"IT IS DEPLORABLE AND FRIGHTENING THAT VIOLENCE AND DISORDER

OCCURRED IN ADELAIDE DURING TODAY'S MORATORIUM DEMONSTRATION",

THE PREMIER (MR. DUNSTAN) SAID THIS EVENING FROM CANBERRA.

MR. DUNSTAN SAID HE HAD RECEIVED A VARIETY OF REPORTS FROM

ADELAIDE DURING THE AFTERNOON AND THAT THE ONE CLEAR FACT

WHICH EMERGED WAS THAT THE CALM AND RESPONSIBILITY WHICH HAD

PREVIOUSLY BEEN EVIDENT IN ANTI-VIETNAM PUBLIC DEMONSTRATIONS

IN ADELAIDE NOW NO LONGER APPLIED.

"THE GOVERNMENT HAD WANTED TO ENSURE THAT THE PREVIOUS
SITUATION OF CALM AND RATIONALITY CONTINUED. IT ENDEAVOURED
TO ENSURE THIS. IT BELIEVED PEOPLE SHOULD BE ABLE TO
PEACEABLY DEMONSTRATE THEIR POLITICAL BELIEFS WITHOUT BEING
SUBJECTED TO EITHER PUBLIC OR PRIVATE AGGRESSIVE PRESSURES".
"WHAT APPARENTLY HAPPENED IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA THIS AFTERNOON
WAS THAT RESPONSIBILITY IN THE MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC ORDER
AND BEHAVIOUR WAS REPLACED BY IRRESPONSIBILITY AND AGGRESSION".
"ON MY RETURN TO ADELAIDE I WILL CALL AN URGENT CABINET
MEETING TO CONSIDER WHAT MEASURES THE GOVERNMENT WILL TAKE
TO ENSURE THAT DEMOCRATIC LAW AND ORDER PROCEDURES (ONES
NOT SUBJECT TO EMOTIONALISM) ARE ESTABLISHED AND MAINTAINED
IN OUR COMMUNITY".

"ALTHOUGH THE PRECISE SITUATION IN ADELAIDE AT THIS STAGE
IS UNCLEAR IT DOES SEEM THAT A TOP LEVEL INVESTIGATION IS

THE PREMIER (MR. DUNSTAN) SAID THIS EVENING FROM CAMBEERA.
MR. DUNSTAN SAID HE HAD RECEIVED A VARIETY OF REPORTS FROM
ADELAIDE DURING THE AFTERNOON AND THAT THE GNE CLEAR FACT
WHICH ENERGED WAS THAT THE CALM AND RESPONSIBILITY WHICH PAD
