Jamaican immigrant who works as a housekeeper	Experiences needle anxiety, disregarded by providers	Experienced racism, harassment during trip; feared for safety	Graduated High School top of class	\$2,600 root canal vs. laptop for her daughter's education
Competing needs in her family: son lost job in pandemic, daughter graduated college	Mother got sick, died of pneumonia in ICU Little faith in healthcare	Decided to drive through the night instead of staying at hotel	Trade skills Children's education a major priority	Loss of income due to COVID- 19 restrictions Never well insured
	Bad experience getting the flu shot	Son applied for food stamps during pandemic, but never received	Some community college - income has made it hard to continue

Lived in car parked in bank parking lot Constantly researched resources available to obtain insulin and walked or took public transport	Inconsistencies across state lines for coverage of pre- existing conditions Lack of coverage leads to worsening health conditions - diabetes, mental illness Prioritization of diabetes over other medical needs caused deterioration in mental health	Shame and stigma associated with housing insecurity caused barriers to care Cut off from former social circle to hide "faults"	High education level - initially moved to PA to seek further education Well-spoken and educated presentation made healthcare workers avoid asking questions	Moved to Pennsylvania with healthy savings after losing job in 2008 economic crash High cost of care and lack of health care coverage led to economic and housing instability High cost of medication led to prioritization of needs - diabetes came first

Childhood in Kensington, "don't leave the area with 2-3 blocks of your home or you will get robbed, growing up in a crime-ridden neighborhood Jumped several times growing up - neighborhood was rough and difficult to survive	"Healthcare is awful, they have no idea how to deal with people" "I had to go to jail to get approved for therapy" Anesthesiologist wished death upon him prior to offering care Familial history of mental health challenges	Complicated family situation and childhood Acknowledged his own difficulties working with others and maintaining social relationships while experiencing insecure housing	Attended philadelphia public schools Formal training as insurance claims adjuster, which is now his profession	Experiences of panhandling Currently economically stable, but previously has not been



BSM provides opportunities aimed at addressing the whole-person: Mailing address, mailboxes Legal support Food access Housing assistance	Provide free medical screening Primarily focused in primary care Referral to next level of care with John Bell Health Center or ED	Targeted approach to care More time to care for patients	 Understand health literacy of patients Ask straight forward questions Utilize pictures, analogies to describe conditions 	Provide referral services after comprehensive screening Empathetic care allows accurate patient evaluation Healing with understanding root cause; 40% return rate
