To the Inhabitants of the Town of Strafford in the County of Strafford in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Strafford Elementary School in said Strafford on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

PLEASE NOTE: Articles 2-20 will be taken up at 8 P.M.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Public Welfare including Old Age Assistance and Soldier's Aid.

4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 and the State will allocate \$3,000.00 for Class II Construction on Province Road.

5. To see if the Town will accept Town Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$985.26 and to which the State will contribute \$6,568.41.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for control of White Pine Blister Control.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Lakes Region Association.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$100.00 for Memorial Day.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$300.00 for improving swimming facilities of Water Street and Bow Lake.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$300.00 for maintenance of the Bow Lake Fire Department.

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$500.00 for operating the Town Library.

13. To see if the Town will grant any discount on Taxes paid within thirty-five days of mailing of tax bills.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the Town Dump and for control and operation of same.

15. To see if the Town will, as authorized by NH. RSA-35:1, raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for a capital reserve fund for the purpose of construction or reconstruction of Class V highways, and/or acquisition of additional or replacement fire fighting equipment, as may be required in the future; and to authorize the Selectmen to transfer to this fund any unencumbered surplus funds remaining on hand at the end of the fiscal year.

16. By Petition: To see if the Town will establish a Town Conservation Commission as set forth in RSA-36A.

17. By Petition: To see if the Town will give aid in eradicating Poison Ivy in the Town.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the Town Treasurer's salary from \$225.00 to \$300.00.

19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TENTATIVE WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Strafford qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Strafford School in said district on the 13th day of April 1967, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

2. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen. and pass any vote relating thereto.

3. To choose agents and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

4. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district.

5. To see if the district will vote to accept the provisions of Public Law 89-10, (Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965), and to appropriate such funds as may be made available to the district under said Federal Act for such particular projects as may be determined by the school board. Further, to see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

6. To see if the district will vote to accept the provisions of RSA 195-A (as amended) providing for the establishment of an Area school or schools located in Rochester to serve grades 7 through 12 from the school districts of Rochester and Strafford in accordance with the provisions of the plan on file with the district clerk.

7. To see if the district will vote to transport high school pupils, grades 9 through 12, to the Rochester Area School.

8. To see what sum the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction, equipment and furnishings for the addition to the Strafford School of two classrooms and adequate storage space and whether the district will vote to authorize the issue of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the School Board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale, the time and place of payment of the principal and in accordance with the municipal bond statute, New Hampshire Revised Laws, Chapter 72, and any amendments relating thereto.

9. If the district has adopted Article 8 for the addition, to see if the district will vote to appoint a building committee to consist of the School Board and three persons appointed by the moderator and the School Board to supervise the construction of said addition, provided that the plans, specifications for the addition shall be approved by the School Board acting as required by law and the School Board be further authorized to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary in connection with the construction of said addition.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

### OFFICE OF THE PRINCIPAL

### Summer Reading Program --- TITLE 1, ESEA

The Strafford School conducted a Summer Reading Program for six weeks. Thirty pupils were registered and there was only one drop-out. These pupils were divided into two groups, as students from grades one through eight were participating, and this involved a wide range of reading abilities and necessitated the use of an abundance of materials.

The lower group included grades one through four. There were fifteen in this group which was subdivided into four smaller groups as the result of a testing program. These children were worked with first, as a group. Phonics and word recognition were emphasized through the Visual Aid Filmstrips by Ginn & Company for Primary Reading Classes. Also, Lyons and Canahan phonics books were used. The Dolch Word Games were used for vocabulary building.

After the groups had been worked with, individual instruction in reading was given. Considerable use was made of the tape recorder, as well as the SRA 11a lab. and reading training films. While the teacher was working with individuals, other children were working in groups utilizing available film strips and drill games.

The upper group was made up of students from grades five through eight inclusive. Results from Stanford Achievement Tests were used as a basis for grouping these people for basic reading. The SRA Reading for Understanding lab. was used and Placement Tests were given at both the beginning and again at the end of the session. It was very satisfying to the students for them to find that the large majority placed on an average of two grades higher on the last test.

A very substantial library for "Pleasure Reading" was

made available and a period allocated for this phase of the reading program. Many in the upper group preferred to spend their morning-break for pleasure reading.

The attitude of the children was definitely positive, due to the fact that the students realized that they were not being graded. Because of this, they did not feel frustrated.

All materials used in the program were of an entirely different nature than those which the children had been accustomed to in their regular reading work. Much of this very valuable reading material, which was made available through this special program, will be utilized as supplementary reading work during this school year.

It has been gratifying to learn, now that three weeks of the present school year has passed, that those students who participated in the Summer Remedial Reading Program are showing remarkable improvement in their regular classroom subjects. Several, who had been promoted on condition because of a reading problem, are found to be working up to grade level.

We feel that much progress was made as a result of this Summer Reading Session, not only in actual reading, but also in leadership, cooperation, responsibility, and perhaps most of all, a better and fuller use of leisure time.

### STRAFFORD SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools:

It gives me much pleasure to present this report of the health program as carried out in the towns of Barrington, Epsom, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford during the school year of 1965-66. I feel this has been a very successful year with complete dental health programs being carried on in the towns of Epsom and Northwood, plans being made by Barrington for such a program in the coming year, and a full-scale tuberculin testing program with follow up x-rays having been completed in all of the schools except Epsom. Here again, arrangements have been made for Epsom to participate in 1966-67.

Each school has had its share of the various contagious diseases and skin eruptions, but these were well controlled and presented no major problem. The parents were most cooperative in this matter, as well as in obtaining professional care and treatment for any reported physical defects. Such cooperation is a necessity in carrying out an effective school health program, and I wish to express my sincere appreciation for it.

The following is a brief summary of the health services provided in each school during this past year: Tests, Inspections, Etc.

During this school year, glasses were provided for one child by the Concord Lions' Club, and the New Hampshire Sight Conservation Program provided eye examinations and glasses for four more children.

Preschool clinics for registering children for grade 1 were held during the spring of 1966, and were attended by 24 children at Barrington, 30 at Epsom, 24 at Northwood, 12 at Nottingham and 12 at Strafford. These clinics were conducted as in previous years except in Strafford. There, the children were accompanied to school by one or both parents. Registration was done by the principal and the nurse checked vaccinations and discussed with the parents any health problems which the child might have. Each child and parent was given an opportunity to visit in the first grade classroom.

The Heaf Tuberculin Test was administered in four of the schools with 255 students and faculty members taking advantage of this service in Barrington, 194 in Northwood, 122 in Nottingham and 137 in Strafford. Later an x-ray clinic was held at the Northwood Elementary School. The necessary equipment and technicians to run it were provided by the N.H. Tuberculosis and Health Association. Chest x-rays were taken of 48 people at this clinic.

Dental programs for cleaning teeth and receiving applications of topical fluoride (this solution is known to reduce decay in the teeth) as well as programs to provide fillings and/or extractions were organized in both Epsom and Northwood.

The Epsom programs were jointly sponsored by the New Hampshire Bureau of Dental Health and the Epsom Parent-Teachers Organization, while those in Northwood were sponsored by the New Hampshire Bureau of Dental Health, the Harvey Lake Women's Club and the Northwood Parent-Teachers Association. Contributions were also received from numerous organizations and businesses in Northwood. The dental health committee members in both towns should be commended for the services they performed in setting up these clinics, keeping records, and in providing transportation when needed.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Martineau, Mr. Houghton, members of the School Boards, the teachers, the parents and the children for their consistent helpfulness.

School opened in September with the addition of Mrs. Ruth Rigor da Eva to teach Grade 2. We were again fortunate this year to secure the services of Mrs. Sarah Huckins as a part-time teacher to assist a need in those areas which were benefited.

Due to an increase in enrollment and the additional teacher, it was necessary this year to partition the auditorium and make available a temporary additional classroom. It seemed administratively expedient to assign the seventh and eighth grades to this room with Mrs. Scribner. Surprisingly this has not interfered with the lunch program, and vice versa the lunch program has not interfered with the class.

You are encouraged to read the evaluation of the summer reading program which was held this summer for six weeks under the direction of Mrs. Irene Scribner and Miss Eva Karandanis. We feel that this has been a very effective program. This was a Title I project under Public Law 89-10 and was paid for by federal funds. We were also able through this project to procure such special equipment as a tape recorder, psychomatic tach-o-matic, phono-viewer, filmstrips, photo copy machine, and additional reading material, which is currently being used throughout the year.

Your school board and superintendent have spent much time studying the feasibility of an authorized regional enrollment area arrangement with Spaulding High School, Rochester, New Hampshire. At this writing, it is hoped that before the next annual meeting a brochure describing the advantages of an area school will be prepared for distribution for all interested citizens. An "AREA" school is a regional school, which may be elementary or secondary; and which when approved by the communities involved, shall be the assigned school for all the resident elementary or secondary pupils of the school districts, or portions thereof, within a region which is established to served.

In conclusion we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation given us during the school year by the school board, citizens, faculty, and children of Strafford.
