graders several times a week exploring some of the aspects of a modern math approach.

The use of TV as an instructional aid has been on the increase as more programs are being produced and those already in existence have been revised for more effective learning.

The staff has continued to display professional interest during the past year. Mildred Cutter and Dorothy Kendall completed the course, Science for Elementary Teachers, at Keene State College through Monadnock Community College. Geraldine Wallace took the course, Speech and Hearing Impairment in School Children, at Keene State College. Lillian Maynard completed the course, Modern Methods of Discipline in the Elementary School, from Keene State College. Doris Shea, teacher-nurse, completed the courses, education Psychology and Human Growth and Development, from Keene State College. Clayton Craig completed the course, Curriculum Development, at Keene State College.

Mrs. Kendall and Mr. Craig are meeting weekly with other teachers and principals of Union #47 to review the present elementary science program, examine the new texts that are on the market, and develop a guide for use in science. This committee is working under the direction of Donald Carle, our teacher consultant.



The sixth grade took its annual trip to Sargent Camp in the fall of 1965 under the supervision of their teachers, Lillian Maynard and Abbie Brown. The fifth grade will take its yearly trip to Boston and the fourth grade to Concord in the coming spring.

The teachers and pupils thank the Jaffrey Dancing Class of 1964 for a gift of \$125 which has been used to purchase two record players to replace some of ours which are in very bad condition.

A Headstart Program was held at the grade School for eight weeks during the summer of 1965 with eighteen children from Rindge and Jaffrey in attendance. The program was typical of those organized throughout the country. The word "headstart" as used in connection with this program, means that a child who attends is getting help which in September will find him nearer the level of his fellow first graders.

## CONANT HIGH SCHOOL

Last year at Conant High School the Guidance Department, with the cooperation of the Rindge and Jaffrey Grade Schools, initiated an orientation program for the incoming Grade 7 class. A Career Night was held for those parents and students interested in a continuing education after high school. At least twenty-five schools were represented that night. In September of last year a part-time secretary was added to the Guidance Department.

The curriculum saw several changes. Recordkeeping, General Business, and Shorthand were added to the Business Curriculum. World History was also added as a Sophomore elec-

tive, Humanities was added to the English Department for students in the Junior and Senior Class who were doing better than average school work. A French Section for Grade 7 was started to acquaint students with a foreign language earlier in their school life.

The Junior High School Band was organized and held rehearsals once a week at the high school. Students from the Jaffrey Elementary School comprised a good part of this band. The Industrial Arts program added Graphic Arts to its curriculum and expanded welding and its associated areas.

The Science Department added an independent study program last year on an experimental basis.

Physical Education expanded its athletic program by starting a Junior High School basketball team. The baseball team finished high by winning the Monadnock League crown. A varsity girls basketball team was formed.

Student interest was high with the start of the College Bowl. Academically talented students represented Conant in competition with several area schools.

The National Honor Society received its charter and is now active.

And lastly, the entire student body, under the direction of the Student Council, conducted a Christmas Party for the St. Peter's Orphanage of Manchester.

6. Coat rack built in entrance to Union Hall.
7. General cleaning of building.

#### CONANT HIGH SCHOOL

In addition to the normal summer maintenance of the high school, the following repairs and improvements were made. The entire gymnasium received two coats of paint as did the stairwell leading to the boys' locker room. The Industrial Arts and Woodworking rooms were painted. The roof was resurfaced. The gymnasium floor was refinished. New booths were constructed with the help of Mr. Ernest Pratt and added to the language laboratory. A completely new exhaust system was added to the Chemistry room. The cement stairs in back of the old building were repaired. One-third of the total school driveway was resurfaced.

## PART VI. AUXILIARY ACTIVITIES AND SPECIAL REPORTS

### A. Health

The policies of the school health services are still; to keep the children well; to help promote normal growth; and to correct any condition which might prevent their best work in school.

The usual illnesses, colds, upset stomach, accounted for most exclusions during the past year. Parents will ask, "Is there something going around?" "With children," I always answer, "there's always something going around," and if it isn't a definite illness like measles, mumps or tonsillitis, if it hasn't a name, you know who is to blame, the poor virus.

There were many cases of measles, several of chicken pox and a few of mumps reported. Excluding sick children from school remains the biggest problem, but it is very necessary for the health of the other pupils. If a sick child can go home and get treatment and rest at the start of an illness, he will recuperate much quicker and return to school sooner.

Early in the school year, our school physician, Dr. Sterling, along with the school nurse, visited all of our schools and examined pupils in the odd numbered grades, as well as any new students. His examination consisted of a check of the chest including heart and lungs. He examined the ears, eyes and nose of each student, giving special attention to dental and throat conditions. He noted general appearance of skin and nutrition as well as posture.

If a condition is found during this exam, Dr. Sterling does not treat or prescribe, but the parents are notified by the school nurse and they are advised to take their child to their own physician or dentist for treatment.

When gym activities get underway all the athletes, including cheering squads, are also given a physical.

In the fall, teachers and personnel who desired it were given the flu vaccine. In March, a Heaf Tuberculin Test was held for students in Grades 1, 4, 8 and 12, also teachers and other

personnel. The majority had negative reactions and the few who reacted positively were given a chest x-ray and all reports were negative. This T. B. clinic was done with the help of the State Health Dept.

During the year, the school nurse gives each student a hearing and vision test. If corrections are needed a notice card is sent home. Most parents are cooperative, but there are always some who disregard these warnings and the problem, as small as it might be remains unattended to, often resulting in poor school work.

The Dental Clinic sponsored by the Jaffrey Woman's Club was continued. This enables some pupils to have corrections who might not otherwise be able to have them. Not all pupils who need work receive it because of the limited funds. Dr. Harold Goodman does the work in his office and transportation is furnished by the school nurse.

The Jaffrey Community League maintains a fund for glasses. Eight pupils received a complete eye examination and six required glasses which were purchased by the League. The school nurse furnished transportation to these appointments.

In the spring, registration day is held. The children are weighed and measured; given a hearing and vision test; teeth are checked and parents are advised of corrections needed so these can be taken care of during the summer. Tentative plans are now being made to have all newcomers screened for speech defects on this same day.

All through the school year, whenever the need arises, homes are visited by the school nurse. Meetings with Welfare and State Health officials are attended to plan and organize clinics.

All in all it was a good school year healthwise in all three of Jaffrey's schools, with no major illnesses or accidents.
