- 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00, to hire an architect to design a municipal building to be located behind the existing Civil Defense building or take any action thereon. (By petition) (by Ballot, 2/3 majority).
- 38. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 2% discount on all property taxes paid in full within 30 days of notice.
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sign contracts necessary for the operation of the Town affairs.

TOWN MEETING RESULTS - 1988

The meeting opened at 7:10 P.M. with Richard Webber giving the invocation with a few moments of silence for departed ones during the past year. Patricia Webber led the salute to the flag.

- Officers voted on earlier and elected: Moderator for two (2) years, Theodore Aldrich Selectmen for three (3) years, Nicholas Squicciarini Town Clerk for three (3) years, Dorothy Robbins Library Trustee for three (3) years, Sandra Moyer Cemetery Trustee for three (3) years, Sandra Moyer Trustee of the Trust Funds, for one (1) year, William Hatch Supervisor of the Check List for five (5) years, Dorothy Sylvester
 Supervisor of the Check List for six (6) years, Robert VanBrocklin
 Planning Board, two members for three (3) years, Jean Eismont and Ludger Morin
- 2. The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$6750.00 for Town Officers Salaries, \$3,600.00 for Town Officers Expenses, and \$20.00 for Vital Statistics, a total of \$20,370.00
- 3. The Town voted to adopt RSA 80-58-86 for a Real Estate Tax Lien procedure. These statues provide that Tax Sales to private individuals for non-payment of property taxes on Real Estate are replaced with a Real Estate Tax Lien procedure, under which only a municipality or county where the property is located, or the state may acquire a Tax Lien against Land and Buildings for unpaid taxes, voted by ballot.

On this article to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$3,600.00 for the purpose of remodeling the Town Hall and to allow for offices for the Tax Collector and Town Clerk, such appropriation to be financed by \$12,000.00 being paid out of the present years revenue, \$12,000.00 to be paid by the issuance of a one year note with interest at such rate as the Selectmen shall deem in the best interest of the Town, and \$12,000.00 to be paid by the issuance of a two year note with interest at such rate as the Selectmen shall deem in the best interest of the Town, to be voted on by ballot, 2/3 majority.

Discussion followed, Question called, voted on by ballot; YES 63 NO 47

defeated as not 2/3 majority. Moved to reconsider article 5, moved and seconded, failed.

Advised to have a committee formed to investigate alternatives, 6 or 7 volunteered including George Blais, Henry Randall and Orrin Holman.

- 29. On this article to raise and appropriate \$4,500.00 for doors for the Fire Station and oiling of the Parking Lot, Amended to read \$7,500.00. Article passed.
- 30. This article was to see if the Town would vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$23,000.00 for the purchase of a 1988 Rescue Squad vehicle for the Rescue Squad. Such appropriation to be financed by \$7,667.00 being paid out of the present years revenues, \$7,667.00 to be paid by the issuance of a one year note with interest at such rate as the Selectmen shall deem in the best interest of the Town, and \$7,667.00 to be paid by the issuance of a two year note with interest at such rate as the Selectmen shall deem in the best interest of the Town, or take any action thereon. By ballot 2/3 majority.

Amended to include before (or take and action thereon) and to authorize the Selectmen to recieve such donations as may be offered to defray these costs, passed.

Further Amended; a vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed \$20,000.00 and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$23,000.00 and to delete, (Such appropriation to be financed by \$7,667.00 being paid out of the present years revenues, \$7,667.00 to be paid by the issuance of a one year note with interest at such a rate as the Selectmen shall

deem in the best interest of the Town and \$7,667.00 to be paid by the issuance of a two year note with interest at such a rate as the selectmen shall deem in the best interest of the Town).

2nd Amendment passed, Article as Amended passed by a vote of YES 87 NO 17. 2/3 vote not needed as to be paid in one year.

- 31. The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$20,000.00 for the purpose of road repairs on Whipple Hill.
- 32. The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for the Home Health Care and Community Service.
- 33. The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$688.00 for the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
- 34. The Town voted to approve the removal of 4 lots, F-10, F-11, J-10, and J-11, in the Earl Howard Memorial Cemetery from burial lots use to allow for their conversion to landscaping.
- 35. The Town voted to allow the Richmond Fire Department Rescue Squad to sell the 1969 Ford E Series Van, the proceeds to be used for the Richmond Fire Department Rescue Squad for the purchase of additional equipment.
- 36. The Town voted to authorize the Conservation Committee, by majority vote of its members to expend as necessary the unappropriated fund in its accounts for the purchase of land or easements, or to defray other costs associated with such purchase.
- 37. The Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to accept private donations of land, interest in land, or money to be deposited into the Conservation Fund, for the purpose of contributing to the Local Matching portion, required for acquiring conservation land or interest in land and other costs associated therewith for permanent Conservation use under New Hampshire Land Conservation Investment Program. (LCIP) RSA 221-A and authorize the Selectmen to apply for and accept the State Matching Fund under the LCIP for the purpose of acquisition of the fee or lesser interest in conservation land., or take any action thereon. Said appropriated funds may be expended by majority vote of the Conservation Commission. Article passed.
- 38. The Town voted to allow a 2% discount on all property taxes paid in full within 30 days of notice.
- 39. The Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to sign contracts necessary for the operation of Town Affairs.

- 40. The Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the use of the Town in anticipaton of taxes.
- 41. The Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to accept on behalf of the Town any gift of money or property.
- 42. The Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Deeded Property.
- 43. No reports of Committees or Agents.
- 44. Motion made for Selectmen to appropriate the money recieved from the Hearse Insurance Fund of \$5,000.00 to repair the Town Hall. Motion failed.

Announcement - Expression of appreciation to Jennie Bennett for donating Harry Bennett's World War I flag to the Veteran's Hall, moved to convey these thanks to Jennie Bennett.

Motion made to direct the Selectmen to get estimated itemized costs of repairs to the Town Hall and submit costs to a Special Town Meeting to be convened as soon as can be reasonably done. Motion failed.

The Selectmen were asked to take under advisement the formation of a committee to study repairs, renovation of existing Town Hall, to the Fire Station. Several persons volunteered including George Blais, Henry Randall, and Orrin Holman.

1. To appropriate the sum of \$65,000.00 to fund a settlement of pending claims of Public Service Company of New Hampshire against the Town for alleged over-assessment of property taxes for the years 1981, 1982, 1985, 1986, and 1987, Which is about to become a judgement: and to raise said sum of \$65,000.00 over a three year period, with the first payment due in December, 1989. Borrowing on the credit of the Town by issuance of notes under the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) as presently in force, and to take any other relavant and necessary action relative to the subject matter. (Ballot vote by 2/3 majority required to adopt if borrowing is used).

Amendment made to borrow the money and pay over a 3 year period with 1st payment made in December 1989.

Question called, in favor of the Amendment; YES 20 NO 10.

Then back to article as amended, Motion made to pay \$10,000.00 this year and borrow \$55,000.00 to be paid back in the next three years. Motion 2nd.

Queston called and 2nd. Nays have it. Amendment defeated. Article as amended passed; YES 29 NO 5. Motion made to adjourn, and 2nd. Adjourned 9:00 P.M.

I herewith submit the report on the audit and examination of the Town of Richmond accounts and records for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1988. The enclosed financial statements are an integral part of this report and must be retained by the Town Clerk with other permanent Town records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

The accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector and Town Clerk were carefully verified and checked.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Comparative Balance Sheets show that assets exceed liabilities by the sum of \$242,781.10 for the year ended December 31, 1988. There was a net surplus of \$17,987.69 in 1987.

2. The Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures shows a net unexpended balance of appropriations amounting to \$18,544.11. In 1987 there was \$10,797.00 in unexpended balances.

3. The Statement of Estimated and Actual Revenues shows a net revenue surplus of \$243,768.91. The 1987 surplus amounted to \$194,212.13.

4. The Budget Summary indicates a net Budget surplus of \$200,997.12.

5. Accounts of the Town Treasurer, Town Clerk, Tax Collector, the Fire Department Equipment Fund have been summarized and tabulated.

AUDIT PROCEDURES

The accounts and records of Town Officials charged with the receipt, disbursement and custody of public funds, as indicated by the scope of the audit, were inspected and verified to the best of my knowledge and ability. All Town books and accounts were examined carefully and, where necessary, tests of certain records were made as part of the audit.

CERTIFICATION OF AUDIT

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

I am pleased to report that this year's major project was accomplished with the rebuilding of the pump on 25-M2.

During the year 1988 the fire department answered thirty-four calls. They consisted of one structure fire, four chimney fires, six wires down and burning, seventeen miscellaneous, two direct calls to fire for mutual aid, zero cover assignments to other towns, two grass and brush fires, and two vehicles and other accidents.

The structure fire was at the former Wakefield Inn now owned by Charles F. Hyrnewsky. The fire fighters from Richmond, Meadowood, Swanzey Center, East Swanzey, and Winchester who covered our station did an excellent job of saving the building and keeping the loss to a minimum. The fire was difficult to bring under control as the fire was in the partitions and the smoke was very heavy throughout. The fire spread from the first floor to the third floor. Firefighters using Scott Air Paks soon had the fire under control. I would like to congratulate all the fire officers and firefighters for a job well done.

The new numbering system installed last year has helped the departmet in answering calls with a quicker response time.

During the year of 1988, the Richmond Fire Department had eight members attend the Meadowood Fire School. Six members went to Winchester for three training sessions of L.P. Fires and The Control of Leaks and Accident Scene. Then four members attended a class on Tanker Shuttle and Water Supply in East Swanzey for a two day session. This drill was conducted by all three Swanzey companies. Seven members attended a one night session conducted by Dave Dean, C.D. Official.

The department has increased by five members, which brings the roster to six officers and nineteen members. We are always in need of more personnel. If you are interested in helping your town, please stop in and see us any Sunday morning or call any officer in the fire department.

We are in the process of having the tires on 25-M3 replaced and will have completed this by the end of the 1988 year.

The department would like to thank all of the town officials for their help during the year. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank all of the people of Richmond for their support in all of our fund raisers, but most of all for helping us to keep our fires low by being careful, checking smoke detectors and keeping your chimney clean.

Last but not least, we would like to thank the officers and men of the Richmond Fire Department for their help and support during 1988. Thanks for a job well done.

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

In addition, thanks go out to the police departments of Winchester, Fitzwilliam, and Swanzey for their assistance throughout the year and to Joe Davis and his family for the use of their gravel pit for our firearms qualifications.

Once again we can not stress enough the importance of citizen cooperation with your police department in the performance of our duties. Without your help many of the crimes could not be solved and most important, prevented. Thank you all for your continued support. Please remember to license your dog before May 1st. After May 1st, by law we must pick up your dog and deliver it to the Humane Society if it has not been licensed. This is costly to the dog owner who must pay a fine and pound fees and to the tax payers who pay the police officers to pick up the dog.

We are pleased to announce the appointment of our newest officer, Susan Pearsall. Sue has passed all of her qualifications and is now a certified police officer.

The Planning Board approved twelve subdivisons, creating thirty-eight lots on seven roads in town, three boundry line adjustments, and one site plan review.

The Board rewrote the subdivision regulations in 1988 and are proceeding with drafting and updating the zoning ordinances to present to the town at Town Meeting this March or later. We are updating the Capital Improvements Plan and hope to have that for Town Meeting.

The Board is monitoring the upgrading of the Greenwoods Road from Route 32 to the Tully Brook crossing as part of two conditionally approved subdivisions (one is still pending).

The Board gave conditional approval to a site plan review application of the Blessed Sacrament Community, Inc. for the development of a monastery, church "complex" on Martin Road. The Board also conditionally approved the creation of 8 building lots on the Greenwoods Road (off Rte. 119) for the BSC Inc.

We are functioning out of the Civil Defense Building. Space is at a premium. All old files and the map drawer are still in the old Town Hall. We now have a mailing address: 15 Winchester Road. We had full participation of elected and appointed members; we tried to enlist alternates with limited success. If any Town's people are interested in Planning Board business, contact the Board; an alternate slot is usually open. We don't anticipate litigation but you never know.

There are 3 pending subdivision applications that would create 16 new lots if approved as submitted as of this writing.

We intended to update the master plan this year. We have received an estimate of as much as \$5,000.00 to do this through the Southwest Regional Planning Commission. While the master plan did not anticipate the Richmond of today, the Board feels that it's rewriting can wait a year or two. The state projects that our population will drop by 1990 to 654; the Board disagrees with this projection and "foresees" the town's population racing towards (and very possibly surpassing) 1,000 by 1990. Richmond is a residential town with a very little commercial or business tax base. Our annual budget is comprised of (approximately): 66% school, 21% town, 13% county. As the school age population in town rises, so do our taxes. While this may be a simplistic analysis, the tax increases of the last two years point to the importance of planning if Richmond is to go gracefully into the 21st century.

ROAD AGENT'S REPORT

This past summer was well spent on getting the manual labor done of the town roads. Brush was cut and chipped on Morgan, Monument, Mill, Sprague and Rabbit Hollow Roads, along with a part of Martin, Whipple Hill and Lang Roads. Aside from the regular routine work, such as cleaning culverts, ditching water from storm damage and beavers, the roads were graded and raked. Patching and sealing was also done. The Whipple Hill Road was widened from Pudding Hill to the Warwick. Mass. state line. Extensive work has been done on the southern end of the Fish Hatchery Road by widening, ditching and shimming with hot top and sealing. A thousand (1000) yards of crushed gravel was put on the upper end of Whipple Hill Road and a large culvert was purchased to replace the wooden bridge on Rabbit Hollow Road. A considerable amount of stone work was done building up headers on culverts on the Fish Hatchery, Mill and Bullock Roads. Wing walls have been restoned underneath the Whipple Hill Bridge. Signs and signposts were installed and replaced, some two or three times! A new chainsaw was also purchased.

I want to thank Peter Renzleman of Tree Grower for cutting down four (4) dead oak trees on Whipple Hill Road. Also want to thank Gary Carle for working with me through the summer months (and they were hot ones!). I want to thank the townspeople for their compliments and for letting me know of any road problems that need my attention.

TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER REPORT

Between July 1987 and June 1988, we experienced more fires than normal. The three leading causes of forest fires were again children, fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden and debris burning. All Causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the reponsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden, Concord Forest Protection Headquarters at (603) 271-2217, or local Forest Ranger.

On January 1, 1989, the Deceptive Forestry Business Practice Law (RSA 224:54) goes into effect. This law, in summary, states that a person is guilty of a misdemeanor if, in the course of buying or selling a forest product, uses a false weight or measure for falsely determining any quality or quantity of a forest product. CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT

During 1988 your Conservation Commission has met regularly and worked productively in several areas.

The Commission is pleased to take this opportunity to announce the establishment of the Harry J. Bennett Memorial Fund. This fund is in honor of the Commission's founding member and first chairman. Harry was a long-serving force for sound environmental practices at county and state levels, and a continuing advocate for conservation education. It is entirely fitting, therefore, that the interest from the fund will be expended "to promote within the Town of Richmond a greater appreciation and understanding of the need for conservation of New Hampshire's natural resources...Such promotion (may) include...provision of library materials, scholarships or tuition assistance for Richmond residents pursuing studies in conservation or resource management, or the sponsorship of local education programs..."

One of the uses of the fund will be to sponser one or more young persons from Richmond to attend the Youth Conservation Camp run by the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests. Participation in this camp can be an important introduction to understanding and appreciation of the natural world. Applicants (male or female) must have completed the eighth grade and be between 13 and 18 years of age. Anyone interested in applying should contact any member of the Commission before May first.

Another major accomplishment was the establishment of the Richmond Conservation Task Force (see separate Task Force report).

In February the Commission reluctantly accepted the resignation of Stewart James. In recognition of his thirteen years of service as a commissioner, Mr. James was named an Honorary Life Member of the Commission.

Later that month the Selectmen, acting upon the Commission's unanimous vote, appointed Augustus Merwin to fill the vacancy. Commissioner Stanley Bartram agreed to take over as treasurer from Mr. James.

In April, Commissioners Bartram and Calabro attended an environmental conference held at Tufts University.

At the commissions invitation, Ms Mary E Dowse, Assistant State Geologist, participated in a field investigation of the Harris Soapstone Quarry on Parker Hill. This quarry, and adjacent deposits, has been established as a mineralogical site of considerable interest. The quarry has been visited by geologists from around the world, and has been the subject of more that twenty scientific papers. In the coming year the commission will seek to establish permanent protection for this important site.

At the close of the year, the commission had established a closer working relationship with the Richmond Planning Board. It is hoped that this closer cooperation will help insure better protection for the Town's natural resources as the pressures of an increasing population continue.

CONSERVATION TASK FORCE REPORT

The Richmond Conservation Task Force was established this year to meet the requirements of the Land Conservation Investment Program (LCIP). By statute (RSA 221-A) the General Court mandated that the LCIP would administer the selection and funding of land to be protected by the Trust for New Hampshire Lands. The Selectmen appointed the five members of the Conservation Committee, plus Edward Martin, Augustus Merwin, Henry Randall, and Joseph Thibodeau to seve on the Task Force.

At the Task Force's first meeting, Augutus Merwin was elected as chairman and Norman Tandy volunteered to serve as secretary.

One of the group's first priorities was to place a warrant article before the Town Meeting to enable the Task Force to accept private donations of land of money, and to authorize the selectmen to apply for and accept state matching funds under the Land Conservation Investment Program. A second article was placed to allow the Conservation Commission to expend unappropriated funds for the purchase of land or easements, or to defray associated costs. Both articles were passed by the Town Meeting without comment or dissenting vote.

Later in the year, Conservation Comissioner Stewart James resigned. He was replaced on the Commission by Augustus Merwin, with Rae Carrier being appointed to fill the Task Force vacancy caused by Mr. Merwin's move.

The Task Force's most immediate goal was to implement the wishes of Jennie B. Bennett and her husband, the late Harry J. Bennett, in establishing a protective easement for "Bennett's Gorge." The gorge occupies that part of Brickyard Brook between Route #119 and the Old Turnpike Road. Cascading down over a series of ledges and boulders, the brook forms alternating pools and waterfalls, all within a dense cover of mixed hardwoods and conifers. In a well-attended public ceremony at the Town Library on August 25th, Mrs. Bennett and members of the Task Force formally signed a conservation easement. This legal document, which becomes an official part of the property's deed, extends permanent protection to the site, binding upon all future owners. Title to the land remains with Mrs. Bennett and subsequent owners. The conservation easement itself is deeded to the Town of Richmond, with the Conservation Commission charged with overseeing and enforcing its provisions.

We anticipate that the fine example of Mrs. Bennett's concern for the future health of the town's natural environment will stimulate similar thoughtful provisions by others.

At the end of the year, the Task Force continues negotiations with several other property owners. We strongly encourage anyone wishing to explore the many options available for permanent protection of the aesthetic and ecological values of their land to contact any member of the Conservation Task Force.

RICHMOND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REPORT

Richmond's Emergency Management Department (C.D.), like other offices in town, experienced a mixed year of successes. Work on the C.D. building came to an abrupt halt when "new" police needs were presented to the Selectmen. The proposed bathroom was converted to an evidence room and the furnace room became a youth interrogation room. Additionally the police constructed a new wall to secure themselves from the meeting/training room. Along with other imposed modifications, I feel that the town lost a lot of their capability for the building to function in a true emergency. Additionally, the town seems to have lost a facility that served as a focal point for other town agency meeting and training needs. It is hoped that with the new building proposals, this diffucult situation can be alleviated and the C.D. building can return to its designed function.

Apart from the building difficulties, Emergency Management with State assistance, held a radiological training workshop for fire/rescue personnel. The town once again participated in the annual test for Vermont Yankee emergency notification. Possibly the most significant achievement was the writing of a Hazardous Material Emergency Response Plan for the town through a coordinated effort with fire/rescue. Emergency Management purchased both safety equipment and protective clothing for fire/rescue to deal with minor hazardous material accidents. Additionally, budget was expended to purchase A.V. equipment to supplement the training of emergency agencies. Lastly, late in the fall a septic line was installed near the back of the C.D. building. Hopfully in the near future a lavatory can be installed and clean up landscaping can be completed.

These services have been supported to the greatest extent possible by Medicare, Medicaid, other insurances, grants and patient fees. Services that were not covered by other funding have been supported by your town. In 1988, town support is projected to be \$1,574.00

We recommend an appropriation of \$3,000.00 to continue home care services at the current level.
