Australia's new National Disability Insurance Scheme

Dubbed [the “greatest nation building project on earth”](#), the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is up, operational and close to full rollout, at which point it will deliver \$22 billion in services and support to Australians each year. These funds go directly to people with disabilities and their families, who use it to access services from local providers, therapy centres and businesses.

Job Outlook

“It is expected that the NDIS will require an additional 90,000 workers over the next five years, almost doubling the current estimated workforce of 100,000. This represents one of the largest job creation opportunities in Australia’s history.”

Employment of **occupational therapists** is projected to grow 16 percent from 2019 to 2029, much faster than the average for all occupations (ABS,2021)
