Hon. William Langer Senator from North Dakota Senate Building Washington, D. C.

Dear Mr. Langer:

Several weeks ago I sent you copies of the Dr. Martin Sandberger case who last year received the death sentence in the Nuernberg court. I am sending you herewith eleven other affidavits of honorable and trustworthy men of high standing in Europe. In the light of these affidavits it would seem a murder on the part of our Nuernberg court should the execution of this man be carried out.

I have not had the pleasure of receiving a word from you. Would you kindly allow yourself a half hour of your very valuable time for reading the inclosed documents written in English. With your vast experience and in your position as a leader in the committee dealing with these trials, you are in a position to advise as to what can be done to get a fair hearing or review of this case before the Supreme Court. I should be deeply grateful for any suggestion while there is yet time to save Sandberger's life.
