## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE Warrant for 1978 Annual Meeting of the Town of Rumney

To the inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton and State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon at which time the polls shall be opened for balloting on Article 1 and shall close not earlier than 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon and you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Thursday the 16th day of March, next, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon for the second session of the town meeting at which time action will be taken upon the remaining articles in this warrant.

Article 1: To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2: To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against one of the sums appropriated under this article as follows:

Purpose Amount
Town Library \$2,000.00
Amount of set-off \$2,000.00

Article 3: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,000.00 for the maintenance of its highways and bridges, and to authorize withdrawal of \$5,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against the amount appropriated under this article.

Article 4: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to trade in the GMC Highway Department Dump Truck for a new Dump Truck, and to authorize withdrawal, for use as a set-off against the sum appropriated in this article, of the sum of \$4,700.00 from the Highway Department Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 5: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate to purchase a new snowplow and wing for the Highway Department, and to raise said sum by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of a note or notes of the Town pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:8. (Affirmative action on this article requires a two-thirds vote.)

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for equipment for the Highway Department.

Article 7: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 to defray the costs of operating the Fire Department during the ensuing year and to authorize withdrawal of \$5,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against the amount appropriated under this article.

Article 8: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be added to the Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 9: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to purchase FM communications equipment for the Fire Department.

Article 10: To see what action the Town will take with respect to the reorganization of the Fire Department. (This article inserted by petition.)

Article 11: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the costs of maintenance of the Town Dump during the ensuing year, and to authorize withdrawal of \$5,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against the amount appropriated under this article.

Article 12: To see if the Town will vote to authorize and direct the Selectmen to appoint a full-time Police Chief.

Article 13: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to purchase a new police cruiser.

- Article 14: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the costs of operation of the Police Department during the ensuing year.
- Article 15: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$482.44 in order to secure from the state the sum of \$3,216.29. for Town Road Aid.
- Article 16: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,060.00 for the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc., and to authorize the Selectmen to use, as a set-off against the amount appropriated under this article, the sum of \$1,585.00 from the Anti-Recession Fiscal Assistance Funds received by the Town under the provisions of Title II of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, and interest thereon.
- Article 17: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to revise and update the Town Tax Map.
- Article 18: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Rumney Planning Board.
- Article 19: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Baker River Audio Visual Center which was established in 1974 as the result of a federal grant.
- Article 20: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Mooselaukee Health Center in Warren, New Hampshire.
- Article 21: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and pay the obligations of the Town.
- Article 22: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell and convey or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town by any Tax Collector's deed.
- Article 23: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,884.00 for ambulance service.
- Article 24: To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift from the Rumney Firemens' Auxiliary of the tile well attached plastic pipe and field stone and cement work that is part of the old Pound Hill Spring, so-called.

Article 25: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept, on behalf of the Town, a lease from Bar-Don, Inc. of a tract of land on the shore of Stinson Lake to be used as a public beach and recreational area.

Article 26: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell, for such price as they consider to be reasonable and in the best interests of the Town, the small tract of land measuring 70' x 75' x 65' x 60', heretofore used by the Town as a gravel pit, and right of way thereto conveyed to the Town of Rumney by W.W. Downing by deed dated April 25, 1925 and recorded in the Grafton County Registry of Deeds, Book 586, Page 230.

Article 27: To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### PEMI-BAKER HOME HEALTH AGENCY

The continuing support of the Town of Rumney has made available to all Townspeople the services which have made it possible for people to remain at home when they might otherwise be institutionalized for lack of Home Nursing Care.

The Registered Nurses, Homemaker-Home Health Aides have made 453 calls this year (217 last year) in Rumney. We are still in the process of securing the services of a Physical Therapist which is a service that has been found needed in the area.

The Free Blood Pressure, Diabetic Screening Clinics and New Baby Visits have been offered.

An Immunication Clinic for Pre-Schoolers is scheduled. The changing requirements of immunizations for children should make this a well-attended free clinic. Information on all clinics, which are free, are published in the local newspaper and on the local radio station.

### REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Forest fire control in New Hampshire is a joint state and town responsibility (RSA 224).

The Director, Division of Forests and Lands (State Forester) appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy fire wardens in each town upon the recommendation of the selectmen.

The local forest fire warden is responsible for forest fire prevention and fire suppression activities in his town. He regulates the kindling of outside fires when the ground is not covered with snow by the issuance of written permits only when the conditions are safe. He is responsible for suppression with the town/city and state sharing the cost. Suppression costs in excess of 1/4 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town are assumed by the state.

The state provides training for the local fire organization and helps coordinate activities between towns. The state also supports local forces with backup personnel, equipment, and supplies for suppression and prevention.

This combination of state and town cooperation, started in 1893, works well for New Hampshire has enjoyed one of the smallest acreage losses due to forest fires in the United States for the past 25 years.



# RUMNEY SCHOOL BOARD BUDGET CONSIDERATIONS FOR 1978-79

The Rumney School District budget for fiscal year 1978-79 is \$340,371, an increase of \$19,096 or 5.9% over last year. The budget can be broken into three categories as follows:

The proposed elementary school budget represents an increase of 2.6% over the present budget.

- 1) A 6% annual inflation rate has increased the cost of school district reports, books, audio-visual materials, teaching supplies, office supplies and postage, graduation expenses, heating oil, phone service, electricity, insurance and new equipment.
- 2) Salary increases reflect the rate of inflation as well as an attempt to bring salaries up to the level of comparable positions in neighboring school districts resembling Rumney in size and financial status.
- 3) The board would like to restore the music/art position that it eliminated last year.
- 4) In response to the federal law regarding education of the handicapped, the budget includes a half-time aide for an emotionally disturbed child and a small consultant's fee for occupational therapy. The board feels it can provide these services less expensively by educating handicapped children in the district than by sending them elsewhere.
- 5) The building repair budget has been underfunded in the past. In addition, the district faces major problems with the heating system and drainage problems behind the 7th and 8th grade rooms.
- 6) The budget includes a sum for negotiation expenses since the board must negotiate a new contract with the Rumney teachers next fall.

These increases are off-set by elimination of debt service payments, elimination of the school board secretarial position, and a reduction in funds for assemblies, field trips and testing costs.

Plymouth Area High School tuition has decreased from \$1,712 this year to \$1.643 per student for 1978-79. However, with a small class of graduating seniors and a twenty student Russell School eighth grade class, the town of Rumney anticipates sending 90 students to high school next year.

The Supervisory Union #48 budget for fiscal year 1978-79 is \$105.152, an increase of \$3,701 or 3.6% over this year. This represents an increase of \$124 for the Rumney School District.

The Russell School cost per pupil was \$1,008 for the last school year. the second lowest per pupil cost in the supervisory union. Rumney's 1976-77 transportation costs of 28 cents per mile or \$49.18 per pupil were by far the lowest in the union. The Rumney School Board is seeking to maintain a quality educational program for the children of the district while keeping the cost to Rumney taxpayers as low as possible.

### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Significant progress in education requires not only knowledge and skill, but also patience and time. Education is a process whereby all people can gain the knowledge, skills, and attitudes which will make them useful citizens and be able to contribute to our democratic society. Classrooms are not teacher dominated but learning centers with pupils thinking, questioning, creating, and pursuing those problems that are pertinent to the society in which we are living. The learning process is uppermost in our minds because it is impossible to teach or learn everything, especially since it is soon obsolete and oft-times forgotten. This is not to say that we will not teach basic education — the three r's — but it is through the process and not subject matter that schools have pupils "Thinking".

With these ideas in mind teachers are resource people rather than someone who gives information and asks for its return a few days later. A teacher becomes the center of learning by guiding, counseling, and stimulating students. The feeling for this educational process is a challenge and a tremendous responsibility for our educators. The quality of the child's education depends on the ability of his instructors and the quality of teaching he receives. The staff in Rumney is an excellent one and deserves the support and praise of the community in the manner in which they perform their duties and responsibilities.

Human talent is a major source of wealth — education makes progress possible — the price of educational excellence is an investment —. The success of the total educational program comes largely from the capacity and willingness of students, parents, faculty, administrator, and school board members to develop a positive rapport. A relationship of mutual trust and confidence is of paramount concern. This can be achieved.

### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The school year began with two new faces on the faculty: Roland Good, a recent Penn State Graduate who teaches Science to grades 5-8 and provides also a Special Needs classroom experience in the morning, and Muriel Hall, an experienced teacher who teaches Math to grades 5-8 as well as Art, Music, and Phys. Ed. to the 5th graders.

We are fortunate to have received assistance under the Comprehensive Employment Training Act to hire two full-time teacher aides, Helen Partridge who works in a one-to-one tutorial program and Alice Tobin who is our transitional teacher aide for the first grade.

The Staff of Russell School continue to provide educational experiences, both in and out of the classroom, which help the growth of each individual child: Basic Skills subjects like Reading, Math, Language Arts, and Science and Social Studies; Physical Education experiences like Phys. Ed. classes, Body Movement, intramural, and Interscholastic Athletics; A field trip and assembly program which exposes all children to the resources of our locale as well as those depicted in films of far away places. Our Special Services Program continues to serve a variety of children with differing needs from remedial reading to emotional and physical handicaps. Public Law 94-142, which takes effect in September 1978, mandates that we provide such programs for all children who demonstrate the need.

Ms. Billie Gage, the school nurse, is screening the vision and hearing of all youngsters as well as providing consultation with students, staff, and parents regarding health, hygiene, and dietary problems which affect each child's growth and educational development. Bob Smith and his wife Mary continue to keep the school clean and shiny. Their time - much of which is above and beyond the call of duty - is of great benefit to the school and community. Mrs. Lyon is serving a record number of hot lunches each week in one of the finest hot lunch programs in the State.

As long as the community is willing to provide financial resources and human support to the school program, we will continue to have a school we all can be proud of.

### REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The following is a report of the health services of the Russell Elementary School for the school year 1977-1978.

Heights, weights, routine vision and hearing screening, health conferences, first aid treatment and assisting parents with health provider follow-up is all a part of the routine health work.

A dental program is being offered to the whole school this year with the help of Mrs. Herbert Stark, N.H. State Dental Hygienist.

Over 90% of all pre-school children are screened at the Pre-School Hearing and Vision Clinic each year at the Plymouth Elementary School through the combined efforts of the Plymouth Lions Club, the N.H. Dept. of Public Health and the school nurse. The pre-school hearing and vision clinic will be held April 14, 1978 for all four and five year old youngsters in your community. This clinic should be well publicized for all parents concerned.

Home visits are made as necessary or requested for any health problem.

Pre-school registration will be held in May again this year. To inform you of the required immunizations, they are as follows: Measles, German Measles, TB test within 1 year, DPT (three shots and a booster) DT booster (if indicated), Polio (3 drinks and a booster), a physical exam by a health care provider is required for all first graders.

I wish to thank the staff for their interest and aid in providing good health care for the children. I also thank the parents and students for their cooperation this past year.

# EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY FOR 1976 - 1977

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the Superintendent of Schools as per the following quotation: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report of the total salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district and their share of same. Said report shall be filed with the school board of each school district involved and shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrator, if any is in service in the union."

One half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuations. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$22,000 which was received by the Superintendent of Schools of Supervisory Union #48 during 1976-1977 was made up as follows: \$2,500 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$19,500 was prorated among the school districts comprising the Supervisory Union. Allowance for \$800 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The salary of the Assistant Superintendent during 1976-1977 was made up as follows: \$2,380 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$16,620 was prorated as stated above. Allowance for \$1,700 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.
