The Tinalley String Quartet has rapidly achieved recognition as one gf the most exciting quartets, not only in their home of Australia but also on the world stage. Tinalley was awarded the Grand Prize at the Australian Chamber Music Competition in 2005, and in 2007 the Quartet was awarded First Prize at the 9th Banff International String Quartet Competition, widely considered as the world's premier chamber music competition.

The Quartet has performed in over fifty cities across Australia, Europe, Canada and America, with highlights including appearances in the Vienna Musikverein, Berlin Konzerthaus, and Amsterdam Concertgebouw. The Quartet has also appeared at many of Australia's premier festivals, including the Perth International Arts Festival; Canberra International Music Festival; Huntington Festival and the Melbourne International Arts Festival.

Formed in 2003 at The University of Melbourne, the Tinalley String Quartet has been mentored by members of the Tokyo, St. Lawrence, Keller, Takacs and Schoenberg String Quartets and has engaged in study residencies at the International Musicians Seminar, Prussia Cove, UK; Yale and Stanford Universities in the US and the Banff Centre for the Arts, Canada. The Quartet has been broadcast in Australia by ABC Classic FM and 3MBS FM and around the world on CBC Canada, SRW2 and HR2 Kultur Germany, Radio France and Public National Radio, The Netherlands.



Kristian Chong has performed throughout Australia, the UK, and in China, France, Hong Kong, Taiwan, USA and Zimbabwe. As soloist he has appeared with the Adelaide, Canberra, Melbourne, Queensland, Sydney and Tasmanian Symphony Orchestras, and orchestras in the UK & China with conductors including Andrey Boreyko, Nicholas Braithwaite, Roy Goodman, Sebastian Lang-Lessing, Nicholas Milton, Tuomas Oillia, Marcus Stenz and Arvo Volmer. Concerto highlights include Rachmaninoff's 3rd (Sydney Symphony), Rachmaninoff's Paganini Rhapsody in Beijing, and Britten (Adelaide Symphony). A highly coveted chamber musician, recent collaborations include Australian & Asian tours with the Australian String Quartet, the Flinders Quartet, violinists Elizabeth Layton (ex-concertmaster BBC Scottish), Ilya Konovalov, (concertmaster Israel Philharmonic) and Natsuko Yoshimoto, and trios with Yoshimoto & cellist Li-Wei Qin. He has performed at the Huntington Festival, the Australian Festival of Chamber Music with clarinetist Michael Collins & violinist Jack Liebeck amongst others, and recently was released on ABC-Classics with baritone Teddy Tahu-Rhodes.

Kristian studied at the Royal Academy of Music with Piers Lane & Christopher Elton, and with Stephen McIntyre at the University of Melbourne, where Kristian currently teaches piano & chamber music.
