Constitution

3

Article I

Section 1. This organization shall be known as The F. C. G. Classical Club.

Section 2. The aims of this organization shall be:

1. To give those students of the Western Kentucky State Teachers College who are preparing to teach Latin an opportunity to meet and discuss questions of common interest.
2. To develop a deeper and wider interest in the life, language, and literature of ancient Rome.
3. To consider the problems connected with the study and teaching of Latin in Kentucky high schools.
4. To encourage and promote sound and advanced scholarship in our own school and in the state at large.

Article II

Membership

Section 1. All majors and minors shall be eligible to membership.

Section 2. Payment of dues and regular participation in the activities of the society

shall constitute membership

Section 3

Prominent Classical educators and friends of The Classics recommended by the membership committee may be elected as honorary members. Unanimous vote shall be necessary for election.

Article III
Officers.

Section 1.

They shall consist of a president, a vice-president, a secretary-treasurer, and a reporter.

Section 2.

Election of officers shall be held at the last meeting of each semester and the summer term of twelve weeks. All officers shall serve until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

Article IV
Duties of Officers.

Section 1.

It shall be the duty of the president to preside at all meetings of The F. C. G. Classical Club, to appoint committees, and to call special meetings.

Section 2.

It shall be the duty of the vice-president to preside at the meetings in the absence of the president. In case of

permanent absence, or resignation of the president, the vice-president shall become president and a new election shall be held for vice-president.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the secretary-treasurer:

1. To receive dues and disburse all funds for The F. C. G. Classical Club at the direction of the organization
2. To enroll members.
3. To keep on file a list of all members, and copies of programs, papers, and reports.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the reporter:

1. To report to the local papers such activities of The Club as are of general interest.

Article V Committees

Section 1. The following standing committees shall be appointed by the president upon his assuming office and shall hold this office for the entire semester or summer term: program committee, membership committee, and social committee.

Article VI

Dues.

Sections. The dues shall be seventy-five cents for each semester or summer term of twelve weeks.

Article VII

Amendments

Sections. This constitution may be amended at any meeting by a vote of a majority of those present and voting.

Amendment I

Membership

Article 1. Honorary membership

All honorary members shall be permitted the privilege of wearing the club ring or pin.

Article 2.

The names of majors and minors in Latin, desiring membership in the A. C. G. Classical Club, shall be presented by the committee on membership at a regular or call meeting of the club, a majority of all present and voting shall constitute election to membership.

Article 3. Field Membership

A Field member shall be one who has been an active member in the club. A field member shall be urged to participate, in so far as he can, in the activities of the club and shall receive any publications of the club. He shall ^{be} exempt from dues.

Amendment II
Election

Article 1. When any vacancy shall occur in the corps of officers, ~~such~~ other than the president, ^{or Vice President} such vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the president or vice-president

Then The President appointed a committee to plan for the next meeting. The committee was composed of:

A motion was made and seconded that we adjourn. The motion carried.

M. The motion carried and the club adjourned to meet Tuesday night.
