My Dear Mr. Muir:-

I am enclosing you telegram just received from Mr. McFarland, President of the American Civic Association. He is one of our strongest fighters in the East, and I trust that you will comply with his request, as he will make good use of it. The Governors of the country meet in conference to discuss the Conservation of natural resources.
