One thing that I specifically added today was drawing fraction models or writing things like the mixed numbers on paper in math so that they are easier to see. I also have been continuing to use my fingers to show the page numbers that I need them to flip to in math class."
Limitations	"One thing that I made sure to do during the reteaching was to have all the students answer as much as possible using gestures. For example, I would have them hold up the correct number of fingers or use thumbs up/thumbs down to answer a problem. I thought this would be a good way to involve all of the students and accommodate the English language learners in the class."

In the class, we discussed the importance of names to students' cultural identities. During my science lesson, I was forced to address students by the names for the first time. I tried my best to pronounce all of the students' names correctly, but I did mess up the pronunciation of one student's name."
classroom	"I used a lot of repetition visuals for my review of the planets to help the English language learners in the class. I also said some words in Spanish during the math lesson to help the English language learners because they all speak Spanish. I used some words for colors and numbers."

basket	"One example was on the day of the Halloween parade. That day, the teacher explained to me that some students are absent on the day of the parade, due to certain cultural or religious beliefs. She explained that it is important to know who will be absent and when, regarding cultural or religious observances. This is partially why it is essential to have a sense of your students' cultural and religious backgrounds."
