Chinese-born violinist **Shuyi Wang** started her music career at age five. After six years of professional classical music training at the High School Affiliated to Sichuan Conservatory of Music in China, Ms. Wang received the full scholarship invitation from Lynn Conservatory of Music. Mr. Wang is currently pursuing the Bachelor of Music degree in Violin Performance at Lynn Conservatory of Music with Guillermo Figueroa. Ms. Wang received music festival offers around the world. For example, the Spoleto Festival USA, 2020; the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, 2018; International Summer Academy in Mozarteum University Salzburg, 2015 and the Great Wall International Music Academy, 2015. Ms. Wang has been performed as a soloist for world-renowned musicians including Zakhar Bron, Elmar Oliveira, Ning Feng, Borivoj Martinic-Jercic, Kurt Sassmannshaus, and more. Beyond active in solo and chamber performances, Ms. Wang also enjoys orchestra performing. She has been worked with conductors such as Guillermo Figueroa, Lukas Beikircher, Mario Conti, Gerard Schwarz.

Pianist **Sheng-Yuan Kuan** has performed at the Kennedy Center, Weill Recital Hall, Taiwan National Concert Hall, and Musikverein in Vienna. She has been a featured artist at the Heifetz International Music Institute, KUAF/Fulbright Summer Chamber Music Festival, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra's Chamber Music by Candlelight series, Artscape Baltimore, the Sylvia Adalman Chamber Concert Series at Peabody Conservatory, Broward100, and various south Florida public library concert series.

Currently serving as staff collaborative pianist and affiliated faculty at Lynn University, Ms. Kuan is also a member of South Florida Chamber Ensemble, Scherzo Trio, and Femina Camera Trio. She holds degrees from the Yale School of Music, the Manhattan School of Music, and Peabody Conservatory. Her teachers have included Peter Frankl, Scott McCarrey and Constance Keene.
