

The library budget for 1976-77 \$352,500 went for set expenses, \$7,500 to equipment. The remaining \$130,000 was then divided up among the five dif-

The Right to be Forgotten (2006)

95% of delisting requests were to protect privacy

- Financial crimes served
- Sex crimes

Right to Erasure

- EU citizens may request that information about them be deleted
- RTBF = Delisting
- What information must be delisted?
- Sensitive information
- Information about minors
- Served crimes
- Does not serve public interest

The General Data Protection Regulation (2014)

7 Principles

- Lawfulness, transparency, and fairness
- Purpose limitations
- Data minimization
- Accuracy
- Storage limitation
- Security (Integrity & confidentiality)
- Accountability

The GDPR gives people enhanced protections against unnecessary data collection, use of data in unanticipated ways, and biased algorithmic decision-making.


- The request for consent must be clearly distinguishable, in an intelligible and easily accessible form, and use clear and plain language.
- Cookies, device identifiers, and IP addresses are entitled to the same level of protection as other personal data.



EU v. U.S.

- Privacy as a fundamental human right
- Freedom of Speech in the U.S. represents the greatest tension with the GDPR
- Move to make the GDPR an international human right
- Does not infringe on preservation & the historical record
- Is not the same as the Right to Privacy
