

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 17269, Laws of Florida, Acts of the Legislature of 1935, requiring the taking of the census of the population of the State for the year of 1935, I have the honor to submit my report of the same.

The result of the census is contained in one volume, which in most part is given in tabular form, showing the general and steady growth of the State's population from 1830 to 1935. These tables show by race, sex and age periods the population of the counties, and other civil and political divisions, also the place of birth and the present occupation engaged in by our people.

### Introductory Notes

In 1821 the Territory of Florida was organized into two counties, Escambia and St. Johns. Escambia County, formerly known as "West Florida," comprised the territory west of the Suwannee River, and St. Johns County, formerly known as "East Florida," included the rest of the territory of Florida. The first Census presented herein, is that taken by the United States Government in the year of 1830.

During that period (1821-1830) the two original counties had been divided and subdivided, making seventeen counties in the first Census. Beginning with this Census, which reported a total population of 34,730, representing two races (18,185 white and 16,345 negro), this report brings up the population development of the State, showing each succeeding Census taken by the United States Government, and those taken by the State where the records are available, to and including the 1935 State Census, which reports a total population of 1,606,842 persons living in sixty-seven counties, and representing five different races of people, White, Negro, Indian, Chinese and Japanese. (Many Indians lived in Florida at the time of the first Census, but the record of their population is not available.)

The White and Negro races, which comprises more than 99.9 per cent of the entire population, are very evenly distributed throughout the State.

The Censuses presented herein that were taken by the State are for the years 1885, 1895, 1905, 1915, 1925 and 1935. All others were taken by the United States Government. This report is called the "Sixth State Census," but it is true that the State has taken the Census population regularly at each ten-year period since, and including 1837, but the records for those taken prior to the year 1885 are not at this time available.

This report is presented in the most part in tabular form, and the tables are so arranged that with the explanatory notes, it is easy to find any information that may be desired, relating to the Census. Comparisons with former Censuses are more frequently made with the 1930 United State Census for the reason that there have been so many new counties organized since the last State Census.

### Formation of Counties and Changes in Their Boundaries by Years

1845—Levy formed from Alachua and Hillsborough: Mosquito changed to Orange; part of Jackson added to Calhoun.

1846—Washington formed from Walton and Jackson. 1848—Holmes formed from Calhoun and Walton. 1849—Putnam formed from Alachua, Orange, Marion and St. Johns.

1850-Benton changed to Hernando.

1853-Sumter created.

1854—Volusia created. 1855—St. Lucie changed to Brevard and territory divided among Brevard, Dade and Volusia; Manatee and Liberty created.

1856—Lafayette and Taylor created. 1858—New River and Suwannee created from Columbia, and Clay formed from Duval.

1861-Baker formed from New River, and remaining portion of

New River changed to Bradford; Polk formed from Brevard.

1871—Boundaries of Polk and Sumter were changed.

1872—Part of Sumter given to Orange.

1873—Brevard boundary with Orange was changed; Jackson boundaries were changed; boundaries of Washington were changed. 1874-The boundaries of Brevard with Dade and Manatee were changed.

1875-Boundaries of Calhoun and Jackson were changed; bound-

aries of Duval and St. Johns were changed.

1877—Boundaries of Lafayette and Taylor changed; Levy acquired

territory from Marion.

1879—Brevard annexed part of Volusia; Jefferson and Leon boundaries were changed, and the boundaries of Orange with Polk and

Sumter were changed.

1887-Citrus was formed from Hernando; DeSoto formed from Manatee; Lee was formed from Monroe; Osceola was formed from Brevard and Orange; Pasco was formed from Hernando; Lake organized from parts of Orange and Sumter.

1905—St. Lucie was re-created, being formed from Brevard. 1909—Palm Beach was formed from Dade; Levy's boundary with Alachua was changed slightly, as also was boundary of Gadsden and

1911-Pinellas was formed from Hillsborough.

1913—Bay was formed from Calhoun and Washington; Seminole was formed from Orange.

1915—Broward was formed from Dade and Palm Beach; Okaloosa was formed from Santa Rose and Walton; slight boundary changes were made in Holmes, Jackson and Washington.

1917-Okeechobee was created from Osceola, Palm Beach and St.

Lucie.

1917—Flagler was created from St. Johns and Volusia.
1921—Dixie county was created from Lafayette.
1921—Union county was created from Bradford.
1921—Sarasota county was created from Manatee.
1921—Charlotte county was created from DeSoto.
1921—Hardee county was created from DeSoto.

Polk—(For James K. Polk).

Putnam—(For General Israel Putnam).

Sarasota—(From the Indian word applied to a prominent feature of the shore line known as Point of Rocks extending into the Gulf near Crescent Beach).

Santa Rosa—(For a saint of the Catholic Church).

Seminole—(From the name of an Indian tribe).

St. Johns—(From St. Johns River, called by Spanish explorers "San Juan Baptista"—St. John the Baptist).

St. Lucie—(For a saint of the Catholic Church).

Sumter-(For General Thomas Sumter, Revolutionary hero, for whom Fort Sumter was named).

Suwannee—(From the river now renowned in song; an Indian word said to be "Sawni," meaning "Echo").

Taylor—(For General Zachary Taylor).

Union—(From the common term expressing unity).

Volusia—(For a former town named for a settler known as Volus). Wakulla—(For a large spring; the word being Indian for "Mystery").

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Walton-(For Colonel Walton, a prominent Georgian).

Washington-(For George Washington).

#### INSTRUCTIONS TO ENUMERATORS

#### COUNTY ENUMERATORS

Before beginning the enumeration, get from the proper county officials a list of all precincts and incorporated places in your county, and see that their boundaries are clearly defined, and a map of the county if possible. Examine the Census of 1930, taken by the Federal Government, which we have sent you as a sort of a guide to its popu-

Every bonafide resident or inhabitant (and no others) should be

listed. (See definition of inhabitant, farther on.)

The information about each person must be legible and complete; that is, ages, occupation, birthplaces, etc., must not be omitted or marked unknown. Illegible reports cannot be paid for.

#### WHAT PERSONS TO BE ENUMERATED AND EXCLUDED

The census law requires the Commissioner of Agriculture to make an enumeration of "all the inhabitants of the several counties." An inhabitant is not necessarily a legal resident or voter, but at the same time every person who happens to be in the State at the time of the census is not regarded as an inhabitant. For the purpose of the census an inhabitant is defined as a person who dwells or resides permanently in a place; or one who has a fixed and permanent abode in a place, regardless of nationality or citizenship. Intention to reside continuously in a locality may sometimes determine the point. A bona-fide resident of the State is one who spends at least half of every year here, or has moved in recently with the intention of re-

Many families have one or more members who are away temporarily in other counties or states, traveling, visiting, attending school, or something of the kind, and inquiry should always be made for such absentees. Students attending school elsewhere, and sons in the army or navy, or on merchant vessels, should ordinarily be counted as residing with their parents, even if they are away most of the year; but sons or daughters who have gone to another part of the State to earn their living should be enumerated at the boarding places in the

communities where they work.

While the census is in progress there will, of course, be births,

marriages, deaths, removals, etc., but the population should be re-

presented as it was on April 8th, as nearly as possible.

Children born since then are not to be counted. If some member of the family has died or moved away between April 8th and the time you call, enter his name and the required information about him, and write (Died) or (Removed) after the name.

Persons away at school or elsewhere for a considerable period can

be marked (Absent).

#### INSTITUTIONS

Several counties contain educational, charitable, penal, or military naval institutions and C. C. Camps with a considerable number of students, patients, inmates, etc., living in dormitories or somethig of the kind, away from their relatives, and coming mostly from other countries than those in which they are located. Enumerators are not expected to enter such institutions, except to list the officials in charge with their families, who are more or less permanent residents. The inmates are to be reported by their relatives elsewhere, and information about them will also be sought from the officials in charge by direct inquiry from this office. There are in the State a few federal military or naval reservations, not part of any precinct, and those need not be counted at all, for we will get information about them through other channels.

#### RACE AND AGE

Be sure to put every age in its proper column for race and sex, for failure to do so would cause serious errors in the tabulations. The age called for is that at the last birthday. In the case of infants less than a year old, write "O" in the age column.

#### NATIVITY

All foreign-born adults should be asked if they are naturalized citizens of the United States. If they are, write N after the name of the country, and if they are aliens who have taken no steps toward

naturalization, write A.

Note that when a foreign-born man, or widow, becomes naturalized all his (or her) minor children living in the United States at the time can claim citizenship when they become of age, without any other effort on their part; but a wife does not acquire citizenship through the naturalization of her husband.

#### FURTHER SUGGESTIONS

The following facts were brought out in the 1935 State Census:

No County Enumerator can expect his pay until the work has been thoroughly examined. No ordinary office force can give a thorough examination of all reports in a few days. This would be possible if all deputies did good work and followed implicitly the instructions, and a superficial examination would suffice.

Due to the poor hand-writing of some of the enumerators much time was lost in checking their work. The County enumerator should go over all sheets before sending them in and re-copy those that are

in bad order.

The use of the ditto mark helps very much in checking, and the enumerator should be instructed to use same whenever possible. Families can be checked much faster if only the surname of the head of the family is written out in full. The same is true in checking the record by states. Families should not be divided on enumeration sheets.

Whenever a town or village is incorporated the census for such should be clearly marked, and no names outside the corporate limits

included.

There were numerous complaints made by the Deputy Enumerators on account of the pay they received from the County Enumerators, for their work. This office was advised in many instances that the pay was too low to be considered reasonable, so we suggest that the law providing for the next State Census, state the amount the County Enumerators shall pay their Deputy Enumerators.

The law providing for taking the 1935 State Census provided that an Enumerator should be paid 3 1-2 cts per person enumerated in Cities of 5000 inhabitants or more, and 10 cts per person for all others enumerated. This section of the law should be changed, and Cities and Towns ranging from 1000 to 5000 should fall in a middle rate between the other too.
