

ANS JOHN D. GRIFFIN AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING SERVICE DR. PAUL JACKSON, School of Agricultural Sciences & Forestry

The ANS John D. Griffin Award—open to unclassified employees such as laboratory supervisors, instructors, lecturers, assistant professors, associate professors, professors and research professors—recognizes meritorious service activities directly related to the recipient's area of professional expertise. ANS faculty and staff provide nominations, and the recipient is selected by the ANS Faculty Advisory Council to the Dean.

ANS TEACHING AWARDS

JOANNA WARD, Department of Health Informatics & Information Management, 100/200-level

DR. LAURA GENTRY, School of Agricultural Sciences & Forestry, 300/above

The ANS Teaching Awards—open to instructors, lecturers, assistant professors, associate professors, and professors—recognize exemplary instruction in undergraduate or graduate-level courses. One award is granted to a faculty member who teaches 100 and 200-level courses, and one award is granted to a faculty member who teaches courses at or above the 300-level. ANS faculty provide nominations, and the recipient is selected by the ANS Faculty Advisory Council to the Dean.

ANS DEBRA L. MARTIN AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING SERVICE JENNIFER HOLLIS, Office of the Dean

The ANS Debra L. Martin Award recognizes exemplary service to an ANS academic unit or to the College through exceptional contributions in areas such as creating a positive work environment, providing research or creativity support, and developing innovative techniques in the workplace. ANS faculty and staff provide nominations, and the recipient is selected by the ANS Faculty Advisory Council to the Dean.

ANS RESEARCH AWARD

DR. GERGANA NESTOROVA, School of Biological Sciences

The ANS Research Award—open to faculty or staff—recognizes outstanding research and the contribution of new information to the knowledge base of a professional discipline. ANS faculty provide nominations, and the recipient is selected by the ANS Research Committee.

ANS SCHOLARLY ACTIVITY AWARD

DR. JULIE RUTLEDGE, School of Human Ecology

The ANS Scholarly Activity Award—open to faculty and staff—recognizes exemplary scholarly activity, specifically accomplishments in outreach and/or service learning projects, enhancement of Louisiana Tech University programs, and/or creative productions related to one's profession. ANS faculty and staff provide nominations, and the recipient is selected by the ANS Research Committee.

ANS OUTSTANDING ADVISOR AWARD

DR. DON SHEPARD, School of Biological Sciences

The ANS Outstanding Advisor Award—open to current faculty members completing their fifth full academic year and who have not previously received the award—recognizes exemplary collaborative student engagement through exploring and creating a rich, challenging undergraduate education, thereby significantly impacting students' undergraduate experiences.

ANS PROFESSORSHIP AWARD

DR. PRERNA DUA, Department of Health Informatics & Information **Management**

The ANS Professorship Award—open to any member of the tenured faculty holding the rank of assistant professor, associate professor, or professor—recognizes extraordinary service and performance in one or more of the following areas: teaching, research, and service to the campus community and the public sector.
