Second in importance is the trip to Lincoln Farm, and Bardetown. Miss Shugart, Misses Crovens, Faking Ferrill, Scott, Mrs. Hendricks, Mrs. Kuykendall & I left B. G. at 6:00, July 26, 1924 - stopped at Glasgow Junction & saw ruins of old towers started before Civil War. Reached Lincoln farm at 11:30. Next went to Bardetown - on way past three New Haven, & near by old towers. Saw old distilleries & bondage houses. At B. visited Old Catholic Cathedral (1816). Then went to Federal Hill or "Old Key Home". Returned to B. G. at 11:45 - after having ridden 207 miles, and passing three warrens, Edmonson, Hart, Hardin, Larue & Nelson County.
