SELECTMEN'S SPECIAL REPORT

We are pleased to present the following Selectmen's report for the year 1952.

We have had another successful year financially as well as otherwise. You will note by the Balance Sheet that for the first time in many years that the Town of Seabrook is completely out of debt. On January 1, 1952, the net debt of the Town was \$1,953.46. When the books were closed on December 31, 1952 we had a net Surplus of \$4,397.91, a change of over \$6,000.00, not many towns can boast of such a favorable position.

Our Police Dept., Civil Defense, Highway and all other departments have operated fully and reliably. The heads of these departments have been very cooperative and have strived to make each more efficient.

During the year a new Tank Truck and Pumper Combination was added to our Fire Department. The purchase of this new truck was voted by a special article in the 1952 Town Warrant but as no provisions were made for equipment this was bought out of the regular Fire Department Funds, partially accounting for the overdraft shown on this account.

There is included in this year's Warrant an article calling for the purchase of a respirator. This, we feel would be a valuable piece of equipment, not only at fires but also for many emergency uses where oxygen is needed. Several members of the Department are well trained in the use of this device and if purchased the whole department personnel would be made familiar with the operation of same.

Since August 1st the Highway Department has been handling the Collection of Rubbish throughout the Town and Beach. This has been done on an hourly basis and it

seems to be the only fair way the job can be done satisfactorily as each year more and more people are vacationing at Seabrook Beach and a contractor bidding on this job in the spring has no way of knowing the extent of the services required of him through the summer months.

After much negotiating, the Town has received the Deed to the Streets and Right of Ways on the Easterly side of Ocean Boulevard from the Sun Valley Co. With the financial assistance of several of the cottage owners some of these streets were improved during the summer, this saved the Town considerable money.

There is included in the Warrant a series of articles pertaining to the repairs of these streets, they will be explained fully at the meeting.

There are two different articles in the warrant that call for the purchase of trucks for use by the Town departments. We believe that this can be done without any effect on the Tax Rate and should result in more and better service from those departments. Means of financing the purchase of the trucks will be presented when the warrant is acted upon.

We have prepared the estimated budget for the ensuing year and it is included in this Town Report. It is somewhat less than the 1952 Budget and barring a large increase in the School Department expenses, an expected increase in new valuation should result in a very favorable tax rate this year.

The Board meets each Monday evening at 7:30 to transact town business. The public is welcome to attend these meetings and discuss any problems pertaining to Town affairs.

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall on Tuesday, March 10, 1953 at Ten O'Clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect by Australian ballot, a Town Clerk, one Selectman, Assessor and Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of Three years, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, three Constables, a Chief of Police and any other officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the expense of the general government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for Highway and Bridges, for the support of the Town Poor and all other necessary expenditures for the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to allow the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$134.98, the state to contribute \$899.84 for Town Road Aid.

Article 5. To see what action the Town will take in regards to a balance of the Veterans Memorial Park Special Appropriation of \$500.00.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for advancement of the Town through publicity and promotional services of the Seacoast Regional Development Association cooperating with other regional committees, a sum not exceeding One-One Hundredth of One Percent of Assessed Valuation, namely \$200.00.

Article 7. To see what action the Town will take regarding a Polling Place for future Town Meetings.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to install a Fire Well at Seabrook Beach. Location of same to be determined by the Board of Selectmen and the Board of Fire Engineers, and to raise and appropriate money for same

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to establish the salary of the Health Officer at One Hundred Dollars per year.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new Two-Ton Heavy Duty Dump Truck for use by the several departments of the Town.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars to purchase a new Snow Plow and Wing for the Highway Department.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Collector of Taxes additional compensation for services collecting the State Head Tax and to fix the amount thereof.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a New Two-Ton Heavy Duty Dump Truck for use by the several town departments, and for such purpose appropriate a sum not exceeding \$3,500.00.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to issue serial bonds under and in compliance with provisions of Revised Laws Ch. 72, and amendments thereto, in the principal amount not exceeding \$3,500.00 for the purpose of purchasing a New 2-Ton Heavy Duty Dump Truck for use by the several Town departments, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the time and place of payment of such bonds and the rate of interest, and to do whatever may be necessary to the issuance thereof.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to resurface repair and otherwise improve highways in the Town lying Easterly of Ocean Boulevard and for such purpose appropriate a sum not exceeding \$21,500.00.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to issue serial Bonds under and in compliance with provisions of Revised laws Ch. 72, and amendments thereto, in the principal amount not exceeding \$21,500.00 for the purpose of resurfacing, repairing and otherwise improving the highways in the Town lying Easterly of Ocean Boulevard and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the time and place of payment of such Bonds and the rate of interest and to do whatever may be necessary to the issuance thereof.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to resurface, repair and otherwise improve highways in the Town lying Easterly of Ocean boulevard, and for such purpose appropriate a sum not exceeding \$25,000.00.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to issue Serial Bonds under and in compliance with provisions of Revised Laws Ch. 72, and amendments thereto, in the principal amount not exceeding \$25,000.00 for the purpose of resurfacing, repairing and otherwise improving the Highways in the Town lying Easterly of Ocean Boulevard and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the time and place of payment of such Bonds and the rate of interest thereof and to do whatever may be necessary to the issuance thereof.

Article 19. Upon petition of Lester M. Knowles and 24 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundreds Dollars to purchase a respirator, same to be a part of the Fire Department equipment.

Article 20. Upon petition of Joseph E. Messier and 12 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars to build a parking area on a piece of Town owned land on River street near pier.

Article 21. Upon petition of Frank G. Randall and 22 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44 to install and maintain a street light on Pole No. 531J on Walton Street near the residence of Frank G. Randall.

Article 22. Upon petition of Ralph L. Gilmore and 17 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44 to install and maintain a street light on Pole No. 82J at the intersection of Pine Street and Lafayette Road.

Article 23. Upon petition of Harry S. Small and 9 others; To see if the Town of Seabrook will vote to instruct the Selectmen to have a valuation book of all the Taxable property of the Town printed for the year 1953 and every fourth year after. This book to be in the hands of the residents not later than December 1, of the year the book is printed, and to raise and appropriate enough money for the same.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to lease to Carlyle Randall, a part of Town owned Marsh land near Farm Lane Dock, for use as a Boat Yard for the storage and repair of Boats, said lease not to interfere with the Public Use of Farm Lane Dock, so called, and to allow the Selectmen to arrange the terms and conditions of said Lease.

Article 25. To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

Article 26. To hear the report of the Water Committee and to act thereon.

Article 27. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets — Dec. 31, 1951 - Dec. 31, 1952:

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1951 and December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition changed from a Net Debt of \$1,953.46 to a Surplus of \$4,397.91 in 1952.

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$2,716.30, plus a net revenue surplus of \$3,461.49, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$6,177.79.

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1952, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1952, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased from \$1,546.54 to \$6,897.91, in 1952, as shown by the following statement:
