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## Reflective Essay

During the fall semester I was required to write a research paper for my historical methods class, and this was the first real research paper that I was assigned. At first, I did not even know what to write about, but then I got the idea to write about protest songs about the Vietnam War. For my essay I had to use several different kinds of sources, but the main sources of information had to be primary sources.
