This is a cold windy day
and I am staying close by the
fire. The mountains to the south and
East are beautifully snowy and
make a grand show whenever the
sun comes out from the clouds.
It tried to snow a little here
this morning, but Mr Van Dyke
thinks this is just the end of a
storm somewhere else. We are

warm and comfortable here in the
shanty. And I am perfectly warm
Every night no matter how hard the
wind blows. I am well and

cheerful, and constantly careful.

Kernius is getting fat, and like my
horse is in good condition.

The Van Dykes are well. So is Miss
Brodt. I have been thinking that
I woud need her when her mouth
is up, but you will be here before
that so I can talk it over. How are
things getting along and when are you coming
