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## **INTERRELATIONS BETWEEN A NURSE AND A PATIENT**

**Introduction.** *The role and status of the qualified nurse become of key significance in the therapeutic process. The behavioral models characterize practical work of medical staff and especially nurses. Absence of professional knowledge, skills of professionally-oriented communication make medical specialists unqualified ones. We consider the communication as an important factor in our research and as a professional method that is presented at every stage of the treatment.*

**Results and discussion.** The problems of forming medical moral are very significant in the nurses' training. Nurse must know how to listen to the patient, find out his problems, give the possibility to soothe a pain, mental and physical suffering.

**Conclusion.** Thus, nurse's skills to communicate with the patients and partners are among the most important aspects of the professional activity that contribute to the therapeutic process and patients' recovery. Nurse must continuously improve professional skills and knowledge; learn the psychology of interaction and communication, patients' personal characteristics along with the professional practice and experience.
