

gram participants, VUB alumni, TRIO programs' staff, and community and veterans affairs supporters. Dr. Luther B. Hughes, Jr., Associate Vice-President for Academic Affairs for Enrollment Management, offered greetings on behalf of Western Kentucky University.

Student Spotlight: Kevin Crum

> eeking refuge from a drug-torn family, I left for basic training ten days after high school graduation. After graduating with honors in basic training from Ft Jackson,

SC, I went for training at Ft Huachuca, AZ, specializing in Ground Surveillance Radar Operations. Once I finished with the MOS training I received orders to go to Korea where I spent a year overseas and received two army achievement awards. From there I was sent to Ft Campbell, KY, where I completed air assault school and was promoted to SPC in February 2002. On March 2, 2004, I was deployed to Kuwait. We moved into Iraq a few days later. After a month I was sent home due to medical reasons. Those medical issues resulted in a medical chapter discharge. On January 22<sup>nd</sup>, I was honorably discharged from the United States Army.

annual VUB Scholarship. The winner of the 2004 VUB Scholarship is Kim Mack, a single mother who works full time and is preparing to enter WKU this fall.

The first ever National Association of Veterans Upward Bound Project Personnel scholarship was awarded to Will King of Bowling Green. King is the recipient of a \$500 academic scholarship that he will use this fall at Western Kentucky University. This was the first year the scholarship has been awarded and King was one of only four selected from across the continental United States and Puerto Rico.

During the awards section of the banquet, staff members spoke about each award and its recipient. **David Rippy** and **Bill Martin** received standing ovations from banquet attendees as they came forward to receive their Dare to Dream awards. **Gary Jessee** was also recognized as the 2004 VUB Student of the Year.

A number of other participants were recognized for outstanding achievements and completing postsecondary degrees. Many participants spoke about the need and importance for programs such as Veterans Upward Bound. **Kyle Hines**, the 2004 Alumni of the Year, who graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering the day after the banquet, told the crowd that he hoped Congressman Lewis would continue to vote for increased funding for VUB because the program is great and really

A concussion changed my life in a matter of seconds. I began to experience numerous medical problems that compromised my life significantly. I became a father a month before I was discharged. It was the best thing that has ever happened to me and occurred at a time when I was a little down on my luck. My luck began to change as the love of my life, my daughter's mother, was taking care of me. She was strong and stayed by my side the whole time. She didn't complain when I couldn't get out of bed to help her with our daughter. I was taking thousands of dollars of medications a week, I couldn't drive anywhere, and I had to be taken to doctor's appointments. The doctors couldn't tell me what was wrong. They ran test after test and still found nothing. Finally they found out I was allergic to one of my medications.

The medical complications started to resolve themselves, so I began to look toward the future. With my fiancée by my side and my daughter in my arms, I began to search for another career. I received a phone call and a letter stating that I would be awarded the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal and the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal. Life was actually looking up for the first time in a year. My fiancée and I decided that now since things had calmed down we would set a date for the wedding. On October 1, 2004, I will marry my best friend, love of my life, and the mother of my child.

I was ready to move on and have a wonderful future for my daughter and my soon-to-be wife. On my quest for a new career I came upon an advertisement for Veterans Upward Bound. I called and set an appointment and started classes. I have been receiving unbelievable help from the teachers and staff at VUB. So much help in fact that I will begin college on August 23rd, pursuing a major in Exceptional Education. With this degree, one day I hope that I can help children with disabilities as I was helped along the way.

the VUB program. We are happy Marisa has chosen this location for her internship and we expect that she will be a great asset to participants during her stay.
