DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Washington, D. C., June 15, 1898,

SIR: I submit herewith for your emsideration an estimate for an appropriation to pay componention due to Oklahoma town-site trustees appointed onder act of May 14, 1890, and joint resolution of September 1, 1893.

Trustees appointed under said act and joint resolution were anthorized and required to levy an assessment on the lets and blocks embraced in the several town sites according to their value in such sum as would be necessary to pay Government price of the land, the cost of survey, conveyance of lots, and for any other necessary expenses, and to pay the compensation of the trustees as provided in the act. Such assessments were levied in each town slike in sums supposed to be sufficient for the purpose intended, but in the administration of these trusts many unforescen events arose to extend the time and labor incident to the proper execution of the same, and in many instances the assessments levied have been formit indequate to the purpose intended.

Fourteen boards of trustees were appointed under the act and more than forty town sites were entered.

As a disposal of the several town sites progressed boards were discharged and nufinished business was consolidated in the hands of remaining boards, until new the remnant of business in all the town sites entered is consolidated in the hands of one board.

The money arising from assessments on many of the town sites has long since been exhausted, but in order to complete the trust and dispose of all lots in the several town siles it has been found necessary to continue at least one board of trustows in the Territory. All the expenses incident to the entry, allotment, and conveyance of lots in the several town sites have been paid so far except compensation due to the trustees themselves. Such compensation is largely in arrears to the present trustees and to some of those who are no longer in the service.

These trustees were required to attend at their respective offices and to perform the functions required of them by the law, and it is but just and right that they should be paid for such services under the terms of their appointment.

There is no other means by which such compensation can be paid, and it appears that the estimated amount of \$3,854,95 will be required to pay all such liabilities.

I therefore recommend that Congress be requested to appropriate said amount, to be expended in accordance with the estimate herewith submitted.
