RUAIRI QUINN, T.D.
MINISTER FOR FINANCE
DUBLIN, IRELAND

OCTOBER 13, 1995

Although he is a highly-qualified architect, Ruairi Quinn has been active politically in Ireland for over twenty years. He is the Minister for Finance responsible for budgeting and financial affairs. He concurrently holds the position of Deputy Leader of the Labour Party.

Educated in Ireland, he earned his degrees from the School of Architecture of University College, Dublin, and Blackrock College, Dublin. As a graduate research student, he was awarded a Higher Diploma in Ekistics from Athens School of Ekistics, Doxiadis Centre, Athens. From 1971 until 1982, he was a Lecturer in Architecture in Housing and Urban Design at the School of Architecture of University College, Dublin. He holds membership in the Royal Institute of Architects of Ireland and the Irish Planning Institute.

Mr. Quinn's political career began in 1974 as a Member of the Dublin City Council and includes holding the following posts: Minister of State, Environment; Minister for Public Services; Minister for Labour; Minister for Enterprise and Employment; Dublin Director of European Elections; Leader of the Labour Group Dublin Corporation; Civic Alliance and City Council Leader; Dublin City Council Alderman; and Dublin Director of Local Elections. In 1990, he was Chairman of the Campaign Committee and Director of Elections for Mary Robinson's Presidential Campaign. Mr. Quinn was a Member of Seanad Eireann and currently holds membership in Dail Eireann, Irish government organizations.

Married to the former Liz Allman, he is the father of two sons and a daughter and resides in Sandymount, Dublin.

ANN McLAUGHLIN
PRESIDENT
FEDERAL CITY COUNCIL

NOVEMBER 14, 1995

Ann McLaughlin served as our nation's 19th Secretary of Labor. She is currently President of the Federal City Council in Washington, D.C., a non-profit, non-partisan organization comprised of 150 top business and civic leaders dedicated to improving the nation's capital. She is also Vice Chairman of The Aspen Institute, a non-profit organization assisting in formulating the policies of democratic institutions. She was elected Vice Chairman in August, 1993.

Ms. McLaughlin was a Visiting Fellow at The Urban Institute, a private, non-profit policy research and educational organization. The Institute investigates the social and economic problems confronting the nation and the government programs and policies designed to alleviate those problems. She continues to serve as a member of the Board of Trustees of The Urban Institute.

On September 29, 1989, President Bush appointed Ms. McLaughlin Chairman of the President's Commission on Aviation Security and Terrorism. The Commission presented its report to the President and concluded its work on May 15, 1990. The report reviewed and evaluated policy options in connection with aviation security, with particular reference to the destruction of Pan American Airways Flight 103.

She was sworn in as the President's top labor official on December 17, 1987. As the President's chief advisor on labor and related issues, she focused public and private sector attention on the needs of a rapidly changing international and national workplace and workforce. Upon completion of her term, President Reagan awarded her the President's Citizen Medal in recognition of her public service.

Ms. McLaughlin also served as Under Secretary of the Department of the Interior, providing the day-to-day management of that 71,000 person department and as an Assistant Secretary of the Department of Treasury where she earned the department's highest honor, the Alexander Hamilton Award for distinguished leadership.

Ms. McLaughlin currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors for AMR Corporation (and its subsidiary, American Airlines), Federal National Mortgage Association, General Motors Corporation, Host Marriott Corporation, Kellogg Company, Nordstrom, Potomac Electric Power Company, Union Camp Corporation and Vulcan Materials Company.

Her private sector experience includes diverse senior management roles, including serving as a consultant to the Center for Strategic and International Studies; President of McLaughlin and Company; Manager of the Washington, D.C. office of Braun and Company of Los Angeles, and Assistant Director of State and Local Government Relations for the Union Carbide Corporation.

Ms. McLaughlin has been awarded honorary degrees from Marymount College (Tarrytown, New York), University of Rhode Island, New England School of Law and the College of St. Elizabeth. She is a native of Chatham, New Jersey, earned a B.A. degree from Marymount College and studied at the University of London and the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School of Business.



ARTHUR M. SCHLESINGER, JR.
SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT
1961-1964

After graduation from Harvard in 1938, Arthur Schlesinger studied at Oxford and again at Harvard as a junior fellow. During the war, he worked for the Office of War Information and the Office of Strategic Services. In his spare time, Mr. Schlesinger wrote *The Age of Jackson* for which he won the Pulitzer Prize for history in 1946. As a member of the Harvard faculty, he spent much of the next 14 years on an ambitious multi-volume project entitled *The Age of Roosevelt*.

Although Mr. Schlesinger had served as a speech writer for Adlai Stevenson in 1952 and 1956, he switched his allegiance to John F. Kennedy in the late 1950's and helped recruit a group of New York-Boston intellectuals and scholars for the Kennedy "brain trust" in 1959. During the 1960 campaign, Mr. Schlesinger wrote speeches for the Democratic Party nominee and published a short campaign biography favorably contrasting Kennedy with



his Republican opponent, Richard M. Nixon. After the election President Kennedy asked Mr. Schlesinger to join his staff as a Special Assistant to the President, and he was sworn in on January 30, 1961.

His first assignment for President Kennedy was to travel to South America with Food for Peace Program Director, George McGovern.

Upon his return from South America in early March, Mr. Schlesinger first became aware of plans for an invasion of Cuba by exiles trained in Guatemala by the Central Intelligence Agency. At President Kennedy's request, he quickly prepared a White Paper on Cuba that endorsed the Cuban revolution against Fulgencio Batista but condemned the direction in which Fidel Castro had led it. The White Paper admitted past errors in American relations with the island and called upon Castro to break his connection with Communism and return to the democratic goals of the revolution.

Mr. Schlesinger also sat in on the series of top-level discussions in late March and early April at which the final decision to go ahead with the invasion was reached.

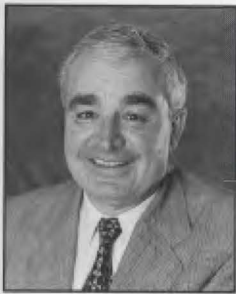
In the weeks immediately before the April 17 invasion, he was in frequent contact with the Cuban Revolutionary Council, the exile group in titular command of the Cuban brigade training in Guatemala.

Throughout the rest of the Administration, Mr. Schlesinger remained one of the few White House staff members assigned to follow Latin American developments. He helped formulate American policy calling for the economic and political isolation of Cuba in 1961 and 1962.

During the Cuban missile crisis in October 1962, President Kennedy assigned him to work with Adlai Stevenson on the preparation of a speech to the U.N. reflecting the Administration's demand that the Soviet Union immediately remove its long-range rockets from the island.

Two months after President Kennedy's assassination, Mr. Schlesinger resigned his post as a White House special assistant and began work on a history of the Administration. His best-selling *A Thousand Days: John F. Kennedy in the White House* was published in 1965 and won the Pulitzer Prize for biography the next year.

Returning to academic life in 1966, Mr. Schlesinger voiced measured criticism of the Vietnam war policy of Presidents Johnson and Nixon. He served as a presidential campaign adviser to Sen. Robert Kennedy in 1968, Sen. George McGovern in 1972, and Sen. Edward Kennedy in 1980.



ALBERT J. COSTELLO

Albert J. Costello is chairman, president and chief executive officer of W.R. Grace & Co. He was appointed to his present position on May 1, 1995.

Previously, Mr. Costello had served as the chairman of the board and chief executive officer of American Cyanamid Company from April 1993 through December 1994. He had served as president of the company since January 1991, when he also became a member of its board of directors.

Mr. Costello joined Cyanamid in 1957 as a chemist. Moving through various research, marketing and management assignments, Mr. Costello managed Cyanamid operations in Mexico beginning in 1974, and company operations in Spain beginning in 1976. A year later, he was named vice president, agricultural Cyanamid Americas/Far East Division. In 1979, he was appointed vice president of Cyanamid's Agricultural Division and in 1982, he became president of that division. In 1982, Mr. Costello was named a group vice president with responsibility for the agricultural products group. He was appointed executive vice president and a member of the Executive Committee in 1983.

Mr. Costello serves on the board of directors of FMC Corporation and on the boards of trustees for Fordham University, St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center and the American Enterprise Institute for Public Policy Research. In addition, he is a member of the British-North American Committee of the National Planning Association.

Mr. Costello was a member of the boards of directors of the Business Roundtable, a member of The Conference Board, the Society of Chemical Industry executive committee, the Chemical Manufacturers Association and the Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association.

Born in New York City, Mr. Costello holds a B.S. degree in chemistry from Fordham University and a master's degree in chemistry from New York University.

He and his wife reside in Franklin Lakes, New Jersey. They will relocate to Palm Beach County, Florida.
