#### WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Strafford in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Strafford on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Public Welfare including Old Age Assistance and Soldiers' Aid.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to accept the fifteen foot wide private way, known as Lake View Avenue and now owned by Harold W. Brown and Bessie M. Brown of Strafford and running from Water Street, so called, southerly up the hill to the end of said Brown's property, as presently laid-out. (By petition).
- 6. To see if the town will vote to accept a private way (previously graded and graveled at the expense of the owner and adjacent property owners) extending from the cellar hole in Brown's Pasture, so called, and running thence to Bow Lake and along the rear of property of camp owners to the boundry line of property of Brown and Caverly as plotted and laid out, and as described in Warranty Deed of Gift in fee simple previously tendered to the town by the owners. (By Petition).
- 7. To see if the town will accept Town Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$912.40.

- 8. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500 the town's share for State Aid Construction of Parker Mt. Road.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$200.00) for repairs to the Town Hall and extra money needed for shingling.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for a better fire truck for Crown Point.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 12. To see if the town will accept the report of the Soldiers' Memorial Committee and raise and appropriate any money for the same.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$97.00) for the Lakes Region Association.
- 14. To see if the town will grant a two percent discount on property taxes paid in full within thirty days of date of issue of collector's warrant.
- 15. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 16. To see if the town wishes to take any action in regard to zoning the town.
- 17. To hear the report of the special committee on camp roads and see what action the Town wishes to take.
- 18. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

### SCHOOL WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Strafford qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the ninth day of March 1954 at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
- To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools and the payment of statutory obligations of the district for the ensuing year, to be assessed by the selectmen less state aid and other estimated income certified by the school board.
- 9. To see what action the district will take in the selection of a suitable site for a new elementary school and authorize the acquisition of any real property for the location of such building.

- 10. To see if the district will vote to build and equip a new elementary school and to see what sum the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction, equipment and furnishing of such new elementary school and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary for its location; and whether the district will vote to raise such sum through issuance of serial notes or Bonds upon the Credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bonds Statute, N. H. Revised Laws, Chapter 72, and any amendments thereto.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to appoint a building committee consisting of three persons to be appointed by the school district to advise with the school board in selecting a location for the new school and to supervise the construction of said building providing that the plans and specifications and the selection of a site for the new school shall finally be approved by the school board acting alone as required by law, and to further authorize the school board to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary in connection with the construction and equipping of said school.
- 12. If article (10) is adopted to see if the district will vote to authorize the trustees of trust funds to pay over these accumulated funds to the school board as agents of the school district to be used in the construction of a new school building.

(Articles 9, 10, 11, and 12 by petition)

- 13. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise by taxation and appropriate for new equipment.
- 14. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on the debt.

Strafford and Northwood, the only districts in Supervisory Union No. 44 giving examinations to under-age children for admission to Grade I, have decided to discontinue this practice. Beginners must be six years old by the following January 1, in order to enter school in September. By act of the last legislature, the compulsory school attendance law has been extended to cover ages six through sixteen. Lee has joined the Oyster River Cooperative District, No. 2, and will be replaced in this union by Milton. Strafford entertained the Joint Board of the union at Austin Hall, December 29.

The Trustees of Austin-Cate Academy have offered to reduce the tuition rate for Grades VII and VIII next year from seven-eighths to three-quarters of the high school rate. This will result in an estimated annual saving to the district of over \$1,050.00. The Academy was again host to the annual Field Day in June, under the direction of elementary physical education teacher Mrs. Holloway. Mr. Viggiano kindly assisted by operating his own tape recorder to furnish music for the marching and formations.

At the last annual district meeting, a special committee was appointed to investigate the prospects of a new elementary school. They have visited other buildings and inquired as to costs. Articles have been placed in the Warrant for this year's annual meeting, and a figure has been placed in the budget by the school board for this purpose.
