
This year, Patterson experienced an entirely new system of government (the two party government). This government, adapted from the Canadian Parliamentary System, and a constitution written by four students consists of twenty-five elected representatives. The Prime Minister and Deputy Prime Minister gain their seats if their party wins the majority of the twenty-five seats. Their counterparts, or the leaders of the party in minority, also gain seats. Thus, the total number of people in the Panthora is 29.

This year's constitution attempted to give the students more responsibility. For example, students were allowed complete control over the treasurer's book. Unfortunately, this proved to be a mistake, because during the course of the year, the Panthora had three student treasurers and the books were completely confused.

The constitution also, while trying to eliminate students not serious about their position, set the stage for a party full of sheep, who would vote as their P.M. voted. Also, the two party system's main function was to provide opposition and serious debate. The opposition, this year, was practically non-existent; therefore the two party system was destroyed.

In my opinion, the two party system could provide a good series of checks and balances. The Panthora could be a closer knit unit, working together for a common goal. It seems, many students at Patterson are not quite ready for a transition as great as this in so short a time as one year. I sincerely hope the Patterson students allow this system another year to function and support it more than they have this year.

In summary I say to all of you, the only way to correct the problems of this school and the world is to get involved. For it is only through active involvement that we may find a solution to these






SENIOR ASSEMBLIES COMMITTEE




