***COLLECTION NOTE***

This collection documents the Artists in Residence (AIR) Program, a joint project of the Kentucky Folklife Program and the Kentucky Arts Council. Folklorist Julia Morgan documented folk traditions in Boyd County, Kentucky and then presented those traditions with students and teachers at Ashland Elementary School through in-class instruction and special programs by local folk artists. Fiddling, quilting, woodworking, weaving, dulcimer making and folk dance were some of the traditions dealt with in this program. This collection includes an area survey, audiocassette tapes and log, photographs, negatives and indices, slides and indices and a videocassette tape (VHS).
